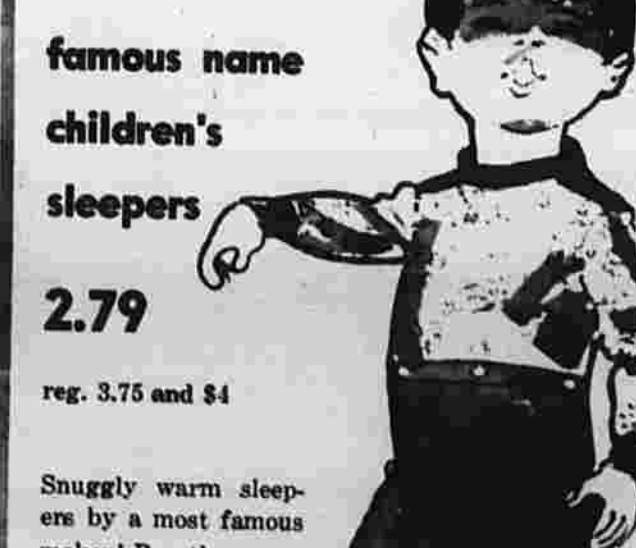

Judge Defends Ruling in Antismog Lawsuit

LOS ANGELES (AP)—A federal judge who approved an out-of-court settlement of the government's antismog suit against major automakers says his ruling was in the public interest.

U.S. Dist. Court Judge James W. Curtis granted a consent decree Tuesday in response to a proposal by the Justice Department.

The suit, filed during the Johnson administration, accused General Motors, Ford, Chrysler, American Motors and the Automobile Manufacturers Association of conspiracy to delay development of antipollution equipment for their products.

The decree forbids the continuing practice of the government complained about.

Judge Curtis said it would have been tragic had the court declined to sign the decree, the case then had gone to trial and the government had lost.

In his oral opinion, the jurist asserted the decree "gives the government all the relief it could have gained if it had tried the case and won." Additionally, he said, it saves the taxpayers the cost of a trial.

The decree was opposed by regional agencies throughout the nation, represented by at least 30 attorneys. They were joined by 82 congressmen who either objected to a consent decree or wanted modification of the terms of the settlement.

Judge Curtis noted that the consent decree will not prejudice the rights of anyone bringing damage suits against the automakers in connection with air pollution. Nor will it prevent local agencies or individuals from taking the matter to another court, he said.

Attorney Thomas Sheridan representing congressmen opposed to the decree, commenting: "Somewhere, sooner or later, this case is going to trial."

The Justice Department, in seeking the consent decree, argued that it would widen research on antismog devices. Many proponents of the decree.

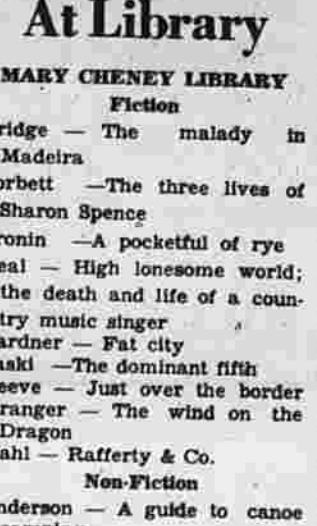

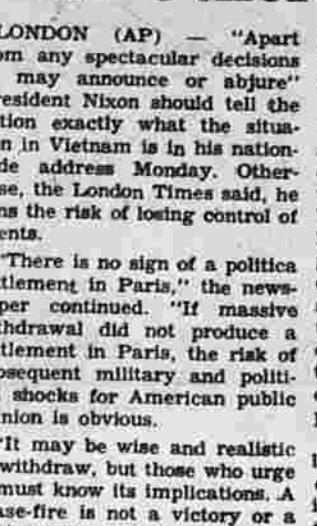

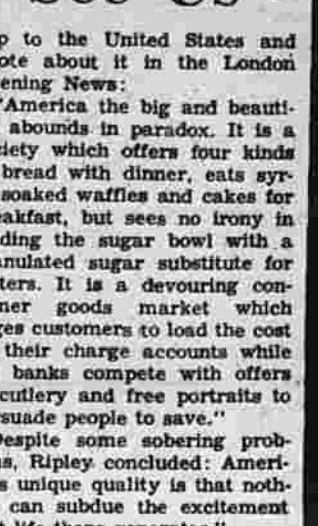

U.S. POSTAGE

DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER

Usually when the U.S. Post Office Department issues a new postage stamp, the location of the issue is a place of birth or death of the individual receiving the tribute.

The recently issued six-cent commemorative stamp honoring Dwight D. Eisenhower, nevertheless, held its ceremonies at neither Denison, Texas, where he was born, or in Washington, D.C., where he died.

The commemorative stamp is based on a photograph made by Bernie Noble of the Cleveland Press. The photo captures the grin that was Eisenhower's trademark and was approved by Mrs. Eisenhower.

