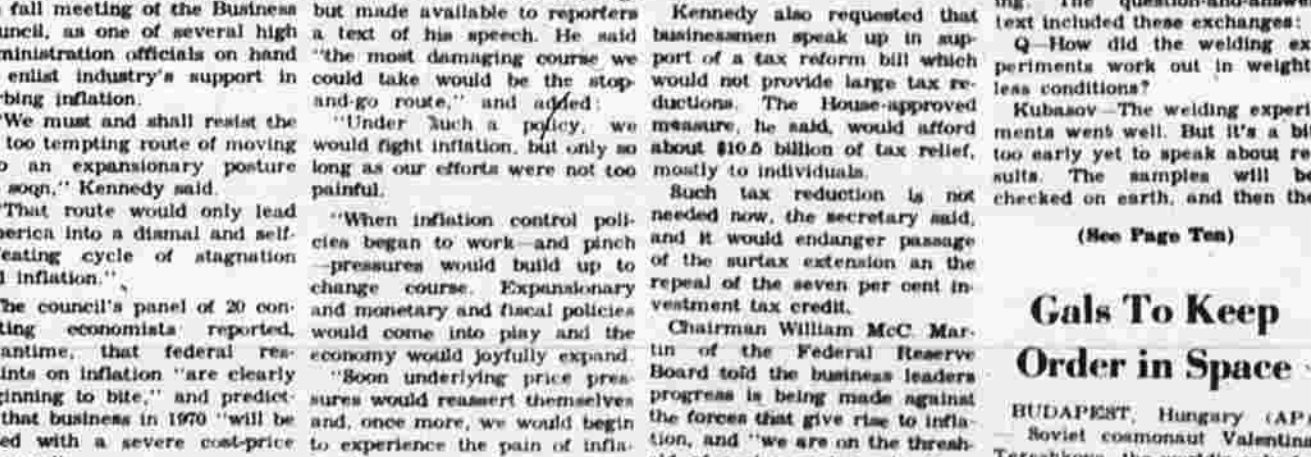

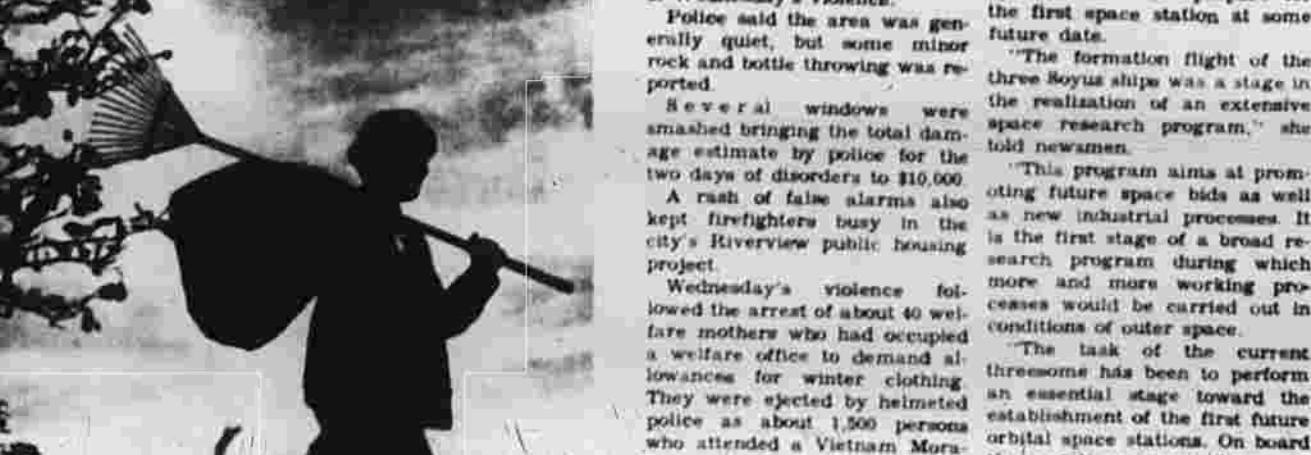

The 37 states, speaking through Lefkowitz, said religion makes "moral, ethical, cultural and social contributions" to society that justifies a tax exemption as in the public welfare.

Nixon Sets 300,000 Troop Cut

Finch Banishes Cyclamates From Grocery Shelves

WASHINGTON (AP)—Secretary of Health and Education Robert H. Finch ordered today that all foods and drinks containing the artificial sweetener cyclamate be removed from grocery shelves by Jan. 1, 1970, because of new evidence that the substance causes cancer in animals.

Finch emphasized, however, "we have no evidence at this point that cyclamates have in fact caused cancer in humans."

He said he would not recommend that families who now have cyclamate-containing foods and drinks in their homes throw them away or stop using them at the present time.

Cyclamates, which Finch estimated are a \$1-billion annual industry, are found mainly in soft drinks and foods. They also are contained in a wide range of non-diet foods from bacon to canned fruits and children's vitamins.

Finch said he acted after two different laboratories presented evidence this week that cyclamate in very high doses produced bladder cancer in rats and mice.

Several government scientists had recommended that the Food and Drug Administration ban cyclamate compounds on a restricted basis and on developing government scientists and members of the National Academy of Sciences.

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37 States Back Church Tax Relief

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Nixon Asks Restraint By Business, Labor

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Nixon is sending personal fight-inflation appeals to 2,200 leaders of business and labor — his first concerted effort to solicit wage-price restraints.

The White House said letters from the President will be mailed Monday as a follow-up to his nationwide radio address in which he asked all citizens to "bear the burden of restraint in their personal credit and purchasing decisions, so as to reduce the pressure on us to drive prices out of control."

Nixon said Friday the administration is requesting "wider restraint" in an effort to hold down living costs. "I can report to you that the medicine has begun to work. There will be no overnight cure, but we are on the road to recovery from the disease of runaway prices."

President Nixon is expected to try to formulate a policy on gas and germ warfare at a meeting with the joint Chiefs of Staff and the Department of Defense.

It was unclear whether the joint Chiefs of Staff would support Laird's position on halting production of biological warfare agents.

The Joint Chiefs have, in the past, reportedly held the view that biological warfare agents were necessary in the American arsenal to provide a deterrent against a germ attack.

Shifting of Burns May Boost Moynihan

WASHINGTON (AP)—When Arthur Burns moves from the White House to the Federal Reserve Board, the President's Treasury Affairs Council will lose one of its ranking conservative members.

One result could be a boost in influence for Daniel P. Moynihan, the council's ranking liberal and President Nixon's chief urban affairs adviser.

Burns and Moynihan have been rivals for the President's ear since the inauguration. Moynihan has been completely friendly.

"I would say, and I know he would say the same, that we have the greatest record for one another," Moynihan added in a recent interview.

Burns joined the board chairman by Nixon Friday, says a picture of himself with Moynihan on prominent display in his office. He speaks in the same warm vein about Moynihan.
