Looking at Rembrandt's etchings is an inspiring experience. Not only are they remarkable individually. By also comparing them one with another it is possible to feel the excitement and wonder of watching some of the creative processes by which great works of art come into existence.

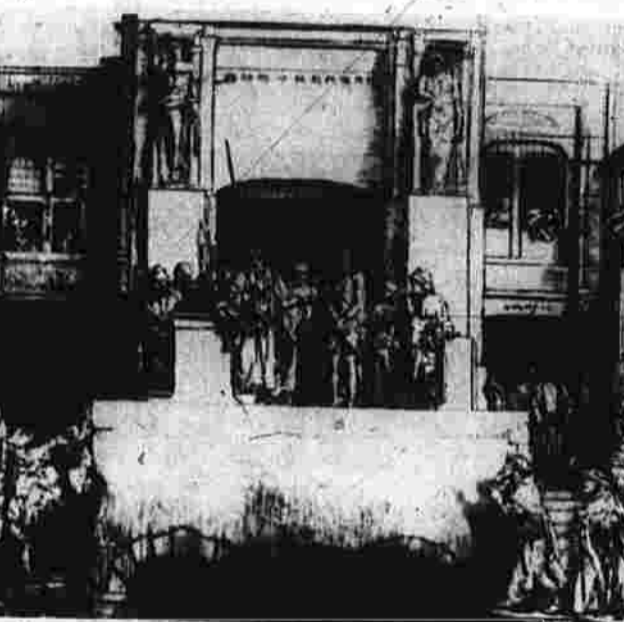
This year is the 300th anniversary of Rembrandt's death, and to mark the occasion a unique exhibition of his etchings has been arranged by the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, and the Pierpont Morgan Library of New York. It will be seen at both these institutions. Some of the etchings from the exhibition are reproduced in this Picture Show page.

Rembrandt's fame as a master of painting overshadows for many people his singular achievements as an etcher. His own prints are as widely known and valued as any ever made. He was one of the most inventive printmakers of all time, and a restless experimenter.

For Rembrandt, printing was a continuous creative process. And by comparing successive impressions we can watch him change his mind. His ideas of what he wanted to say and how to achieve the effects he sought grew and developed as he worked with his plate. From one impression of a single subject to the next he experimented with the imaginative use of other techniques together with etching, particularly drypoint (scratching the copper plate directly with the etching needle rather than biting with acid). He also tried different ways of inking and wiping his plates, and the effects of using papers of various colors and textures.

The new American exhibition shows all these details clearly. Series of impressions of the same subject are displayed side by side. In all there are 118 different impressions of 23 subjects. They demonstrate how Rembrandt's conception of his subject developed as he recognized problems and overcame them—although his own "final" satisfaction was an elusive thing.

The etchings on show are solely from American public and private collections, including the Museum of Fine Arts, the Pierpont Morgan Library (the largest and most comprehensive collection in the country), the Metropolitan Museum of Art, the Art Institute of Chicago, the National Gallery in Washington, the Fogg Museum of Harvard University, the Boston Public Library and the Library of Congress.

Nixon, Congress May Clash On Water Project Spending

WASHINGTON (AP) — Congress and President Nixon appear headed toward a clash over spending for water projects, and the extent of their disagreement will be disclosed early next week.

The President, as part of his anti-inflation program, has called for a cutback or slow-down in such projects while Congress obviously is in a somewhat more generous mood.

The House treasury has added some \$9 million to Nixon's proposals for the flood control, irrigation, navigation and other water projects of the Army Engineers and the Reclamation Bureau.

Now the Senate appears ready to add more funds in a bill to be unveiled Monday.

Chairman Allen J. Ellender, D-La., of the Senate public works appropriations subcommittee, said his bill will carry some additional, particularly in the area of hurricane protection projects.

Ellender concedes that even if Congress votes larger appropriations, Nixon doesn't necessarily have to use the added funds.

"We have no way of making the President spend the money," Ellender said.

However, he plans to organize a congressional committee to call on Nixon to urge more spending in water projects.

A year ago Congress voted \$1.5 billion for water projects to be planned and built by the two agencies. Nixon recommended \$1,288,000,000 for the current fiscal year which started July 1, step up in the program.