The vertical stamp is the second jubilee adhesive issue of this year, coming in pairs of 22. The vignette is black. At the top of the stamp, in blue, is "U.S. POSTAGE." At the bottom in red is "Dwight D. Eisenhower."

Modern Singapore was founded by Sir Stamford Raffles 150 years ago. In 1819 it was just a tiny fishing village. But today Singapore, with a population of more than 2 million, has the second highest standard of living in Asia and has become a center of trade, commerce and industry.

To mark this anniversary, Singapore has issued six commemorative stamps during the 15th anniversary of its history. The values are 15 cents, 30 cents, 75 cents, \$1.50 and \$3.00. The designs, 1919-1969, appear on each stamp.

Royalist sheets, each consisting of the six values, also have been produced by the Postal Service Department for the first time in the history of stamps in Singapore.

Reform Jews Vote Down Parochial School Proposal

MIAMI BEACH (AP) — Opposing their own rabbi, the American Reform Jewish laymen have voted against creating a full-time private school system for their children.

Financial troubles in the Reform Catholic parochial schools, of day schools as a feeder system for candidates for rabbinical studies, was the reason for the vote.

The vote was taken at a meeting of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations (UAHC) convention.

Since neither body had legislative power over the synagogues, temples that have started nursery schools and kindergartens and want to pay for their own higher-level schools may do so.

But the UAHC rejection of the proposal means no national-wide system will be built up to match the Hebrew day schools of Orthodox and Conservative Judaism.

Reform Judaism in the United States has one million members, 700 synagogues and 1,000 rabbis.

The CCAR strongly approved at its convention in Houston four months ago an almost identical resolution to the one the UAHC turned down. The Jewish Education Commission, a joint agency of the UAHC and CCAR, wrote both.

The rejected proposal would have encouraged "pilot projects and experimental projects in Reform Jewish education" to provide deeper and better study than possible in youth camps and weekend or after-school classes at the temples.

Full-time day schools would combine Jewish teachings with general subjects meeting state education norms.

"We are called to establish such a system at a time when the Roman Catholic Church is forced to retreat because it cannot pay the cost of parochial schools," said Alexander L. Ross, an advertising executive and layman from New York City in the floor debate at a Miami Beach hotel.

Seale, Judge Clash Again At Riot Trial

CHICAGO (AP) — Bobby G. Seale accused Judge Julius J. Hoffman Tuesday of violating his constitutional rights in a riot trial.

Hoffman in turn threatened to gag and chain the Black Panther leader to a chair if he continued to disrupt court proceedings.

Seale is one of eight men on trial in U.S. District Court on charges of conspiracy to incite riots during the 1968 Democratic National Convention.

Having contended in the past that he is not represented by counsel of his choice and asking to be released from custody, Seale Tuesday accused Judge Hoffman of violating his constitutional rights by refusing to allow him to cross-examine a witness, an undercover policeman.

"I admonish you, sir," the judge said, "you have a lot of contemptuous conduct."

Seale retorted, "You're the one who's in contempt . . . in contempt of my constitutional rights." Hoffman dismissed the jury after Seale continued to shout questions at the witness.

"I am warning you, sir, that the court has the right to gag you," the judge said. "Under the law you may be gagged and chained to your chair."

Judge Hoffman then adjourned the proceedings until today and when the defendants refused to rise to leave, he said their behavior might be considered in contempt. He said he would deal with such a possibility after the trial.

Seale, national chairman of the Black Panther party, charged that his rights to counsel were violated when Hoffman refused to continue the trial until his lawyer, Charles Garry of San Francisco, could recuperate from surgery after the bombing of North Vietnam.

Hoffman has ruled that defense attorney William M. Kunstler signed a statement of withdrawal of his services and that Seale is represented at the trial.

PUC Okays 63% Hike In Gas Revenue

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP) — The Connecticut Natural Gas Corp. Tuesday was allowed 63 per cent of the \$4.4 million in additional annual revenue it requested be obtained from high rates.

The company had asked the state Public Utilities Commission for a 21.3 per cent hike in additional yearly revenue. The PUC allowed a 18.3 per cent hike.

Present rates would bring the company \$20,800,000 a year. The PUC allowed an increase of \$2,775,000.

A company spokesman said no decision has yet been made whether to appeal the PUC decision.

The company will have to submit a modified rate plan to conform to the PUC ruling.

The company had said it needed four principal reasons—increased cost of additional \$4.4 million for in state, local and federal taxes, the rising cost of borrowed money, higher wages and other operating costs, and the increase in utility property purchased with that capital.

The PUC, however, said it found several major flaws in company justifications for the increase. Among these were the following:

—Including \$5,000 in advance construction costs. The PUC by a rate increase, should be itemized in accounting elsewhere, and not paid for by a rate increase.

—Including the \$700,187 as the increased cost per year for the return on the investment in the gas transmission Co. The PUC said the increase has been put into effect but is subject to approval or adjustment by the Federal Power Commission.

