





Africa's Chance At 'Most Civilized' There are students of the African problem who consider the defeat of Biafran secessionism just as healthy and necessary to the sane future of the Dark Continent as was the previous defeat of the separatist movement by Katanga

In both instances, they say, rebellion against a central government threatened to set up a return to tribalism as the keynote to Africa's future.

And they regard any such return to tribalism as the one thing that must not be permitted, no matter how sentimental an appeal some of the secessionists may develop, and no matter, apparently, how severe the measures required to defeat them.

These theorists actually defend, for Africa, a system of frontiers which is not based on tribal or even nationalistic factors such as similarity of language or ethnic heritage.

To the contrary, they think it is healthy that tribes may be split up among several nationalistic sovereignties. And they find it a hopeful sign that

will know that we have a truly civilized world, if we ever do. One mark will be that nationalistic boundaries have been reduced so low we all feel that we are citizens of the world, as free within one boundary as another. It would be something of a miracle if the Africans, partly because colonialism gave them boundaries which are unreasonable from to tribalism or an advance into lusty nationalisms, and begin feeling and behaving, in this century, like citizens of Africa, and of the world.
