### Pentagon Committee Endorses ROTC

WASHINGTON (AP)—A special Pentagon committee yesterday endorsed ROTC as a "highly desirable method" of supplying military officers and recommending that the committee study the possibility of strengthening the program.

The committee, which included five senior military officers and a civilian member, issued a 61-page report which urged a more active role for the college faculty and administrators in picking instructors and shaping curriculum.

The committee challenged ROTC by recommending that the college faculty status for ROTC instructors be increased to that of full-time faculty members. It also recommended that ROTC be placed on a par with other military training programs.

### Congressmen Ask Continuation Of Suit Against Automakers

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Four congressmen have asked the Federal judge to keep the lawsuit last Jan. 10 by then Attorney General Ramsey Clark, who accused General Motors, Ford Motor Co., Chrysler Corp. and American Motors Corp. of conspiring for the past 15 years to delay installing anti-smog devices on cars.

In a petition Friday to U.S. District Court Judge Joseph W. Curtis, the 46 Democrats and two Republicans asked that the auto manufacturers be tried on charges of "conspiracy in restraint of trade and commerce in motor vehicle air pollution control equipment."

New Truck Speed Limit The State Traffic Commission has now introduced to Connecticut's major highways the first legal differential between speed for trucks and speed for regular passenger traffic.

That any differential at all has been set in Connecticut represents a victory for the motorists of Connecticut and for the members of the Legislature who shared their driving experience.

So much, so good. But the differential should in reality be 10 rather than five miles an hour, if motorists are to be sure it is something they can count on.

And whatever it is, it should be given some firm but courteous policing until the truck and bus operators realize that Connecticut is not joking, and that the reduced speed is something which will have to be calculated into the schedules they give their drivers.

Only the confirmed knobber, who has never been able to master the mysterious equations among wind and sail and hull and water, will dare rejoice openly and frankly in the claim of RCA Corp. that it is developing a self-navigating robot sailboat.

It is a boat which can finally abandon all the vain pretenses of having sail in one's veins, of being at home in small boats on the bouncy main, and of having any idea of which way to lean when it is hoist by the new invention itself.

It is a boat which can sail itself, with its passengers carefree and luxurious, to any point in the ocean they may desire.

In this leveling and unstable world, a few old landmarks remain to remind us of an older and stabler culture, and revive the child-like sense of security in the accustomed scene.

Wonders of the Universe Permanent Colony Idea for Moon

DR. I. M. LEVITT, DIRECTOR of the Pels Planetarium of the Franklin Institute in Philadelphia, has formulated for the detailed exploration of the moon what will range far into the future. One concept being proposed as part of this exploration, is the establishment of a permanent colony on the moon.

The concept outlined by Dr. George Mueller, NASA's administrator for manned space flight, envisions the use of a permanent complex of space stations orbiting the earth and moon.

The lunar space station would be similar to the modular one being used to orbit the earth in polar, synchronous or low-altitude orbit. The large earth-orbiting station, an immediate objective for NASA, is currently meeting serious and detailed study.

The lunar space station would be developed to a point where it could be used to launch manned expeditions to the planets without incurring prohibitive costs. For manned flight to other planets, the key to the success may be the permanent settlement on the moon.

Several new, major components must be developed to initiate this concept. In addition to the nuclear shuttle, a large, reusable lunar-landing vehicle must be developed during the increased payload.

A Long, Hot Winter In Store for Ulster?

Mine Safety Bill Expected To Be Law

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sponsors of the most stringent coal mine safety bill ever to clear a branch of Congress say they are confident the measure will be voted on this year.

Following a 75-0 Senate vote Thursday, the measure was sent to the House where a similarly tough measure already has been approved by the Labor and Public Welfare Committee.

Congressional action has been spurred by the tragedy at Farmington, W. Va., last November where 78 miners died in an underground explosion and 130 others were injured.

It also would set up stricter controls over methane gas, provide for tighter and more frequent federal inspections, require that all electrical equipment and wiring be made spark-proof, ban smoking and use of flames in mines, and establish a program of interim compensation payments for miners disabled by pneumoconiosis or black lung.

Sen. John S. Cooper, R-Ky., argued for such an amendment, said the requirements would be so costly that many of the small mines would be forced to close.

