





We can all conjure up, out of our collective nostalgia, the image of what it would be like.

It would have, shining over it all, the light of an instinctive, undiluted, assured faith in both the factual accuracy and the philosophical meaning of the original Christmas story.

It would be celebrated by people who believed much more than they disbeliev-

That old-fashioned innocent Christmas would be more moderate in its materialistic splendors. The gifts might be smaller. But they would mean more. Indeed, what was in the heart of the giver, and in that of the recipient, meeting, would be the great gift, for which some tangible object would be merely the token.

In that great bath of unquestioning belief in the supernatural, in that warm fusion of the human affections, there would be a momentary lifting and upon us as a society.

And the evils that men do, the prob-

lems men persist in keeping unsolvable, the misery that will not let men go, the inhumanity men still practice toward men, would all be tucked into a dark closet, out of sight and out of mind until conscience might bring them out for earnest New Year's resolutions.

There is no such old-fashloned innocence of Christmas available for us. We do not know how to reach for it. We do not go to our knees easily. We are not really sure what, if anything, we believe. We are doubting and cynical. We think we know too much.

The dark side of things will not retire to any closet. We come into the very heart of the holiday season questioning the quality of our own civilization, troubied by our own apparent addiction to violences of many degrees and many forms. baffled because we see no clear, easy promise that this is getting to be a better, more livable world for all the children of whatever order it was which

That bath in old-fashioned innocence is denied us. Perhaps, to our credit, we do not really

Perhaps, in our increasing sense of critical test for the whole human experiment, we are developing the desper wisdom which tells us that the recapture of some nostalgic past is not what we really

It may be that we are ready, at last, to stop trying to find refuge and comfort in old nostalgias, to stop trying to sweep our own darker responsibilities out of holiday sight, to stop trying to pretend we are somehow better than we act, to stop trying to spend our way into happiness, and to begin, even in holiday season, facing directly up to ourselves, up to the world as we have made it so far, and into the future which asks and demands that we do so much better than we have ever done before.

Even our most splendid achievements, when averaged in with our simple, elemental failures, leave us in need of modesty. The pinnacles we have reached, when they give view of what we have left undone far down below, preach more humility than pride. We have accomplished so much that is splendid and

giorious and yet non-essential; we need to begin addressing ourselves to the things that really matter.

.The things that really matter are what kind of people we think we are and what kind of people we intend to become. There are no customs which can disguise the test and no holidays which can tuck the continuing answers even temporarily away out of sight.

The beginning of real courage, the door to any real chance of change, is honesty, and honesty which disdains consensus alibis and poultice comfort, and which says to itself and to its God this is where we are, no farther along than this, but this is where we now begin, this is where we now begin.

This is where we might now begin, each in our own place in the family of mankind, in a world still to be made.

EDITOR'S NOTE—New York-ers were shocked to learn last week of the death of a 12-yearold boy from an overdose of heroin. But it was not an isolated case. Dope addiction among teen-agers is spreading—in the slums and affluent suburbs—at drug users themselves. The problem was spotlighted last week when Walter Vanderfrightening rate.
