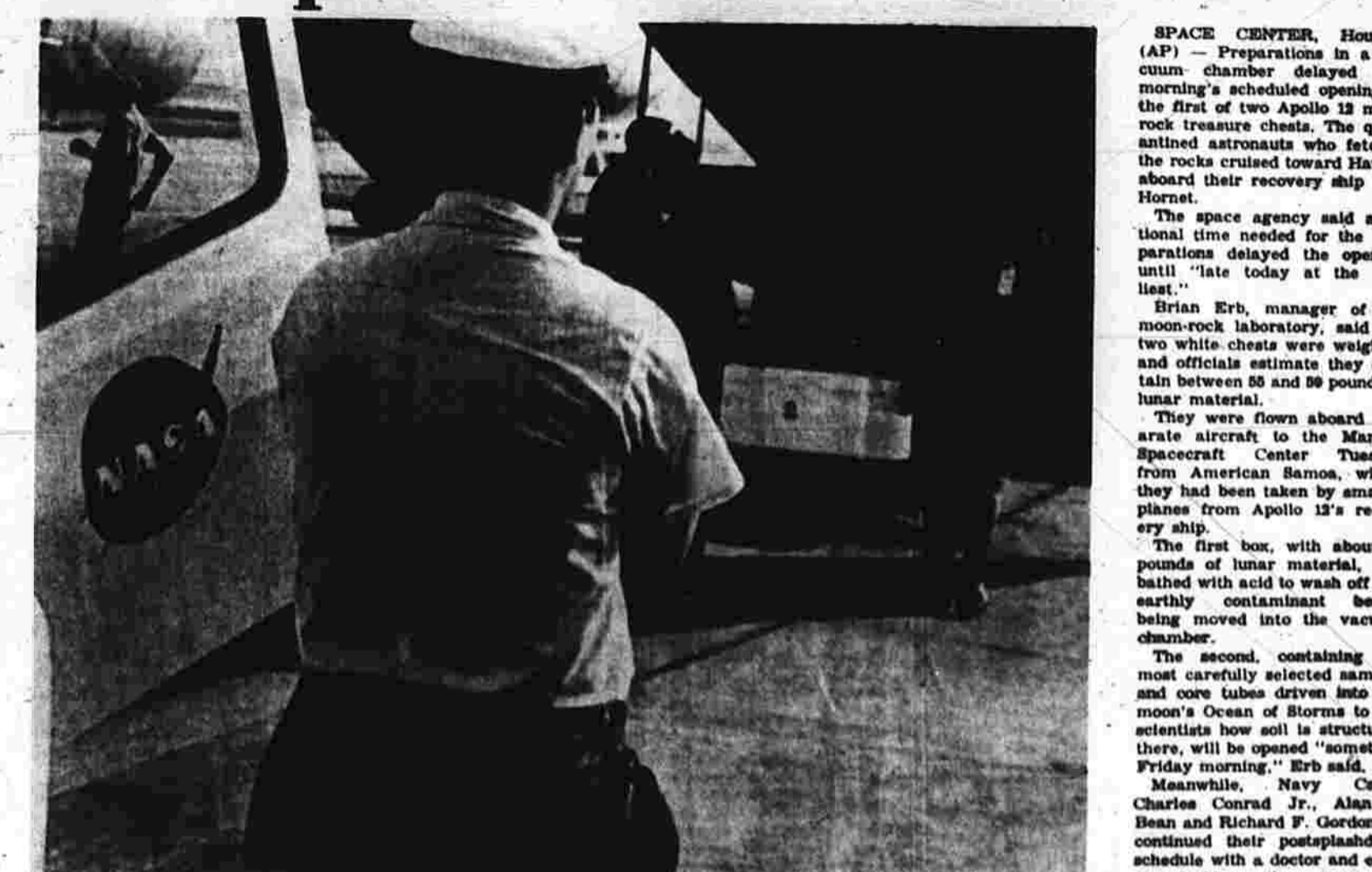

**Heavy Duty Dump Truck Requested by Selectmen**

The Board of Selectmen agreed to request the Board of Finance to approve the purchase of a new heavy duty dump truck. Once the contract is signed, the town meeting will be called. The action was taken on the recommendation of First Selectman Charles Thifault, who noted "the town has to start somewhere in updating the town equipment."

Road Superintendent William Sevik and Thifault feel that the truck purchase is necessary to enable the town to meet the demands of the winter. One of the three present trucks is considered in very poor condition. The town Republican selectmen, Robert Dumont and Charles Ramondo, did not attend a meeting of the selectmen and finance committee last week in which the condition of the town equipment was discussed. They were provided with reports of the equipment and the meeting last night. The new truck will likely cost between \$7,500 and \$8,000, which \$2,000 is available in the present budget. If approved by the town meeting the balance of the funds will have to be allocated in anticipation of next year's taxes.

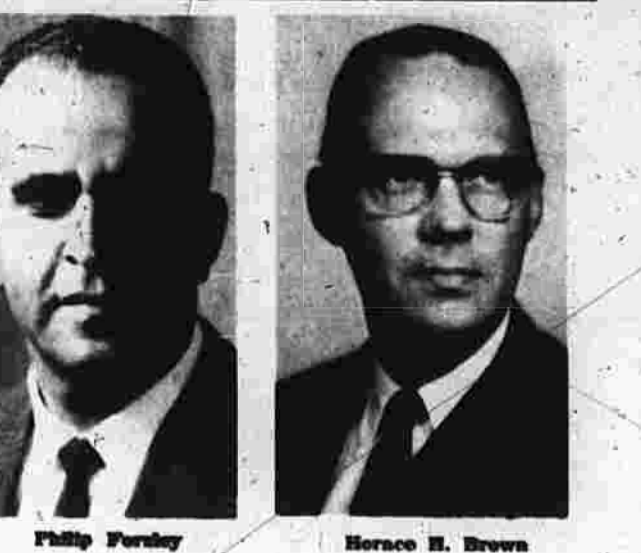

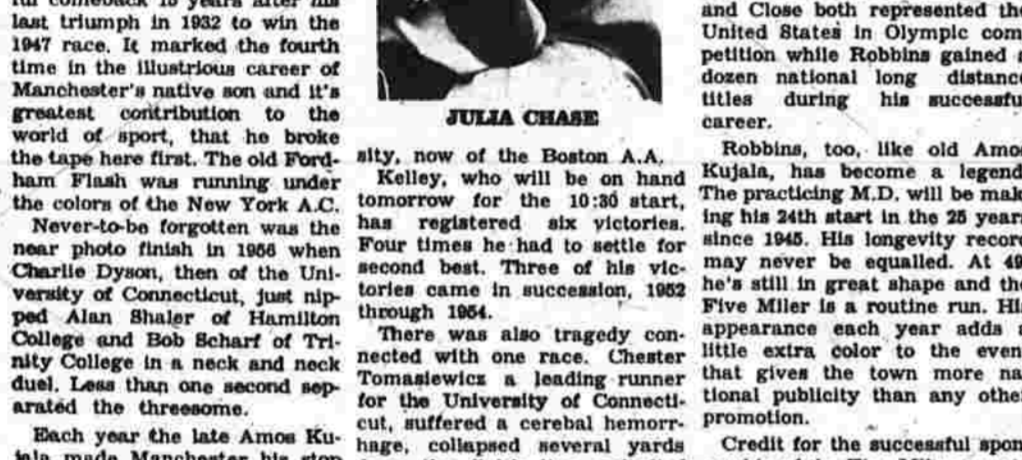
