



For those who have been aiming their thoughts and plans in the latter direcat home in the name of peace in Vietnam — it has been a bitter and frustrating experience to see the Vietnam Moratorium today take on such an air of respectability as it has been given by the open support of all kinds of public and religious and educational leadership.

To some of the insurgent minds on our national scene, respectability is death itself, and a target to be attacked no less feroclously than the particular

We may expect, therefore, that there will be some effort, in some places tomorrow, to carry the Moratorium observance beyond peaceful and prayerful means.

Against that possibility, we must hope that the original sponsors and planners of the day can succeed in holding it to peaceful means for peaceful objectives.

That will, if it can happen, give the Moratorium its best chance of having some constructive influence on the course of events in Washington, Vietnam, and Paris.

One wishes one could add to the list of places in which a good observance of the Moratorium might have a positive What one would like to have happen

in Hanoi, after such an American demonstration of a nation-wide desire for peace, would be some kind of decision to help speed the process by which the American people, through their leadership, and the Vietnamese people, through their leaderships, might come to an end

For that to happen would require the development of an outlook we are not even sure we Americans would possess, if it could ever happen that it would be the people of North Vietnamese demonstrating in favor of quick peace in Vietnam. Do you, when an enemy people is openly asking for peace, view that as an opportunity to be generous, or as an encouragement to keep up your own military stance, in the hope that the enemy's populace will force the enemy government to make even more concessions?
