The recent exchange of critical letters etween State Rep. James S. Connery of Shelton and State Tax Commissioner John L. Sullivan stems from a problem that troubles many states.



At a tunar altitude of about. 5,600 miles the orbital period of these satellites would be about 24 hours which means they will move slowly across the lunar sky. It is estimated that 12 phased satellites could vield re-

liable global-lunar communications coverage. Because of the phenomenal success of synchronous or stationary communications satellites around the earth, some informed observers may wonder why a synchronous lunar orbit at an altitude of 55,000 miles with a period of 27.3 days is not contemplated. Scientists indicate that at 55,000 miles the earth's gravitational field is dominant and a satellite could not remain in lunar orbit unless continuous thrust were used. As continuous thrust is impractical for current chemical propulsion systems, a lunar synchronous orbit is ruled out. Perhaps in time, when ion