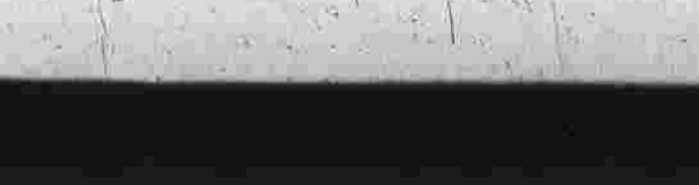
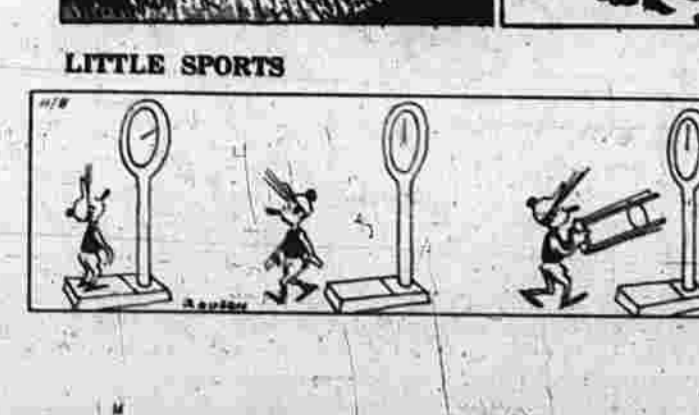
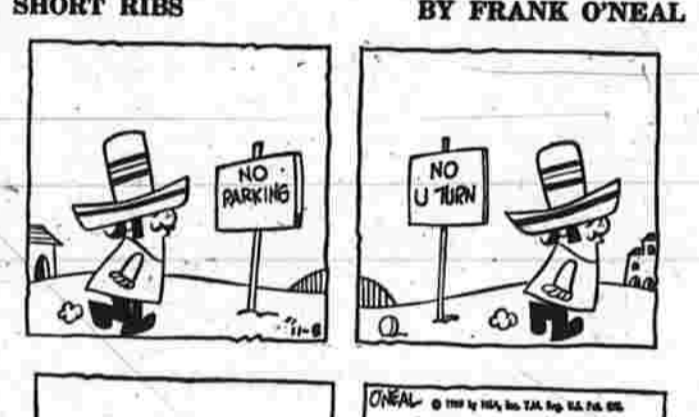

Just Julie and Harry

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—Some television specials are drowned in production: huge sets, dozens of dancing girls and boys, a parade of stars. That won't be the case with "An Evening with Julie Andrews and Harry Belafonte."

The NBC special on Sunday night—pre-empting "Bonanza"—will feature only Julie Andrews and Harry Belafonte, with an assist from Frenchman Michel Legrand. That's all. No Busby Berkeley dance numbers. No locations in the Grand Canyon. Just three talented people doing their respective things.

That is the concept of Gower Champion, who produced, directed and choreographed the special, and Miss Andrews went along with it. She also submitted to Champion's taskmaster-ship, which is legendary in show business. After five weeks of intensive rehearsals on a bare stage at Goldwyn Studio, she underwent two full days of recording songs, then five days of taping the show in NBC's color studios at Burbank.

Does she enjoy the hard work?

"Not particularly," she admitted during a rehearsal break. "I've had most of this year off, and I must say I enjoyed it immensely. I hated going back to work. And the fact that I don't have to begin another picture until next February is keeping my spirits up."

She isn't doing the special for the money. Rights to the show will be owned by Hathaway House, a home for retarded children which is a favorite charity of hers.

Then why do a television special?

"I guess it's largely a matter of wanting to break away from the rather plastic quality of being a movie star. In films everything is so carefully done, so expertly planned. I think it healthy to break away from that

'Today's' Barbara Walters

WASHINGTON — The notoriously fickle television audience has been faithful to the "Today" show (NBC), since Jan. 14, 1962, and Barbara Walters thinks she knows why.

"I think," she said with just a hint of a smile, "that they watch it to find out if the world is still there."

"Today" runs from 7 a.m. to 9 a.m. EST weekdays.