The PUC noted that the company had increased its dividend every year since 1958.

"This commission questions the propriety of declaring a substantial increase in dividends under these conditions," the PUC said.

South Windsor In Final Week of Campaigning, Charges Reach a Crescendo

By CAROL MOULTON
In the week before election, residents are again electing the familiar deluge of two-minute statements, claims and counter-claims from the two major political parties.

Both Democrats and Republicans this year are "bleeding" with public relations organizations which have kept up a steady stream of press releases on their candidates' accomplishments and their opponents' shortcomings. The week the stream overran its banks, with each candidate vying for the last word, which they hope will be the one remembered by the voter when he closes the curtains behind him next Tuesday.

In what has become a primary sparring issue between the two parties, Republican Councilman Peter Nicholas has issued the latest comment on the town's 3.25 mill rate increase as compared with other towns.

It all started with a GOP claim that it was responsible for the lowest tax increase of all but one town in the area. Now, incumbent Councilman Donald Henry, Democrat, and Jane Romeyn, Republican, have offered at least some constructive suggestions for ways to improve communications, what reports to Councils.

Henry has suggested that instead of the required quarterly written reports from most appointed agencies, that the agencies report orally to the council in order that the council have an opportunity for discussion of any question.

She suggested requiring the town manager to list on the prior agenda those specific items on which he plans to report.

On several occasions in the past, Mrs. Romeyn commented, "citizens have indicated they would have made it a point to attend a council meeting if they had known in advance that the town manager was going to comment on a particular subject."

Scientist Quits NASA in a Huff

SPACE CENTER, Houston (AP) — The man who directed the first study of moon rock says he is resigning from the space agency after leaving an engineer to take his job.

Dr. Ferns R. Bell, director of the moon laboratory and a recent critic of the space agency's lunar plan, said Monday the space agency engineers "feel they should have firm operational control of the laboratory."

It's time for the guys who organized it to move on," he added. Bell, who has worked for the space agency for two years, said he would leave in mid-January to return to the Oak Ridge, Tenn., National Laboratory to do thermomolecular studies.

Bell is the third prominent scientist to leave the Manned Spacecraft Center. Dr. William S. Gossett, chief of science and applications, and Dr. Robert King, curator of the laboratory, were the others.

Several other scientists have been critical of the MABA moon exploration program, claiming that all the scientific studies possible are being incorporated in later moon landings and that some science demands cannot be met safely.

Judge Reserves Decision On Ex-Policemen

PROVIDENCE, R.I. (AP) — Judge Stephen A. Fanning reserved decision Monday on a request that additional evidence be provided defense lawyers for five former Coventry Police officers charged in connection with a killing last June.

Attorneys for the five had asked Superior Court that the state be directed to give them police reports, grand jury testimony of witnesses and statements that might tend to incriminate the accused.

Judge Fanning gave the defense until next Monday to file memoranda on a number of legal questions involved in the case.

Earlier, the defense attorneys won the right to see whatever "tangible" and "physical" evidence the state has in the case.

Four of the former patrolmen are charged with murder and conspiracy in connection with the June 2 shotgun killing of James J. Caprio, 35, of West Warwick. The fifth is charged with being an accessory before the fact of murder. All five defendants are charged with kidnaping Caprio, whose body was found in Connecticut near the Rhode Island line.

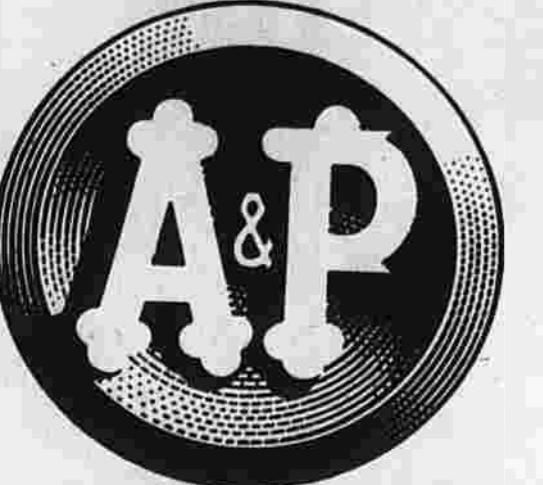

Church Unity, Home Rule Mustn't Conflict, Pope Says

VATICAN CITY (AP) — Pope Paul VI indicated today that he would give "ample recognition" to local autonomy in the Roman Catholic Church, provided this does not conflict with the Church's overall unity.

The Pope's remarks came two days after he formally closed the world synod of bishops, an event he said was aimed at bringing about "clearer, more aware, better working communion" between him and his bishops.

On Monday, addressing the synod's final session, the Pope announced he would call general assemblies every two years—thus accepting one of the key proposals made by the 146-member body for the sharing of papal authority.

Speaking to thousands in his cathedral church, the Pope stressed the need for "ecumenical charity." This should lengthened.
