



especially for this particular meal. We could thank Him for all the comforts of our affluence and especially for all those football games we watch on TV to help digest the meal. But all these things would be nothing if we lived in a cold world without warmth, without love and so we need also to be thankful that the Lord God has come into this cold world in the person of Jesus Christ.
