





Quandary

One cannot, unfortunately, dispute the feeling of the National Commission on the Causes and Prevention of Violence that the United States may now be entering a period when the danger of conpiratorial assassination may succeed our already proven danger of assassination by deranged or extremism-motivated individuals. As the Commission points out, we are now a country riven by tensions of a racial and socio-economic nature. Our rhetoric has been opened to the language of revolution and vilification. We have tried out violence in the streets. We tolerate the existence of groups which claim the life and death power over their own members. We experience increasing impatience, and perhaps desperation, in our attitude toward problems which divide us and which cannot, apparently, be resolved by peaceful, reasonable means.

To concede all this is not, however, to be able to follow the Commission into its recommendations, or even to be sure it is good the Commission has issued such dramatic public warning. The security measures the Commission recommends—such as the extension of

Secret Service protection to an increased number of federal office holders and candidates for office and an increased police protection for state and municipal public figures and candidates—carry an inevitable price but not a guaranteed result. The price is indeed the price summed up in the two words "police state." What can never be guaranteed by any security system which does not amount to an imprisonment of the protected is real safety against the assassination at-

If there can be no real guarantee of complete efficiency and safety in any security system that could be set up, and if the price in the effort has to be the creation of too much of the atmosphere of a police state, there is one other potential result which has to be considered a possibility. One never knows, in human affairs, how much stimalus the setting up of defenses against

also exists that it might have been safer to try to pretend that we are still a civilized country than it would be to try to resort to extraordinary measures to try to guard ourselves against the peril. Where do we stand now, as a result of this report? Perhaps, unfortunately, in a situation of having given psychological tonic to the conditions we fear

without having persuaded ourselves to those fullest measures of protection which, in the end, would not guarantee full protection either. We stand more in the presence of trouble, with real cure still absent.

What happened down in Philadelphia the day after Halloween was that the police arrested a certain individual and jailed him when he couldn't raise \$10, 000 bail, all because six girls complained to police that he had given them a Halloween apple which had a razor blade imbedded in it. Four days later the girls were arrest-

ed and the man they had accused was released. It developed that they had made up the story in the first place, and that if they had an apple with a rasor blade in it that was because they That, we suspect, is the way most o

those cruel Halloween tricks which have now been reported in the news all across the nation for the past two years have originated-in the minds of some of our young people who have hit on a new formula for having their Halloween fun. We don't doubt that somewhere in this broad, unhappy land of ours there are some adult individuals with minds so twisted they might delight in putting razor blades in little red apples for nice little trick and treat girls. But we think that, as a general proposition, police should be cautious when they receive the razor blade complaint and that newspapers, for their part, should try not to become careless partners in the perpetration of a hoax which makes us eem more monstrous than we are.

Flanked steak is usual ly a top quality steak, such as filet mignon, surrounded by attractively arranged vegetables, chosen for a pleasing color com bination as well. The plank is most generally oval in shape, the outer border of which is customarily piped with mashed potatoes in a fancy design. 
