More War About Peace

Keeping this nation on an even keel in its attitude and policy toward the war in Vietnam is not an easy process. Perhaps it is an impossible effort. But we now seem to be heading into a phase in which it becomes just as necessary o warn some of the "support the present" and "united we stand" pressure people that they can be as far from the central point of American feeling as the Moratorium marchers were when they advocated immediate pull-out of all

American forces in Vietnam. The nation honored the Moratorium people back in October because, for the most part, they conducted themselves with a peaceful, non-violent demonstration of their passion for peace. The demonstration was large enough and decent enough to give peace a new kind of respectability, and this was good. It is perhaps a very strong literal, realistic possibility that governments and parliaments and officials are never going to be able to negotiate and establish any reliable peace for mankind, and that, if peace comes, it will

But that kind of millenium moratorium has not yet arrived, and we are, for the oment, still living in a situation in which the actual handling of the war which already exists in Vietnam has to stay in the hands of existing authoriies. One could buy the spirit of the Moratorium demonstrators, but not the had to offer.

The October Moratorium was most valuable, if both President Nixon and Hanoi could have managed to take it that way, as a demonstration of the extent of the desire of the American people for peace, and as an encouragement to President Nixon to keep on with the kind of deescalation he had already ploneered in Vietnam, and as an inviation to Hanol to respond in kind.

Neither President Nixon nor Hanol managed to take the October Moratotorium quite that ideal way. The Moratorium people are now straining to press their point of view - and their extreme specific recommendations with greater vigor. And President Nixon, with his Monday night speech. as summoned into existence a counter ove which also purports to be desirous peace, but which, in its support of the sterner portions of the President's speech, and its emphasis of national unity against the enemy, gives off an tmosphere of wanting to head back loward the same hawkishness some of

now abandoned. The kind of substantial unity the President has - and could continue to possess - is for his own pursuit of his own actions in Vietnam. But the kind of unity now being campaigned for by some of his words and some of his supporters is something else again because what it really asks is that we reestablish what we have been doing in Vietnam as

our most famous hawks have themselves

a kind of holy cause. The kind of unity being asked is also one which would once again set up the theory that we can, after all, if we are lough enough and united enough, manage to win in Vietnam.

This kind of unity the President is oot going to get, and any kind of search for it, on his part, or on the part of his volunteer supporters across the

The sound position in the President's Monday night speech showed him leading the way toward peace, and making it his cause. His administration's preparations for November's new demonstrations for peace seem to regard the potential peace demonstrators as antagonists rather than as potential sharers of the same national desire for the end of the war. We would hope that the resident can remember that where he wants to be, and where he has been trying to be, by his actions, is in the middle, and not at all where some of the more active supporters of "unity" behind him at the moment would like to have him be, which is back in an effort to demonstrate that American force can always achieve a victory anywhere it really wants to.

It would be tragedy both at home and abroad if the very real possibility of a good national unity behind the President's cautious middle course in Vietnam should be blasted into a new domestic war between the hawks and the doves, the super-tough and the pambysoft, the super-righteous and the guiltcomplexed. The responsibility and opportunity for avoiding any such bitter confrontation lies not only with the potential medley of marchers in the streets, but with the officialdom and leadership which sits tense and waiting in its Washington offices. There need be no showdown if, as both the streets and the offices do proclaim, peace is indeed a common aim.

Sometimes it is fairly easy to detect in the results of various city elections similarity of thinking among voters n a number of communities. Tuesday's balloting in Western Massachusetts, for instance, showed a rejection of partisan overtures in nonpartisan elections; an emphasis on local tax rates as an issue; and a strong rebuff to proposals for uoridation of the public water supplies. Nonpartisan local elections, held in six seven Western Massachusettr cities, make it possible for the candidates to present-and the voters to examine-local issues without the distracdon of irrelevant party philosophies Most voters seem to like it that way, at least where town or city government is concerned. Hence the negative reaction of Pittsfield and Springfield voters to partisan appeals that crept into their

respective campaigns. overwhelming anti-fluoridat vote in Chicopee and Springfield was in some degree a reaction to a series of instances in which harmful substances have been discovered present in food, drink or medication. 



Looking at Rembrandt's etchings is an inthem one with another it is possible to fee the excitement and wonder of watching some of the creative processes by which great works of art come into existence.

This year is the 300th anniversary of Rembrandt's death, and to mark the occasion a unique exhibition of his etchings has been arranged by the Museum of Fine Arts, Bos ton, and the Pierpont Morgan Library of New York. It will be seen at both these institutions. Some of the etchings from the exhibition are reproduced in this Picture Show


Rembrandt's fame as a master of painting overshadows for many people his singular achievements as an etcher. His own prints are as widely known and valued as any ever made. He was one of the most inventive printmakers of all time, and a restless ex-

For Rembrandt, printing was a continuous creative process. And by comparing successive impressions we can watch him change his mind. His ideas of what he wanted to say and how to achieve the effects he sought grew and developed as he worked with his plate. From one impression of a single subject to the next he experimented with the imaginative use of other techniques together with etching, particularly drypoint (scratching the copper plate directly with the etching needle rather than biting with acid). He also tried different ways of inking and wiping his plates, and the effects of using papers of various colors and textures.


The new American exhibition shows, all these details clearly. Series of impressions of the same subject are displayed side by side. In all there are 118 different impressions of 28 subjects. They demonstrate how dembrandt's conception of his subject developed as he recognized problems and overcame them—although his own "final" satisfaction was an elusive thing.

The etchings on show are solely from American public and private collections, inluding the Museum of Fine Arts, the Pierpont Morgan Library (the largest and most nprehensive collection in the country), he Metropolitan Museum of Art, the Art Institute of Chicago, the National Gallery in Washington, the Fogg Museum of Harvard University, the Boston Public Library and the Library of Congress.
