Undoubtedly the nature of the challenge being offered to Tomkiel had something to do with the size of his vote. In any case, the result was clear reinforcement of the trend toward removing this office, together with that of Judge of Probate, from the soutine po-

It was noteworthy too that, although there was no particular challenge to him to summon the voters to special concern, Dr. Walter Schardt, one of the Democratic candidates for reelection to the Board of Education, was nocorded, in this Republican year, the highest vote of all the candidates running for that Board.

It was a good election, in which the voters sought out the right principles, the right party for those principles, and paid their meaningful compliments to individual public servants, whose qualities they had learned to respect.

There might even come to be a match between Moscow's total lack of freedom for the press and that abuse of the freedom of the press in America which permits the ceaseless and repetitive asking of nagging, moronic quesions. For a final showdown among the tourists, it might be interesting to have the comparative cost of living in Moscow and New York measured, not of exchange, but by the simple yardstick of how-much money a typical family has left over-or has gone into the

And the American people have another obligation, too . . . an obligation to exer-

DETROIT — You may be trying to outsmart a computer rather than a new-car salesman in the 1970s. And you might lose even faster.

To begin with, this is not the same as the problem of suicide (which some states still consider a crime). Here, the person is not claiming a right to take his life. He is merely claiming the right to refuse a life-saving transfusion, usually on grounds of religions free-

dom. But religious freedon, as uaranteed by the Constitution guaranteed by the Constitution, is not without limits. Although the state must not interfere with a person's religious beliefs, it may indeed interfere with his religious practices if they are sufficiently harmful.