Williams and Sen. Jacob K. Javits, R-N.Y., offered compromise under which the non-gassy mines would have five years to install the new equipment, instead of four as provided in the main bill.

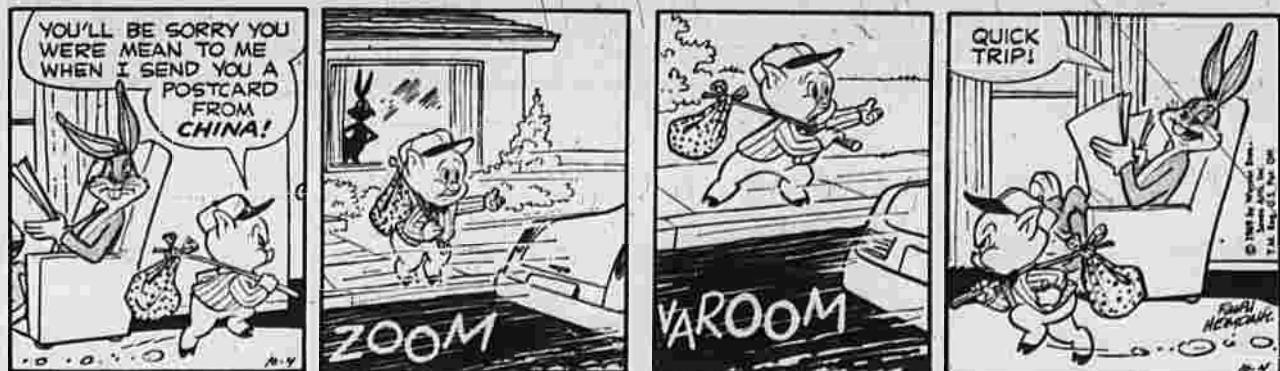

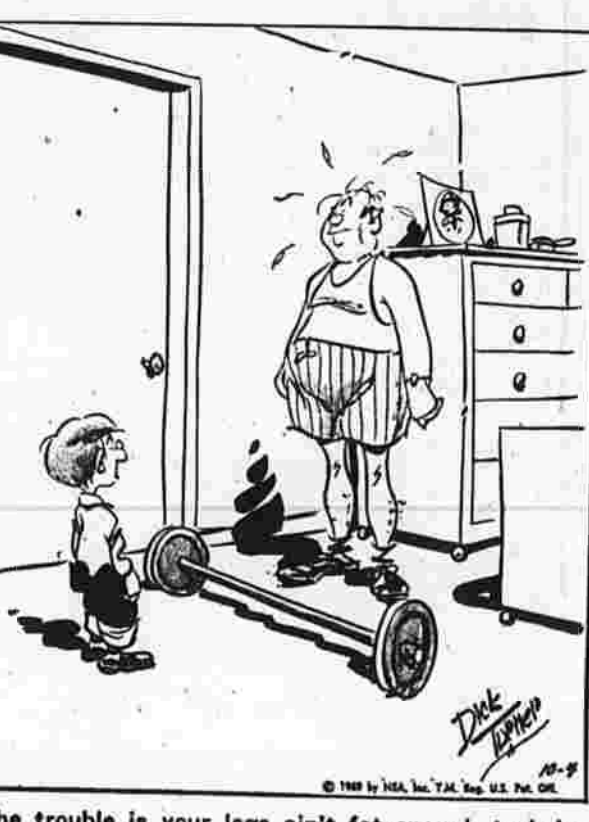

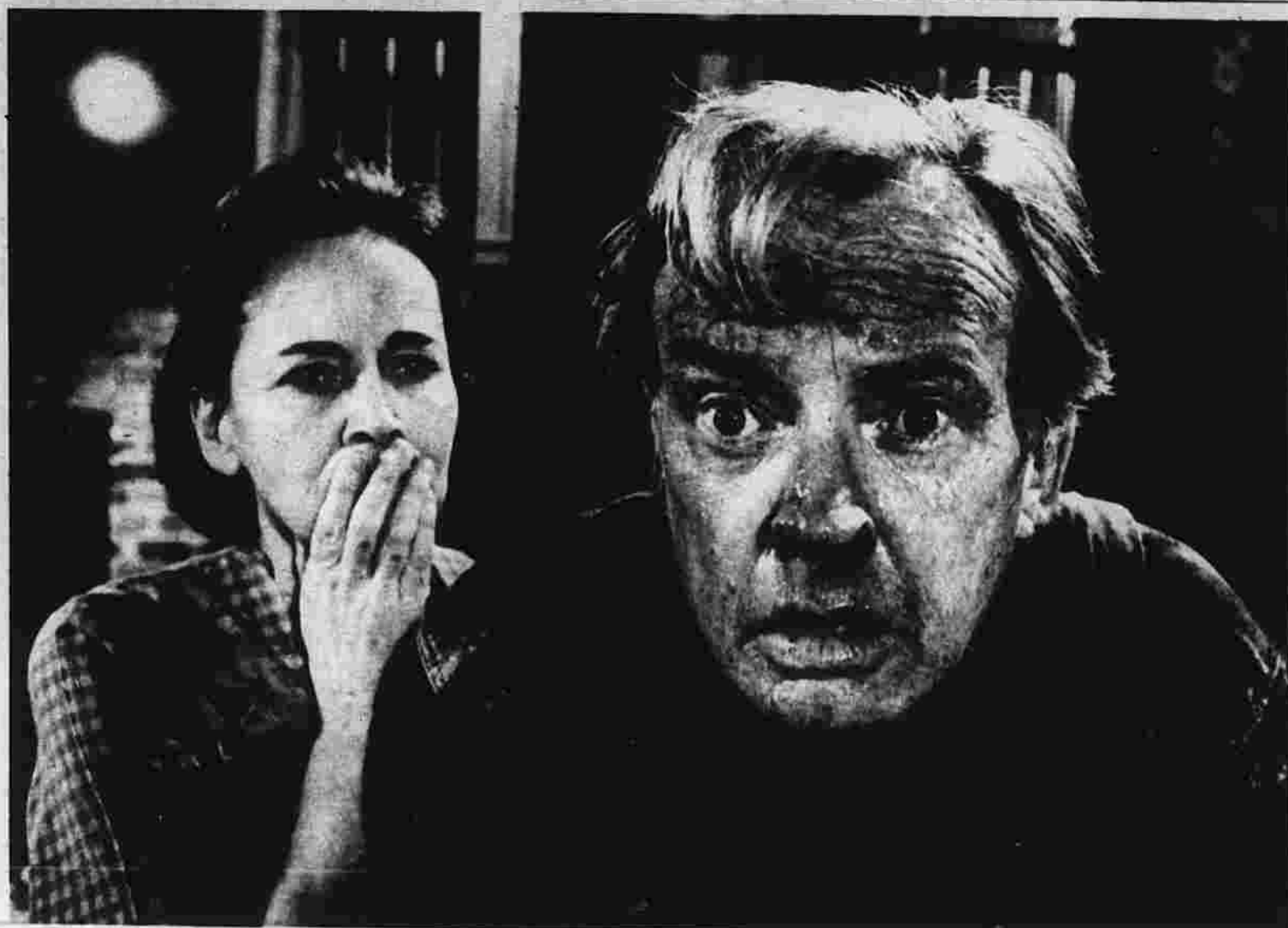

## Will Goldie, Movie-Bound, Be Another Marilyn?

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Rubbery-faced, giggly Goldie Hawn, the smart blonde who only acts dumb on television's "Laugh-In," leaves the show after this season for a career in movies.

This summer she did one film, "Cactus Flower," with Ingrid Bergman and Walter Matthau, and found it "a very exciting experience."

She's set for a second for pro-

ducer Mike Frankovitch, "There's a Girl in My Soup," and producer Billy Wilder is scheduled to write another for her, as he did for Marilyn Monroe with "Some Like It Hot."

Some observers predict, indeed, that Goldie will become as big a star as the late Marilyn.

One is Goldie's agent-partner, Art Simon, who discovered her dancing in the chorus on an Andy Griffith television special three years ago. He and Miss Hawn have formed a company that will produce two Goldie specials for NBC and eventually, they hope, movies.