Miss Walters is in Washington for a week while the "Today" show originates here. We chatted over cups of coffee in her suite at the Washington

Hilton. Barbara's blue-eyed, 16-month-old daughter, Jacqueline, had more fun with the cream and sugar than she could have had in a sandpile.

Miss Walters is married to theatrical producer Lee Guber and she is a very calm mother. While Jacqueline splashed cream, Barbara quietly went and got a towel to protect the rose-colored dress that she was to wear while video tape recording an interview with Tricia Nixon.

Jacqueline, on cue, will flash what her parents call a show business smile. She flashes all her teeth and the eyes go blank. It is a game that the child loves, for the "show business smile" is always followed by a merry giggle.

Miss Walters, 38, has a calm competence in television, too. She's been performing on the air for six years, a record for a woman on this program and

she became permanent after producers had tried out dozens of women.

"They didn't fail," Miss Walters corrects a reporter. "The program changed. They stopped using the woman to do the weather and they began emphasizing the factual side of the show."

Miss Walters went in front

of the cameras after more than 10 years of offstage work, preparing features and writing in-

and to show that there are other aspects of your career.

"And the size of the audience you can reach through television is staggering. When I did my last special, someone pointed out that more people saw it in one evening than saw 'My Fair Lady' on the stage throughout its history."

Julie seemed refreshed by her year's vacation, during which she said her major occupation was "chauffeur-ing children." Before that, she had five years of steady film making, most of them long and tedious movies, and the strain was beginning to show.

Her last film was "Darling Lili," directed by her close friend, Blake Edwards. The movie soared far over budget due to weather and other problems on European locations. But Julie feels it will be worth all the trouble. "Blake saw six

reels of 'Lili' and he says it works beautifully," she remarked. "I have high hopes for it. It is handsomely filmed and funny and tuneful."

She admitted disappointment with "Star!" which 20th Century-Fox President Richard Zanuck refers to as "our Edsel." After a disappointing road-show release, the film has been cut down and will be put out as "Those Were the Happy Times."

"I think the new title is terrible," said Julie. "I hope they will not try to fool the people into thinking it is another movie. At least when MGB rereleased 'Emily' they said under the title 'formerly 'The Americanization of Emily.' Fox should state that this film was formerly 'Star!'"

"What went wrong with 'Star!?' I don't really know. It wasn't for lack of effort; all of us worked terribly hard on it. Perhaps we were simply too close and couldn't see what was wrong with it. Or perhaps it was just Barbara Streisand's year."

interviews for others to perform. She worked in television from the time she graduated from Sarah Lawrence College and became a sort of "token female" on all the programs that CBS-TV used in an attempt to compete with the "today" show.

She was the token female on "The Morning Show" for troupes headed by Walter Cronkite, Dick Van Dyke, Will Rogers Jr. and Jack Parr. In April, 1961, she moved over to a similar job with "Today."

Producer Al Morgan began using her work in film reports and decided, in 1964, that she was ready for fulltime duty as the "Today" girl. The network salesman didn't like the idea. They weren't certain just how "to merchandise" a performer who wasn't an actress, a singer or a model. Nor were they sure just how the audience would take "an educated woman."

Even producer Morgan had doubts about Barbara's having a long run. "They may," he told her, "consider you too Bonwit Teller."

Barbara was given a 13-week contract as a performer and assured that her job as a writer would be waiting at the end of the run. The run is now in its sixth year.

The run will probably last a lot longer. For the network has been adding to Miss Walters' assignments. She went to Wales for the investiture of

Prince Charles and she was assigned to handle the segment on "The Sexual Revolution" in the two-and-a-half hour special, "From Here to the 70s."

Another indication of Miss Walters' growth came recently from a former boss named Jack Paar. He was asked, "Who's the best interviewer in TV?" and he answered: "Barbara Walters."

Miss Walters is pleased that the first interview given to TV by Dean Rusk after he stepped down as secretary of state was given to her and to the "Today" show.

"I do think," she said, "that I have developed a talent for bringing people out."

She's trying to use that talent now to prepare a book that will help people become better conversationalists.

The book is half finished and she has already chosen a title: "So I said to the president... or how to talk to practically anyone about almost everything."
