Judy Carne: 'I'm Vulnerable to People'

NEW YORK (AP) — The slip of a girl with moppet hairdo and waif-like face kicked off her black patent shoes, scrunched her legs up and under her torso, settled into the easy chair, and mused at how nice it was to be able to be "herself."
"I'm allowed to be English now — now that it's fashionable," said Judy Carne in a slightly husky, serious tone that seemed out of place for the pie-in-the-face, sock-it-to-me girl of TV's "Laugh-In."
"A few years ago it was like the plague when I went looking for a job. I'd be told, 'You're very cute, but you're English.' They didn't know what to do with me. They thought I was weird. They couldn't label me — not as a sex symbol nor as a Carol Burnett."
"They kept trying to change me, to make me wear padded bras, or to put on weight," she continued, as she laughed, tossed

ed the brown hair that hung shag style down the back of her neck, and shifted her 107 pound frame.
"But 'Laugh-In' changed all that — it allowed me to speak and act like me, to be nutsy as I often am."
Suddenly, as swiftly as she had begun, she stopped talking, and the hands, which had been in constant motion—twisting, turning and jabbing the air for emphasis, drifted into her lap. She toyed with her maxi-length black crepe skirt, tugged at her turtle neck olive green sweater, and then the hands again went into rapid motion.
"I'm a lot more serious, a lot sadder and a lot more vulnerable than I appear in a comedy role," Judy said. "I'm vulnerable to people. The whole success scene has been shattering to me."
As she reminisced about her early years — from her birth in 1939 when war broke out in Europe, to the early 1960s — when her father began to earn a good living, her brown eyes seemed softly sad.
"During those cold English winters when I put shillings in to the furnace meter to keep us warm, I used to think, 'Some day I'll have money and everything will be all right!'"
But when she suddenly had money it brought its own problems.
"I worked hard," Judy said, recalling the major roles she had in three unsuccessful television series ("Fair Exchange," "Baileys of Balboa," and "Love

on a Rooftop") before 'Laugh-In.' But when I first started earning a lot I felt guilty. I was an easy tap. I'd almost give it away to anyone with a sad enough story."
Judy blames a basic insecurity and lack of self esteem for this behavior, but says that during the last two years—largely thanks to analysts—she has undergone a "revolutionary" change.
"I'm learning to treasure myself now, and to live my life in total reality. It's very difficult in show business, where one is often forced to live in a fantasy world."
"If you're not careful you'll

be programmed: Do this, do that. Go to this interview, be at that opening. Be nice to him because he can help you, don't snub her or she'll hurt you."
"For me it's been a massive sorting out of people. I want to remove anything from my life that I call plastic."
Judy says she wants to live for "the now," neither haunted by the past nor fearful of the future; and that she wants to do what's right for herself, first as a human being, then as a performer.
Careerwise, she seeks variety: "I wouldn't want to get stuck in any one thing for too

long or to be typed. That's why I left 'Laugh-In.' She'd like to do more serious roles, like her starring part in a yet-to-be-released British film, "All the Right Noises," more musical comedy, like her two-week stint in November in "Cabaret" at Long Island's Westbury Theater, and a Broadway show, if the right one comes along.
"I move very fast," Judy explained in what has to be one of the year's best understatements. "I grow out of things quickly and crave for something new."
"I operate on an emotional level or I'd never have left a hit show for a brief appearance in Westbury."
As for the other side of her life—a home, husband and children, Judy is less sure.

'Why the Hell Doesn't He Quit?'

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — "I suppose I really should retire. After I've been 40-some years in this business, people are going to start saying, 'Why the hell doesn't he quit?'"

Bing Crosby was talking, not too seriously, I hope. His retirement would leave a large void in the ranks of the great performers. And there's really no need for it. Not when Bing can

amble through a television special with his famed nonchalance, collect the money and hustle back to his family in Northern California or to his hunting and fishing.

He was in town for one of his periodic appearances, this time costarring with Carol Burnett in "Together Again for the First Time," a special which will appear on NBC Dec. 18. Bing sings "White Christmas," natch, and capers with guest stars Juliet Prowse and Roy Clark.

Bing spoke rather wistfully about retirement between rehearsals for the special, then explained why it wasn't practical:

"I have some hefty commitments to charities every year. As long as I'm working, I can donate up to 30 per cent of my salaries to the charities. If I didn't work, I would have to take the money out of principal, and that's not such a good idea."

"So I do about 15 appearances a year. That includes American Sportsman, my golf tournament, the Hollywood Palace, Dean Martin, Hope, Carol Burnett, Jackie Gleason and some others."

You figure two-three days for each show, and that comes to a couple of months' work each year. That's about the way I like it.

"Movies? Not much interest there. Besides, if you want ex-
