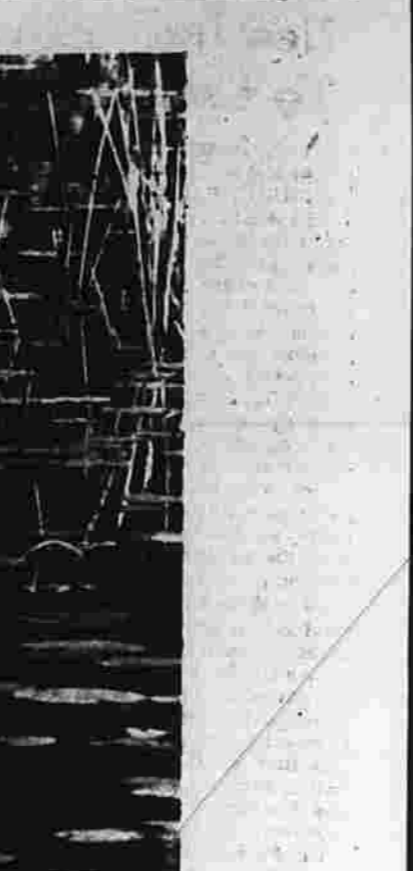

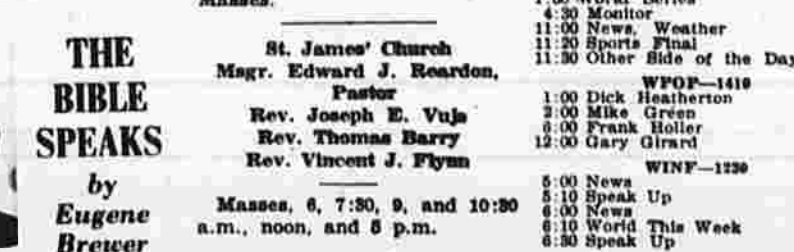

Chamber Pushes Effort
For Park Along River

Picking up an idea proposed several years ago by town planner Joseph Turney, the City Beautiful Committee is backing an effort to promote the creation of a continuous linear park along the banks of the Connecticut River.

The Connecticut River, which has recently become the object of a clean up effort by local, regional and state agencies.

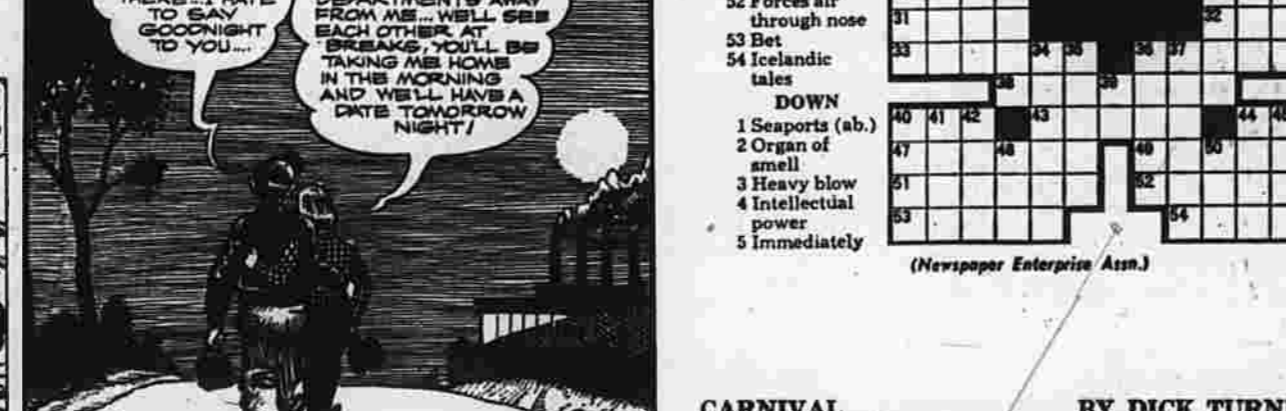
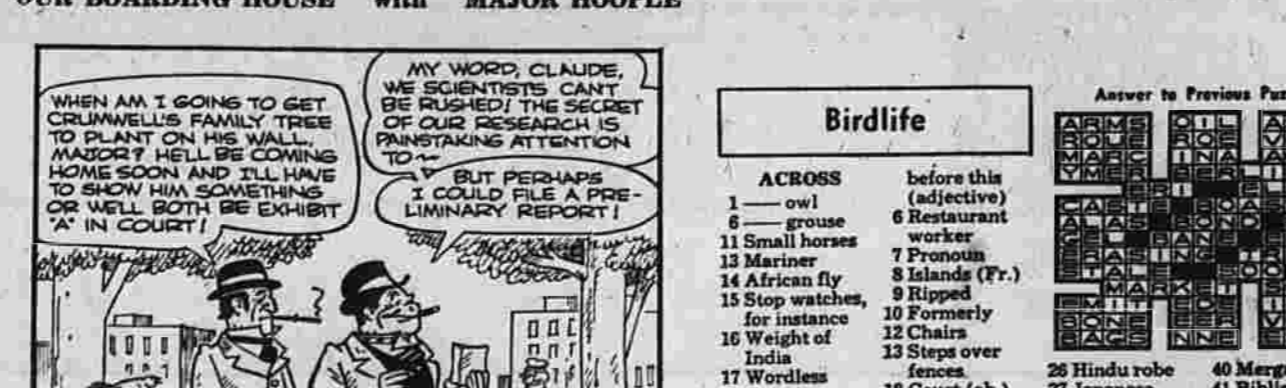

Star System Alive and Well

NEW YORK (AP) — Proof that television's star system is alive and well was supplied in recent days when CBS signed three top attractions, Andy Griffith, Dick Van Dyke and Mary Tyler Moore.