Simon says Goldie is leaving "Laugh-In" because "in the framework of the show, I don't think she has had the opportunity to present the talent she really has."

But Goldie is grateful for her three seasons on "Laugh-In," an "enormous thing that really shot off my career."

Around the show's stage, she's known as cooperative and unaffected. Producer Paul W. Keyes says her leaving is "like losing your right arm. She's going to be a big star."

The shapely Goldie, 5 feet 6 and 114 pounds, is 23. She was born in Washington, D.C., where her father, Rutledge Hawn, is a musician in society orchestras. He is also a descendant of Edward Rutledge of South Carolina, youngest signer of the Declaration of Independence.

At 3, Goldie started ballet and at 10 performed with the Ballet

Russe. Later she ran a dancing school for 150 youngsters in Washington and still later was a go-go dancer—clothed—at "fine clubs" while living with four other girls in a tiny Manhattan apartment.

Go-go is the same kind of wild gyrations performed by "Laugh-In's" kookie comedienne. Goldie asked the producers to excuse her from that this year—"I

didn't like to see myself up there dancing; I thought it was tasteless"—and they complied.

Miss Hawn launches her movie career married—this summer—to a film director, Gus Trikonis, 30, who soon starts a film in Germany. Goldie describes him as not as outgoing as herself but full of fun.

At their "nice little house in Studio City," she takes care of the roses, cooks and cleans on weekends and rests up for the next week's shooting. She and Trikonis have no immediate plans for a movie together.

Where would she like to be 10 years from now?  
"Alive, happy, and no place special."

## New Mission For Nimoy

Leonard Nimoy has recovered from his stiff face — and he's embarking on the nearly-impossible mission of succeeding Martin Landu on CBS' "Mission: Impossible."

If anybody can fill Landu's shoes — and part — it's Nimoy. As "Star Trek's" Mr. Spock, Nimoy made millions of fans. But it was a more difficult part than you might imagine.

"Spock was so stiff and unbending," Nimoy says, "that playing him made me physically exhausted. I could never lean against a wall or slouch, or even relax my facial muscles. My face was almost permanently stiff."

Now, with loose cheeks, he faces the future bravely. When he was asked to take the part on Mission, he made sure the character he plays — Paris is his only name — was "a slouchy type."

He's also completely changed

his hair-do and, of course, his ear-do. No more pointy ears.

It's nice to know that, when Nimoy was offered the part, he first called Landu — just to make sure the other actor wasn't still dickering with the network. It was all open and aboveboard — at least on Nimoy's part.

## Ugly People Are In For TV Commercials

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Weak chin? Floppy ears? Bulbous nose? Are you, in a word, ugly? Then you're right down Bill Bordy's alley. And maybe television's, at least in commercials, of course.

A Hollywood trade paper carried his ad this week:

"Who gets all the work in commercials? Why, the ugly people, of course."

The ad urged readers, "If you're ugly, unusual or interesting looking," to call a certain number.

The number led to Bordy's office in a television studio complex. He calls his service Ugles Unlimited.

"Good-looking types are on the way out," said Bordy, 38, a part-time actor himself, big-eared but otherwise more on the good-looking than the homely side.

"Nowadays, ugly is beautiful. You can see it yourself just by watching TV commercials. The trend is to plain people. Person-next-door types are getting the work because it's so much easier for the public to associate with them.

"The chunky, hard-hat laborer who gets the promotion because his wife has washed his shirt in that detergent. The manicurist who uses dishwashing detergent as a hand lotion."

Several months ago Bordy read a magazine article about a London modeling agency which had advertised for ugly types, got "a fantastic response" and now does a big business supplying such models for advertising.

A light flashed for Bordy: A casting directory for aspiring performers with less than perfect features. He's calling it the Ugly Casting Directory. He's promising clients that 1,000 copies will be distributed among advertising agencies and movie and TV casting directors.

For \$60, a customer gets a full page showing three poses of himself—which he supplies—and a resume of his experience.

Two insertions of the trade-paper ad brought 200 calls, and his phone was still ringing. "Are you ugly?" is the first question he asks. About half answer, "Yes, I am;" the others, "Not really ugly, but I'm a good character actor."
