eral John Mitchell has, this time, done his homework thoroughly, and that Federal Judge G. Harrold Carswell of Tallahassee, Fla., is safe, both in his legal and his private life, from any snooping on the part of those who suspect they may not like the way he votes if he gots on the Supreme Court. One assumes, second, that the Senate

has run out of the unusual zeal it exhibited with regard to the nomination of Judge Clement Haynsworth. The Senate, in that instance, was taking its first opportunity to apply to a Nixon appointee the same rigorous standards the Nixon administration had applied to President Johnson's nomination of Justice Abe Fortas to be Chief Justice. There was just enough vulnerability and evasion mixed in Judge Haynsworth, helped by the crudities with which the White House and its agents attempted to power the nomination through, to persuade key Republican members of the Senate they had to vote against him. The Senate filled with any particular desire to make

The new nominee having been more ing relaxed, there would seem no possible ground for serious opposition to the right of the President in the White House to name a Southern conservative to the Supreme Court. Nixon's right to make this kind of appointment could certainly never be construed to be anything less than President Johnson's right to name a liberal from either South or North. One of the things successful Presidential candidates have a right to do is to use their appointment power to shape the philosophy with which other branches of the government are going to be conducted and administered, and President Nixon never made any secret of his personal inclinations with regard to the

Supreme Court. It also has to be submitted that, disappointing as it may seem to some, this nation could, if it had to, survive another period of conservative and strict constructionism on the Supreme Court just as it has survived periods of liberal expansion of the Court's concernh and pre-

And, for that matter, the way some of these appointees evolve and behave, Justice Carswell may be, by 1980, the Hugo Black of his Court.

### City Managers And Tax Rates

Like his distinguished predecessor, the City Manager of Hartford has a talent for doing the opposite of what city managers are popularly supposed to do. It is a talent for recommending sensational increases in the Hartford city budget and the Hartford tax rate. This year, City Manager Freedman, who served a kind of apprenticeship in Manchester, has managed to stagger his way toward the City Council under the burden of a budget which asks that Hart-

ford increase its tax rate by 12.8 mills up to a total tax rate of 77.7 mills. The taxpayers of Hartford won't have to pay that much of an increase. Some cautious, cowardly, unbusinesslike oliticians, who have to run and get elected to the offices they hold, will see

Meanwhile, however, the people of Hartford, who originally went to the city nanager form of government because they realized it was high time somebody halted their city short of bankruptcy, have experienced, once again, the spectacle of a city manager coming in with recommendations for ever higher apending and ever higher tax rate.





tended shooting periods. Nowadays it's almost impossible to film a major musical for less than \$5 million, and many have cost \$10 million and more. Another major factor is the lack of receptivity overseas. The English and the Japanese still like American musicals, but the Germans. French and Italians do not. And in many other parts of the world where the musical tradition is un-

known, chances of success for a tunefilm are scant. The trend away from the musical has been accentuated during the past year. Costly flops have depressed the fortunes of film companies: "Doctor Dolittle" and "Star!" at 20th Century-Fox; "Sweet Charity" at Universal. Two new releases are being eyed nervously: 'Goodbye, Mr. Chips" by MGM and "Paint Your Wagon" by Paramount. Both were very ex-

pensive and received mixed re-Fox now has "Hello Dolly" in release, but it will be a long time before the film shows a profit. The cost: \$20 million. And Paramount has about \$30 million tied up in two more musicals, "Darling Lily" (Julie An drews, Rock Hudson) and "On a-Clear Day You Can See Forever!" (Barbra Streisand, Yves

On the credit side of the ledger, Columbia has enjoyed remarkable success with its two 1968 releases. Variety's chart of the 20-24 most important U.S. markets shows that "Funny Girl" has grossed \$15.5 million "Oliver!" almost \$10 million. Largely because of these two films, Columbia was one of the few companies to show a profit last year. Aside from "Fiddler" and

"Bedknob." there are a few other musical projects that might materialize. United Artists owns the rights to "Man of La Man cha" and it may be produced in 1971. LOS ANGELES (AP) - A udge denied Tuesday motions or dismissal of murder and con spiracy charges against Linda Kasabian, one of six persons accused in the killings of actress Sharon Tate and six others. He also declined to set bail for her. An attorney for the 20-yearold pregnant blonde first asked dismissal of counts involving

the killings last Aug. 10 of Mr and Mrs. Leno LaBianca, market owners, on grounds of insufficient evidence. Then the attorney, Gary Fleischman, asked dismissal of all counts, saying the grand jury that returned the murder onspiracy indictments was not representative of the community as a whole, and that it was influenced by what he

calledan "inundation" of pub-Superior Court Judge Malcom M. Lucas ordered that Mrs. Kasabian remain in custody with trial date to be set Feb

that all of those charged were members of a band of nomadic hippie types, and that some killed Miss Tate and four visitors to her home Aug. 9 and then killed the La Biancas the next night to show they hadn't lost their nerve.

Mrs. Kasabian's attorney con-ceded there was sufficient evidence to hold his client for trial in the Tate case, but argued that although she accompanied others to the LaBianca home she ran away and was not involved in the slayings. Fleischman said grand jury testimony indicated that Mrs. Kasabian's only direct connection was that she disposed of a wallet belonging to one of the LaBiancas, apparently on direction from a co-defendant, He said Mrs. Kasabian had no choice but to go along to the LaBianca home "unless she wanted her throat cut," Fleischman said that there i no evidence that Mrs. Kasabian "did anything to harm anyone or went inside either house' when the slayings occurred. The judge, however, ruled there was sufficient evidence to hold her for trial, noting that "she may have left (the Tatscene) but she rejoined other defendants." The judge added that testimony indicated Mrs. Kasabian disposed of bloody

clothing, knives and a gun by throwing them into a canyon. Fleischman said he had been told by the prosecution his client was the only one for whom the death penalty would not be sought, one of the prosecutors said no decision has been made yet on this point.

AP Special Correspondent Nigeria's 30-month nightmare of civil war was a warning symptom of what ails the immense continent of Africa.

Lessons for all nations involved, big and small, powerful and weak, are fairly obvious. But nations have an uninspiring record of learning from such lessons, and the outlook for the African continent, as of now, re-

Civil and guerrilla war, political instability, poverty, hunger. disease, backwardness, population explosion, division, cions-you name it, Africa has it. To complicate all this, its resources and geography make it an arena of global contest. It all threatens to produce, some day, a continental nervous breakdown with repercussions for the rest of the world.

Even after World War II there were only four independent nations in the whole continent South Africa, Liberia, Egypt and Ethiopia. Then what British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan called "the wind of change" blew the continent abruptly into the 20th century, unready and unable to cope. The avalanche of independence began when Ghana, the former British Ivory Coast, won freedom in 1957. France under Charles de Gaulle began liquidating its emrire in 1958. In the 1960s, slone 31 new nations were born from the womb of colonial-

What had been colonial boundaries were demanded by new leaders as their own, regardless of racial, cultural, religious, tribal and other differences Now, in a continent of close to 350 million people there are 40odd states, some far too small
