### Did We Learn Nothing?

Certain advice given by Senator Jacob Javits of New York to the leaders of Japanese business the other day has a familiar sound, although we cannot recall its specific antecedents.

It sounded as if we had gone through Japanese expansion before World War II and then through World War II and then through these two decades of such close Japanese-American friendship only to come out again somewhere quite near where we were when we were first becoming aware of modern Japan -concerned with its economic competition

with ourselves: What Senator Javits said to these leaders of Japan's business was that they had better think hard about the trade imbalance between our two countries which results from the fact that Japan sells more to us than Japan lets itself buy from us. The background for his speech was the fact that Washington has been trying to get Japan to drop its own protectionist barriers against our investment of American capital in time it has been asking Japan to set

voluntary quotas on its own textile exports to the United States. Japan, in other words, has got the drop on us, tradewise speaking, pretty much the same way it was beginning to trouble us once before. Then it became our policy to close our doors, and when we did Japan began looking for a coprosperity sphere of its own in its own

hemisphere, which turned out to be something we couldn't tolerate either. This apparent recurrence of a familiar situation and issue between the United States and Japan prompts two questions. The first is the question of how the United States behaves when it finds it has the economic drop on some other nation. Does it then practice, itself, the wisdom Senator Javits and our State

Department recommend to Japan? Does any nation really have such wisdom and restraint? The second question is this. If Japan proves unable to restrain itself, is it then automatically going to be a situa-

tion in which the United States turns increasingly protectionist in its answer to Japan, all without anybody trying to remind us of all the soulful wisdom we had accumulated for making a fine and better new world, back in 1945, just after we had sacrificed so much and fought so hard to have a chance to practice sanity?

Way back then there were a number of things which seemed almost within reach, so compelling was the simple common sense argument for them. Among them was, of course, a world law against military war, to be enforced by a United Nations police force, and a free trade system which would guarantee against economic war by abolishing its nationalistic weapons.

Was there nothing gained from World War II except the dubious privilege of temporarily switching allies after it?

Or the Court could have indulged itself in the fancy that old Senator Bacon himself, if he were alive and giving a public park today, would have chosen o make an unrestricted gift, wherefore it would be a courtesy to the old gentleman for the Court to rewrite his will to accommodate and reflect his potential broadening of mind.

The Court did none of these advance ed, enlightened things, although it might have been better social and public policy What the Court did was decide that,

for once, a will is a will, even if it does not happen to please perpetuity. For once at least it has been ruled that a man may leave his money the way he wants to leave it. We admire the principle even while we deplore the

### The One Day Work Week?

Among the increasing number of scientific experimenters who refuse to take anything for granted there is a French speleologist who has apparently succeeded in conning people into living a 48 hour

instead of a 24 hour day. He did it by putting them down in a cave over a period of months, isolating them, depriving them of all methods of telling time, and then using his control of their artificial lighting to influence

The 48 hour day man, the experiment discovered, needs only 12 hours for sleep, which leaves 36 hours a day free for work and play. Without any time clues to make him feel tired, or sleepy, ment as any of us surface livers achieve with our own allocation of the hours of our 24 hour day. If we were to succeed in orienting all humanity to the 48 hour day, we might make it that much easier for travelers in jets and in space to make those physiological adjustments to changing time schedules.

But the truly epochal possibility which may lie just ahead in such experimentation may be something no one has men-



### How To Stop Stair Squeak

By ANDY LANG AP Newsfeatures

When either you or your stairway begins to creak here and there, the cause generally is the same: old age. It's a lot easier, though, to eliminate the stairway creaks than those that beset you. You need not be a carpenter nor a andyman nor even an experienced do-it-yourselfer. All that is necessary is that you be able to tell the difference between two simple methods of stairway construction-and, if you don't, the following explanation, hope fully, will enable you to make that distinction. To keep the record straight the horizontal part of a step-

the part you step on-is called a tread. The vertical board at the back is called a riser. There are two basic ways in which a tread is attached to a riser; the tread rests upon the riser and is simply nailed into place or the two are held together with a tongue and groove. In the latter case, a tongue on the top edge of the riser fits into a groove cut in the under edge of

You can tell at a glance which method is used if you look at the joint. But you can't see the joint in most cases. So you get down on your knees and look under the part of the tread that overhangs the riser. You'll see that the joint is covered by a thin piece of moulding, which can be easily pried off. Now, using a flashlight if necessary, examine the joint and make your deter mination. Don't let the idea scare you. Even if you have never done any woodworking in your life, you'll be able to decide almost instantly.

The reason for all this is that the method of construction deermines the method of repair. If the tread and riser are nailed together, have someone stand on the tread, which will force it against the riser. You then hammer two 2-inch nails through the tread into the riser, placing them about an inch apart and slanting them so that the points are close to each other when they have been driven in. In other words, when the nails are in place, they will form a V inside the wood. Nails driven in this manner are less likely to work loose. And you'll have even more insurance against later trouble if you use threaded nails. Two sets of nails through each tread of a squeaky step should do the trick. Drive the nails slightly below the surface with a nail set, fill the holes with putty and, when it has hardened, sand smooth. Replace the moulding and the job is

When your original examina tion disclosed a tongue-andare required. The squeaking can be eliminated by driving thin wooden wedges between the tongue and the groove until the play between them has disappeared. If you have no wedges on hand, but you do have an old shingle, cut it to the proper size and drive it into place, then replace the moulding. In this second method of repair, you do not need the assistance of another person.





The plane is brown and black, while the building is light brown against a pale blue sky. Atop the stamp is the inscription "50th Anniversary of First Aeroplane Flight England-Australia 1919-1969." At the bottom of the stamp, the word Pakistan appears in English, Urdu and Bengali.

The three latest stamps from the Federal Republic of Germany (West Germany) pay tribute to a trio of famous men-Pope John XXIII, Alexander von Humboldt (father of modern geography) and Mahatma Gandhi, reports the World Wide Philatelic Agency.
