**Giaino and Dodd Refute Charges**

WASHINGTON (AP) — For two days syndicated columnist Jack Anderson has written about alleged favors by Rep. Robert N. Giaino, D-Conn., to a firework manufacturer Anderson says is financed by the Mafia.

For the second straight day on Thursday Giaino said his actions involving the fireworks maker, Bernard J. Semel of Washington, D.C. were "perfectly proper." Giaino said he even allowed Anderson access to his files for information the columnist included in the two columns.

Senator Thomas J. Dodd, D-Conn., mentioned in Anderson's second column Thursday, has demanded that a restoration be made. Anderson said that with Giaino's urging, Dodd had given Semel immunity from prosecution in exchange for 1969 testimony before a Senate subcommittee headed by Dodd.

A spokesman for the committee said the record shows Dodd told Semel during the hearings: "I am not in any position to grant you any immunity."

Giaino said he had no advance knowledge that Semel was going to testify and added: "I made no attempt to interfere for him."

Following the 1963 testimony, Semel was arrested and served a short term on a charge of illegal transportation of fireworks. Anderson said in his first column that he was turning the information he had gathered about Giaino over to the U.S. Justice Department.

The Justice Department said it had no comment to make on the matter.

The Hartford Courant said today that Giaino, during a Thursday interview in Washington, reiterated that he had no knowledge of any Mafia connection of two of Semel's employees.

Anderson has claimed that Giaino introduced with the Selective Service and the Army to get an early Army discharge for one of Semel's employees and a six-month deferment for the other.

Giaino said Wednesday that he had never heard anything about the charge in Anderson's column that Semel's firework business was financed by the Mafia.

He said that after meeting Semel, the firework manufacturer "subsequently asked me to help two employees of his. I made inquiry to Selective Service and the Army in the usual manner, which I have done in hundreds of cases."

"I know nothing of the background of these men," Giaino said, adding that "it is not within my power or scope to check the backgrounds or character of the people."

Giaino, 50, serving his sixth term in the House, was introduced to Semel by Paul Coppola of New Haven, Anderson said, alleging that Coppola was an organized crime figure who had been indicted in 1964.

**Superman Isn't Relevant — That's Why He's Lovable**

NEW YORK (AP) — While religionists worry about being relevant today to people's cares, an American folklore figure still selling about since 1938 keeps making it big — by his very irrelevance.

Superman, ever wagging his "never-ending battle for truth, justice and the American way," once had wartime chaplains convinced that the Man of Steel was becoming a substitute for religion.

"He was a code of ethics in four colors that you could roll up and stick in your pocket just before you hit the beachhead. He was right here with the troops as a kind of Bible."

So notes John M. Cadley, a current affairs writer, in a recent issue of the Catholic weekly magazine Ave Maria. He only you could really live like that. But, because Superman has helped restore people's faith in their own power to triumph over the evil that exists everywhere, around them" after he first appeared 31 years ago in the pages of Action Comics.

As all heroes are, Superman was entrusted then with the values and qualities people considered most important. "To know that he could not be destroyed, might and justice were inseparable.
