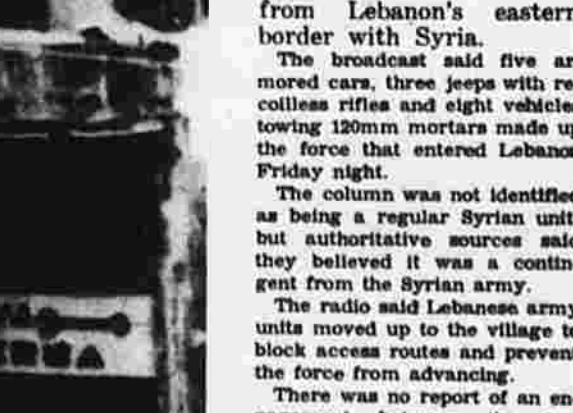

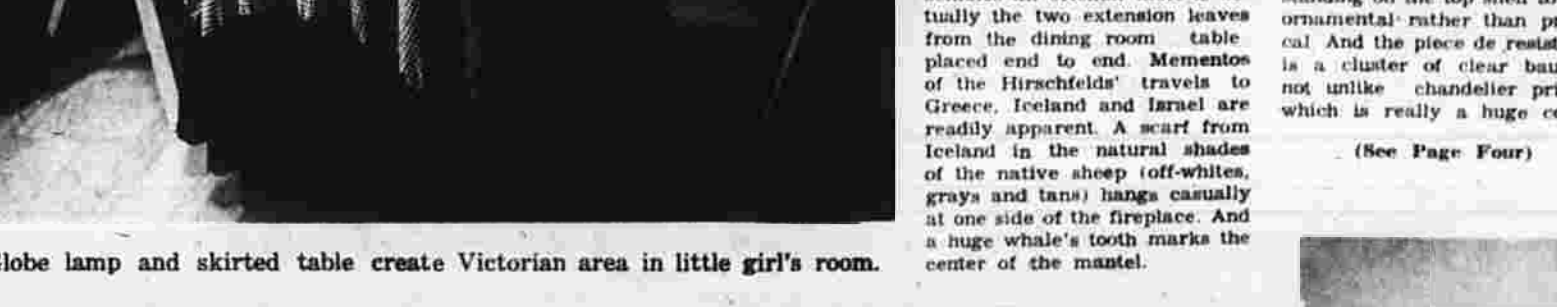

Nearsighted Killer Sought In Tate Case

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Police have disclosed that the person who killed actress Sharon Tate and four others last August dropped a pair of spectacles in dictating he was nearsighted.

Their bodies this may lead to capture of the killer. Detectives said Thursday they found the thick-lensed tortoiseshell eyeglasses when they discovered the honey blonde Miss Tate, 26, and four companions slain last Aug. 9 in her Bel Air home.

Near Miss Tate's body was the body of her former boyfriend, last styled Jay Sebring. Their heads were hooded and joined by a cord.

Outside the house were the bodies of coffee waitress Abigail Folger, Polish playboy Vitkyey Prokrowsky and Stephen Parent, friend of a caretaker.

All were shot, stabbed or bludgeoned. The eyeglasses, Detective Lt. Robert Heider told a news conference last week, were found inside the home where they probably fell off during a struggle.

Police tried to keep the glasses as a secret, Heider said, because they were used in a new detector test as long as suspects weren't aware detectives knew about them.