NBC says it is negotiating ex-

clusive contracts with four "enormous" stars.

New situation comedies will be created for the return of Griffith, Van Dyke and Miss Moore, who left CBS to pursue movie careers.

The signing of stars with no programs in mind is a fairly common practice. Most often the star forms his own production company for extra profits. That keeps the stars happy, but it is causing some grumbling by the movie studios, the traditional packagers of television programs.

Popularity in one medium does not always transfer successfully to television, although that's always the hope Doris Day consistently drew fans to her movies, but when she was put into one of CBS's rustic comedies last year the ratings were not spectacular.

This year, with a more urbane setting, as better suits Miss Day, things are improving.

In the case of Bill Cosby on NBC, a loyal following and a winning personality so far have been able to overcome weak material. He placed No. 4 in the first fast Nielsen. Debbie Reynolds also is triumphant over her material, at least in the ratings. She is No. 10.

It was CBS that raised the star system from an art to an exact science. And as a result the network has maintained a

ratings superiority for 16 years, although its claim to first place last season was disputed by NBC.

Glen Campbell Is His Own Man

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — By his own definition, Glen Campbell is a straightahead man, and that applies to his singing and acting as well as his approach to his career.

The Campbell career may well be the most successful since Elvis Presley wiggled onto the show business scene. Campbell seems to be more versatile, since he is making it big in television, movies, records and concerts. Variety's estimate of his earnings in the past year: \$12 million.

Not bad for a boy who used to follow a mule, in Delight, Ark.

Glen Campbell has proved that he can be as independent as the razorback hogs of his native state. Producer Hal Wallis discovered that when he tried to pick Campbell's songs for "True Grit."

"Oh, no, you don't; I pick my own songs," declared the singer. The producer was too astonished to reply.

Even though "True Grit" was his first movie, Campbell also laid it on the line to the director, fire-eating Henry Hathaway. Campbell balked at calling an

outlaw a "squirrel-headed son of a bitch."

Campbell told the director: "You can say the line if you want to, but I ain't." He compromised on "squirrel-headed bastard," on the grounds that it wasn't really a swear word.

CBS has also become acquainted with Campbell's independent nature.

The singer was host of the "Summer Brothers Smothers Show" in 1968 and did so well he was groomed for his own variety show during the regular season. Last November he told the network to make up its mind on a January start or he would go ahead with a movie instead.

CBS quickly made up its mind, and the Glen Campbell Goodtime Hour went on the air in midseason. It was an instant success.

Campbell wasn't entirely pleased with the show. It was half-owned by the Smothers Brothers, who were having their problems.

"I think Tom is one of the most brilliant minds in the business—a great producer," said Campbell. "But he had his hand

Frank Sinatra Jr. Shuns the Young

NEW YORK (AP) — In an age of rock and pop, Frank Sinatra Jr. is unique among young singers. His appeal is to an older audience.

Actually, young people have few opportunities to hear him. He eschews pop music for old standards and show tunes, so he makes few records.

His only regular television appearance was last year as one of the stars of the Dean Martin summer show, which was aimed for mature viewers.

And, most of his appearances are in night clubs, where, as he points out, "you have to be over 21 to get in."

But Sinatra isn't worried. He figures he has the kind of voice and repertoire that will go on forever. Crossing his fingers, he said, "I don't see how a good old-fashioned singer in front of an audience can lose."

Viewers will get another

chance to see him on his first television special, set for 9 p.m. EDT Sunday, Oct. 19, on CBS. His father follows him in a special on the same network Nov. 13.

Young Sinatra has been described as "5 going on 40." His outlook is mature and serious. "I must be a complete square," he says. His clothes are show business hip, but several come from being mod. He says he listens to rock music only "to see if I'm making too harsh a judgment about it."

He demurs at being called a star, even the star of his own special. He points out that the special is loaded with such talent as his father and sister, Nancy, Sammy Davis Jr., Jack E. Leonard, Jack Benny and Arte Johnson. "I think of myself more as a master of ceremonies than star," he said.

The whole thing points up a dilemma for young Sinatra: he is still thought of very much as his father's son.

A visitor to his New York office cannot help being struck by the overwhelming resemblance. Not only looks and singing, but the way he wears his clothes, the stance, the way he holds a cigarette.

Has having a famous father helped or hurt him in his career? He knew the question would come up sooner or later and he was not disturbed by it.

"It's been a little bit of both," he answered. "I'm just sorry people have to look at it at all, but human nature being what it is, I guess they always will. It's too bad people can't look at it for what it is and not for what they think it is."

"Actually," he said, with a trace of a smile, "Nancy is more of a competitive spirit to me than my father. We're closer to the same age. Nowadays I
