

Czech Press Remuzzled, But Public Turns It Off

Emergency laws threaten press for open defiance.

Prague (AP) — The new conservative Communist leadership, through large-scale purges and intimidation, has gained virtual complete control of Czechoslovakia's news media, 15 months after the Soviet-led invasion.

A few journalists have been jailed. Dozens have defected to the West and others have lost their jobs because they refused to repudiate their support of the liberal reforms introduced under Alexander Dubcek.

Thousands of others who also, as one put it, "lived in the dream" of free creation and last year, remain at their desks. A few are resigned and silent as the media court a perpetual state of self-censorship in London, Jan. 21, 1969.

The new Czechoslovak press was less than six months, it took more than twice that time to muzzle it against its previous role. Most outspoken publications were banned and almost all managing editors replaced.

Demand for Money Tops All Items on the Market

NEW YORK (AP) — There just isn't enough money to go around these days.

This week the East Chicago Sanitary District will try to raise \$17 million by selling bonds, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico will be seeking \$80 million for schools, and Pacific Gas & Electric Co. will be after \$80 million.

This is just a sampling of the need for funds. Municipalities alone will try to raise more than \$1 billion this week in bonds to rebuild schools, expand sanitation facilities, improve highways.

Will they get it? Perhaps not all of them will. The bankers who purchase these bonds and then try to resell them at a profit already are holding \$100 million from last week's auctions, particularly in their prospectus.

Those who do get the money will be paying the highest interest rates of this century. The prime lending rate is 8.5 per cent, meaning that the very best Triple A rated customers can't hope to pay much less.

If you had mentioned an 8.5 per cent rate to a large business or municipal borrower a year or two ago he would have gagged you mad. But this rate is paid willingly these days in the tight money situation, some bankers fear, is going to be with us for a long time. Tremendous demands have built up for funds at the very time that the Federal Reserve is tightening the supply.

The Fed, of course, is not making its intentions, although you won't get some businessmen to believe that is so. Its avowed purpose is to keep individual, business and government from overextending themselves.

By making money tight, or hard to come by, the monetary leaders help to plug up interest rates. This, in theory, should discourage borrowers, and to some extent it has done so. But

Chairman Mao's Thoughts Help to Cure Red Chinese

LONDON (AP) — A British surgeon who has worked in Red China for 15 years claims that a dose of modern medicine, technique, folk medicine and Chairman Mao's thoughts is conquering disease there.

Dr. Joshua S. Born, a 56-year-old fellow the Royal College of Surgeons, says this prescription has helped the Chinese move ahead in the eradication of venereal disease and schistosomiasis, a skin disease that afflicts millions.

Important strides also have been made in treating burns and reattaching severed limbs, he says.

How do Mao Tse-tung's thoughts fit in?

"It is a question of motivation," he explains. "Chairman Mao says the proper motivation must be lasting and reliable. For a doctor, the motivation should not be money or fame or fortune but what is the right thing to do, and the right way to do it."

PARIS (AP) — They are 68,000 strong in Paris, looking out at the world from behind a curtain partly just far enough to see who you are and what you are doing on their turf.

They are the city's concierges, women whose job as apartment building house mothers is as much as French cliché as the Eiffel Tower.

Now, the old woman and the girl are dying out. The president of the concierges union, grandes dames, says they are only a quarter of an inch in length.

"Twice a year, in March and August, the entire population of concierges in Paris are replaced. Some 6,000 concierges are new over 70 years of age."

Letter boxes, house telephones, and a desire on the part of landlords to pay them any more are pushing the concierges aside.
