Our Quiet Crime Against Ourselves The other day the Nobel Peace Prize Committee awarded its prize for 1969 to the International Labor Organization, an offspring of the League of Nations which somehow survived to become an affiliate of the United Nations. It is an organization which has undoubtedly done good work in the world, specializing in improving labor and sociological conditions in many countries, over half a

But to award it the Nobel Peace Prize is to say that, in reality, nothing very important in support of the cause of peace happened or developed or came to fruition in the past year. Rather than not make an award, the Comtion confessed and announced the failure of its search to find any organization or individual or movement which had really been able to do anything for

On the same day the Nobel Award was announced, an American diplomat had a letter published in the New York Times. In it, Phelps Phelps, a former ambassador to the Dominican Republic, tried to turn our attention toward some of the positive achievements of the United Nations, whose birthday is being observed today.

"Many may be expected," wrote Phelps Phelps, "to assert that the value of the U.N. - lacking power to imolement cease-fires and peace - ir questionable. In assessing only political uspects, the activities of agencies under the Economic and Social Council are often overlooked. Yet those have proved invaluable to underdeveloped or develop-

"Among these agencies are the U.N. Development Program, which sent 8,-000 specialists throughout the world to promote economic and social progress, and in association with UNIDO, emphasizes regional organization, industrial expansion and social advancement. Also frequently overlooked are the activities of UNESCO in training and education, of UNICEF, concerned with the welfare and education of children everywhere, of W.H.O., for its health activities and LL.O., now expanding in vocational rehabilitation and advice on employment problems: also UNITAR, aiding research in U.N. political problems and training of diplomats, UNCTAD with its programs stimulating all aspects of trade and financing. Not the least are the activities of the U.N. Human Rights Committee, which has ratified this year the Convention to Eliminate Racial Discrimination, its plans on behalf of youth, and the rights of women, not only in work, but in marriage and vicorce.

But one of these reasons is that the big nations which originally founded it have led the way in ignoring it when their own big nation policies might have been frustrated or challenged by a strong and functioning United Nations. The United States itself has been guilty of such conduct obviously enough, in Vietnam

But although the concept and practice of loyalty to the United Nations have faded since the creation and launching of the organization, 24 years ago, the need for the United Nations has not

escapable reality is that either we make the United Nations work to prevent and control war, or we leave ourselves inevitably exposed to what the next general conflagration can do to us.

Now, as then, we have the choice between life and death, between law and the jungle, between civilization and

And now, as then, the United Nations is the only potential instrument we have to reach for if we wish to choose life

This is pretty close to being the only real issue in our living. If we can't win survival itself, we may never have to

no greater betrayal, in the world today, than that of the inertness, the complacency, the inability to bestir ourspeakable fact that the world is beginning to treat the United Nations in the way it treated the League of Nations. If that ever becomes really and finally

But this is the crime we commit, in our quiet, never ill-intentioned way, as we salute the United Nations as a debating society, or for its humane and sociological achievements, or give a peace prize to one of its affiliates and then turn ourselves back to normal concerns as if we had discharged an obligation. It is a crime we commit against ourselves, and against our children, and against all those who died in war to end
