Deaf People Should Control Own Welfare, Experts Say

CHICAGO (AP) — The deaf should emulate Negroes and other minority groups and control their own welfare, according to two experts who have worked with the deaf at Michael Reese Hospital here.

"Deaf people in the United States have achieved a superior status to those in other Western civilizations, yet in many ways they are still regarded as second-class citizens," they said.

Dr. Dr. McCay Vernon, a psychologist, and Bernard Makowsky, a psychiatric social worker, expressed their views in a recent article in "The Deaf American."

"The child is taught that talking with his hands is terrible," he said, "and we think this is ridiculous."

U.S. Cease-Fire Hopes Dim

WASHINGTON (AP)—A United States official said today that hopes for a cease-fire in the Vietnam conflict are dimming. The official, who spoke on condition of anonymity, said that the United States is still committed to a negotiated settlement, but that the chances of reaching one in the near future are uncertain. He noted that the North Vietnamese have shown little interest in negotiations and that the South Vietnamese government is struggling to hold its own against the communist forces.

Quartet Is Mum At Army Hearing

WASHINGTON (AP)—Sgt. Maj. William O. Woodruff and three other men involved in the Fifth Amendment to Senate hearings today refused to answer any questions about their alleged involvement in a conspiracy to loot servicemen's paychecks. The four men, who were part of a military unit in Vietnam, were brought to court for a hearing on charges that they had stolen paychecks from their fellow soldiers. The men, who are being held in a military prison, have remained silent throughout the proceedings.

Hartford Living Costly

ATLANTA, Ga. (AP)—A government survey shows living costs for retired couples are generally lowest in Southern states and that costs in Atlanta are among the lowest. The survey of spending by retired couples for 1967 showed costs were highest in Honolulu, Hartford, Conn., Seattle, Wash., Buffalo, N.Y., and many other northern mainland cities. Highest costs for retired couples on lower and intermediate budgets on the mainland were reported in Hartford, Conn., (\$2,322 and \$4,843) and top costs for the high budgets were reported in Boston (\$7,118).

Instant Integration Called Unrealistic

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Nixon administration, arguing today that what could be one of the most important Supreme Court cases in recent years, says it is simply unreal to talk about "instant integration" of the nation's public schools. The administration's chief spokesman, press secretary Ron Ziegler, said that the Supreme Court's decision in the case of Swann v. Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools, which dealt with busing to desegregate schools, was a landmark step but that it would take time to implement.

Beckett Wins Nobel Prize

STOCKHOLM (AP)—The 1969 Nobel Prize in literature was awarded today to the French playwright Jean Paul Sartre. The Swedish Academy announced the award to Sartre, who is 68 years old, for his "outstanding and versatile work in French literature." Sartre is a philosopher, novelist, and playwright, and is known for his work on existentialism. He is the first Frenchman to win the Nobel Prize in literature.

Nixon Summons Congress To Bail Out Merchant Fleet

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Nixon summoned Congress today to help bail out the U.S. merchant marine out of trouble with a 10-year program to build 300 new vessels. Nixon said that the merchant marine is in a "critical state" and that the government must take action to ensure its survival. He requested that Congress provide the necessary funding for the shipbuilding program, which is essential for the nation's defense and trade interests.
