Possibly we did, as Dr. Ronan suggests, make a great mistake when we ripped our trolley systems up. And even if it is now too late to do anything about the trolley, perhaps we should take warning not to be in any hurry to let the passenger train disappear, as most of our railroads seem, at the moment, willing to have it disappear. We may have a desperate need and a lot of use for it any day now.

star could be made in a single Many scientists have studied the problem of relativistic speeds, that is, speeds approaching that of light. Conserv ative scientists indicate that, while it is theoretically possible to do so, the energy required to accelerate to the speed of light is far beyond our present or immediate - future capabilities. According to Dr. Edward Purcell, the problem of traveling to the stars is essentially one in volving energy. He shows that if we had advanced technologically to the point where we could use the nuclear energy of fusion (the process stars use in converting matter into energy) and if we tried to achieve a speed 99 per cent that of the velocity of light, then for every ton we proposed to launch on a round trip to a star we would have to start with about one million tons! This is about the weight of a bean compared to a small car. This ratio of initial mass to total is so staggering

As a TV Showman, Sullivan Is Alone

HOLLYWOOD (AP) - The Rolling Stones couldn't come to him, so Ed Sullivan came across the continent to tape a sequence with the British rock group for his Sunday night varlety show.

This may give testimony on why Sullivan remains the redoubtable, unquestioned daddy of them all in the television varlety field.

After 21 years, he is still going after the top acts—and getting

Sullivan's imperfections as an emcee have long been decried, and he has flourished while his detractors faded. None could deny his powers as a showman. as he demonstrated with his Rolling Stones coup.

At a rehearsal in CBS's Tele-

vision City, Bullivan gave no indication that he admired or un-derstood the Stones' thing. But in his dressing room afterward he demonstrated his knowledge of the Britishers' draw.

"An attraction like the Rolling Stones will bring us viewers that don't ordinarily tune the show in. 
