



There are those, in short, who do not believe that any improvement in the affairs of men can ever come from having some silly fool be the first to volunteer to enter upon a higher standard of con-

man wisdom, we are putting our prac-

Rather they insist, the advocates c the normal course of events, that the virtuous can risk being virtuous only after they have eliminated the wicked, or put the wicked securely within their own power, or bound the wicked to some agreement the wicked cannot possibly

This is the normal system under which the world has lived until now.

It is also a system which, so far as the major and all important question of peace and war is concerned, has accomplished absolutely nothing.
