The Test Civilization Flunked seemed likely to prove itself the brightest star in the new cluster of independent native nations in Africa.

Now, at the start of the Seventies, Nigeria seems to be standing toward the end of a bloody and savage civil war in which millions of innocent civilians may have been victims. And plous people everywhere are praying that the Nigerian central government will not use its military victory in this civil war, in an effort to kill off all future possibility of similar rebellion by putting to the sword all the potential leadership of the defeated Ibo tribe.

What has been happening in Nigeria hasn't fallen too clearly within the reach of United Nations law. Neither, for that matter, did the rebellion of Katanga Province in the Congo, nor the civil war on Cyprus. But in the Congo the United Nations itself somehow wound up putting troops in the field to help the central government of the Congo to put down the rebellion and keep the new African state territorially intact, and in Cyprus the United Nations stepped in to put its police forces in between the Greek and Turkish Cypriots and thus enforce a truce upon them.

What has to be said, then, is not so much that the situation in Nigeria lay outside the United Nations jurisdiction, being a civil war, but that no one worked very hard to bring United Nations jurisdiction to it.

For this there could be two explanations. The United Nations itself was running out of interference energy and muscle. More important, however, was a change in the attitude of the great powers. They had agreed to let the United Nations go into the Congo in order to avoid a direct power showdown among themselves. In Nigeria, however, they saw their own involvement as less direct, and therefore less risky. The actual result showed both Russia and Britain supplying and supporting the federal government, France trying to supply and support the Biafran rebellion, and the United States standing uneasily on the sidelines, bemourning massacre and starvation, but unwilling to interfere in this particular civil war.

The result has now been that, instead of having any outside civilizing influence or any concept of international law against killing enter the situation, the civil war in Nigeria has been allowed to progress to a decision by military victory and by slaughter, the way the American Civil War was decided, the way some people think we ought to be allowed to decide the war in Vietnam, the only way, some people sincerely believe, really to settle such tormented

It is difficult to accept, as civilized, what has been, in actuality, this supposedly civilized world's tolerance of battle to the death in Nigeria. It is impossible to assert that this same outside world, by devoting some conscientious attention to the possibility of has done the slightest thing to clear its conscience of its long inaction during the period when it has been aware of mass atrocity in Nigeria. It would be bootless hypocrisy to try to claim that any world can progress away from the jungle when it practices such a mass indifference to what still goes on back in the jungle.

In every man, woman and child there is one life, which cannot be different in its value, its sacredness, or its humane importance. The record of this civilized world as a whole or in any

It is certainly very nice of us all to hope that the Nigerians, having won their victory in the jungle, will suddenly reach for the laws of civilized mercy, and case our civilized consciences of the burden they bear because we neither cared nor act-