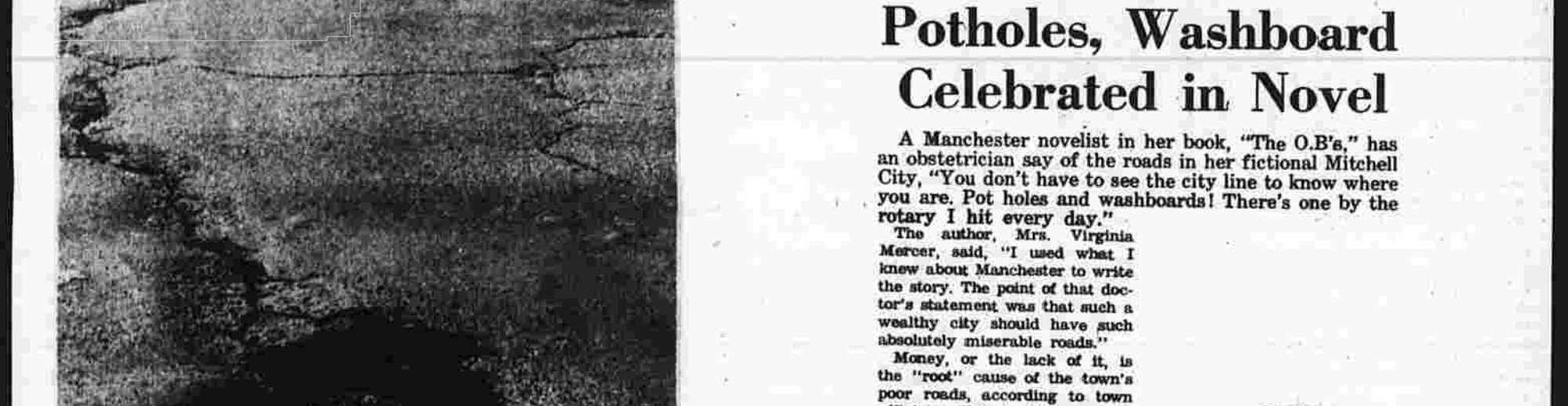

Bob Hope and 'Roberta'

TOLUCA LAKE, Calif. — Applause is the strongest addiction of them all. It can't be bought and has to be earned; but so long as it can be earned, those who have known its exhilarating warmth are not easily persuaded of the joys of quiet retirement.

The joy of working is the only real motivation Bob Hope must be able to conjure for working these days, but it is the only one he needs. He is well off (which is as descriptive as saying the Taj Mahal is cute) and he turned 65 earlier this year, thus adding Social Security to his other benefits. But except for a recurrent eye ailment Hope is in rousing good health, with the drive and enthusiasm of a considerably younger man.

He insists that he takes it easier right along, but the evi-

dence is unconvincing. He left recently to spend eight working days in Dallas, taping a television special of "Roberta" in the superb new 392-seat Bob Hope Theater at Southern Methodist University. (The event is also a benefit, naturally; someone benefits from almost everything Hope does these days except shave.)

Hope continues to log more time in the air than most stewardesses. He is already hatching his next movie, "The Bride Wore Binkers," to be filmed in Ireland with Jackie Gleason and possibly Bing Crosby. He makes a movie a year and the current one, "How To Commit Marriage," has so far done better at the box office than any Hope film since "The Seven Little Foys." He is deeply involved with his television specials, does guest appearances and, of course, the endless benefits, including his recent and spontaneous visit to the hurricane-ravaged Gulf country.

The revival of "Roberta" is a particular pleasure for Hope, because the show marked a significant turning point in his career 36 years ago, when he created the role of Hocklebar-

ry Haines on Broadway.

"It was the first thing I'd ever done which showed I could move around in a story," Hope said not long ago over lunch in the Toluca Lake home his associates affectionately call the Winter Palace. "It was the first thing with class I'd done."

This time Michele Lee will co-star, along with John Davidson, and with Sebastian Cabot in the role which Sidney Greenstreet originated on Broadway in 1933. The four live performances in Dallas will raise operating funds for the theatre. NBC will air the special Nov. 6.

Hope's public personality is mellowed now, but essentially his strengths as a performing comedian are what they have always been, topicality, irreverence, a mixture of broozy self-confidence and pouting frustration—all presented with impeccable taste. It is a combination endlessly renewed by its topicality and likely to prove as timeless as Hope wants it to be. Hope's revisit to "Roberta" may, in fact, remind us once again that he is a genuinely expert farceur as well as an unsurpassed monologist.

Doctor Is a Hit

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — The television season is still a bit young for predictions, but most observers agree on one thing: "Marcus Welby, M.D." is a hit.

The reviews were good, the ratings have been excellent. The medical series, along with "Mod Squad" and "Movie of the Week" has given ABC command of Tuesday night for the first time in its history.

What makes a hit? Cynics say the time slot is all-important, and "Welby" is doubly blessed by facing CBS news shows and NBC's weakest movies. On the more positive side, "Welby" is modern, well-produced and sharply written.

But the essential element of the show's success may well be its enormously likable and empathetic star, Robert Young.

Most producers thought Bob Young would never return to a television series. He had been through a distinguished career in films, had five successful years in "Father Knows Best" on TV, plus a hapless season in

VATICAN CITY (AP) — Paul VI closed the second synod of Roman Catholics today by adopting recommendations for sharing of bishops in authority, and by "maximum consideration" of the others.

At the same time he reaffirmed his primacy in the Church.

"Pluralism might imply faith, moral law or the sacraments of the sacraments, and canon law—a unity in the Church, he said.

The Pope told the bishops that the closing speech that he called synods regularly, every five years, and give greater authority to a permanent synod set up in Rome.

The two points in the document the synod approved virtually unanimously before the Pope. The document amounted to an unprepared plea to the Pope to give a greater voice in his making.

The 146-member synod approved a document reaffirming the Pope's primacy over the universal authority over the billion member church, commended, in part:

—That bishops advise and collaborate with the Pope in decisions affecting the church.

—That a synod be held at least every two years to elect the pontiff.

—That a permanent synod in Rome represent the interests of bishops to the Pope.
