



And there are those who believe that the decline in enemy activity is a signal that American military strength has been able to crush and punish the enemy so much that he no longer has the power to wage much of a war.

Each of these three kinds of analysis, dicate a different course of actions.

If the decline in enemy activity is a signal responding to our own deescalation of the war, then it should prompt some definite new deescalation on our

If the enemy is merely lying low for a recuperative time in order to strike out again later on, the recommendation would be that we go slow on any further

our military leadership has always thought possible, then the recommendation might be that, instead of drawing out forces, or holding them in any purely defensive position, we intensify our military pressure on the enemy, to

No one can guarantee any particular analysis, and no one can be sure, then, that any one particular policy is guaran-

All we can do is guess which selection of analysis and policy seems to be guid-

The guess here is that the President is, for the moment, holding to the middle analysis and the middle course, and reto try to pick up, one more time, the 11langer that he will be tempted to oversincerity of the enemy, even though both i try putting some new small piece

Among the consequences of their investments are: Sizable returns, a boost to the economies of underdeveloped nations, and a future dividend of good will for Uncle Sam.

Meeting prospective investors at athletic events, country clubs and social occasions, the intense but easy-talking Gallagher already has encouraged investments in a quinine plant, a flour silo and a dairy in Bolivia.

He and his associates have been awarded oil concession in Togo and Ghana. They are now negotiating the construction of a plant to make inexpensive potable water in Dahomey, West Africa. And plans are being developed to erect and operate soft ice cream companies in South America and Africa.
