New Truck Speed Limit
The State Traffic Commission has now introduced to Connecticut's major highways the first legal differential between speed for trucks and speed for regular

The decree that the limit for trucks must be five miles slower than the limit for passenger vehicles should amount to at least the beginning of a guarantee that any motorist who wishes to travel along at the legal speed limit can be guaranteed, henceforth, freedom from the experience of having some behemoth thunder past him at some speed beyond the legal limit.

That any differential at all has been set in Connecticut represents a victory for the motorists of Connecticut and for the members of the Legislature who shared their driving experience. Their pressure and opinion together, along with the tragic push of a pile-up accident in fog on I-91, apparently swung the members of the State Traffic Commission, the Highway Commissioner, the Vehicle Commissioner, and the State Police Commissioner, away from the lukewarm attitude their representatives displayed toward the proposal when it was being considered by the Legisla-

So much, so good. But the differential should in reality be 10 rather than five miles an hour, if motorists are to be sure it is something they can count on.

Obviously, such unacceptable cost will push extended lunar exploration beyond the reach of even a global, co-operative space effort. To overcome this serious roadblock costs must be brought down to

reasonable figures. The current cost of putting a pound of payload in low earth orbit is approximately \$1,000, down from about \$1 million when we launched our first entellites. With the use of the new earth shuttle this cost can drop precipitously to from \$10 to \$15 per pound. Using nuclear shuttle to fly it to luna orbit could drop the unacceptable cost of \$100,000 a pound
