



The U.S. And The Near East

Just to have the Secretary of State of the United States making the statements he made on the Near East problem the other night is a good and encouraging thing in itself.

Whether or not the speech by Secretary William Rogers secures immediate approval from either side in the Near East conflict, or leads to any new and more hopeful diplomacy in the situation, it did set forth, with admirable balance and candor, the fundamental concepts which have to be grasped and accepted before there is any solution to the prob-

Sooner or later, the standards and the procedures and the guarantees Secretary Rogers set forth are those to which both sides in the immediate conflict must repair, if either of them wishes to hold any part of this earth in peace.

One of the first fine statements Secretary Rogers made concerns this country's view of its own potential role in the Near East problem.

"First," he said, "we know that nations not directly involved could not and governments involved. Peace rests with the parties to the conflict. The efforts of major powers can help; they can provide a catalyst; they can stimulate the parties to talk; they can encourage; they can help define a realistic framework or agreement; but an agreement among other powers cannot be a substitute for agreement among the parties themselves."

Secretary Rogers went on to other conclusions we regard as unassailable, even though, at the moment, nobody in the Near East is likely to admit that they are acceptable.

"We were clear," said the Secretary, "that the only framework for a negotiated settlement was one in accordance with the entire text of the U.N. Security Council resolution. That resolution was agreed upon after long and arduous negotiations; it provides the basis for a just and lasting peace."

Secretary Rogers summarized and balanced the difficulties in the way. "On the one hand," he said, "the Arab leaders fear that Israel is not in fact

prepared to withdraw from Arab territory occupied in the 1967 war. "On the other hand, Israeli leaders fear that the Arab states are not in fact prepared to live in peace with Israel." Back to the United States role again,

Secretary Rogers, said this: "We have friendly ties with both Arabs and Israelis. To call for Israeli withdrawal as envisaged in the U.N. resolution without achieving agreement on peace would be partisan toward the

"To call on the Arabs to accept peace without Israeli withdrawal would be partisan toward Israel. Therefore, our policy is to encourage the Arabs to accept a permanent peace based on a binding agreement and to urge the Israelis to withdraw from occupied territory when their territorial integrity is assured as envisaged by the Security Council Governor's eyes flashed at that point,

"We will not shrink from advocating necessary compromises," the Secretary said toward the conclusion of his speech 'even though they may and probably will be unpalatable to both sides."

Unpalatable" of course they are, at the present moment. Yet this honest statement of the United States position, presenting the first considered resentation of the views of the new adninistration at Washington, is in itself kely to be making both belligerents ealize that some day, somehow, they are going to have to find some mutual (ENGLAND) GUARDIAN

On Aug. 6, 1964, her husband, Lt. (j.g.) Everett Alvarez Jr., now 31, was reported in prison in North Viernam —the first American pilot captured in the Vietnam War. Alvarez, flying a Navy A-4E Skyhawk, had been shot down

on a "retaliatory" mission or-dered by former President Lyndon B.Johnson during the Gulf of Tonkin affair. He has been in a Hanoi prison since.
"Five years," said Tangee
Alvares, looking toward a nearyoung naval officer receiving his wings. "I never thought it would be this long."

Mrs. Alvarez, 29, lives in an apartment here, just off the town's Main Street, and has studied to become a beautician. They had been married four months — but were together only for two — when her husband left in the spring of 1964 for his second tour of duty in the Far East. "It never crossed my mind

that something like this could happen," she said. "If only I had thought of it before - maybe we could have said something to each other, talked it over before in case something happened, it might have been easier. But it never entered my mind — and I don't think it did his either." Even as her husband pre-

pares for his sixth Christmas (and a birthday, Dec. 23) in captivity, Tangee (a nickname - her real name is Hortencia) finds it difficult to realize how long it has been. After a reunion of their large family this summer, they decided to launch a petition campaign urging President Nixon to take "more positive action" toward securing the release of Alvarez and other U.S. prisoners.
