# The Age Of Suspicion

Back in the days of our innocence, hat ever seemed more praiseworthy d laudable than the use of accumulated wealth to establish foundations dedicated to cultural and educational and sociological purposes?

The establishment of such foundations was considered a generous and conscientious use of money which had been innerited or which might be spilling out the sides of some flourishing industrial giant. The giving was classified with philanthropy. The actual accomplishnents and activities of the various foundations were treated with grateful awe and respect. Their good works and their good name spread all around the world. They even seemed, in many respects, the great American conscience at

But the other day, a Senate committee voted 9 to 8 in favor of a proposal which would decree uncompromising death for all these great foundations at the end of another 40 years. That would be a long grace period; but the intent of the vote was clear, Nine of the 17 Senators voting wanted to kill the foundations off, as if they were something evil and undesir-

is no longer above suspicion. We no onger necessarily revere the giving away of money. We have begun to question, from as many angles as there our thadings in our individual ideological eanings, the propositions to which foundation money has been devoted. We are curious and nervous about the kind of education they may be financing. We question their right, by putting in the weight of their dollars, to influence the direction of sociological experimentation. We think we see some of the foundations becoming typed as conservative, or radical, reactionary or revolutionary, and the more we think we see such political or ideological alignment, the more we question their right to that freedom from taxation which is the one thing which makes it possible for them to

Possibly one would have to conclude, if one tried to audit the past, that the good that has been accomplished through the existence of the foundations has been a thousand times more important than any possible abuses of the foundation status which may have also occurred. But once the seed of suspicion has been planted, and we begin worrying about the possibility that large accumulations of money may be getting away with something, the end is almost pre-

Sooner or later-perhaps by eventual adoption of this very 40-year death sentence voted by the Senate committee the other day we will make it illegal for great wealth to try to give itself away to some good cause. We will outlaw voluntary charity and philanthropy and see to it that, if there is any surplus wealth available anywhere, the government gets
