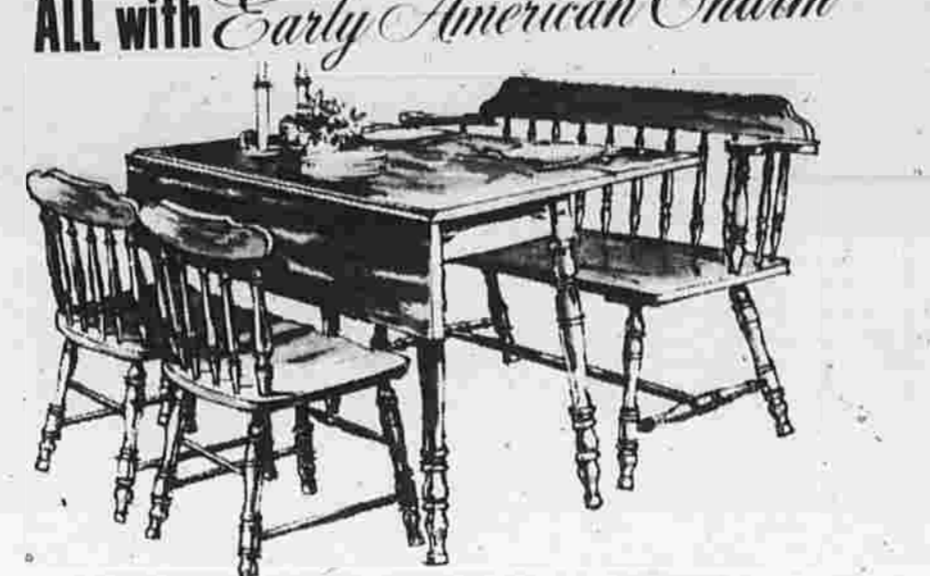

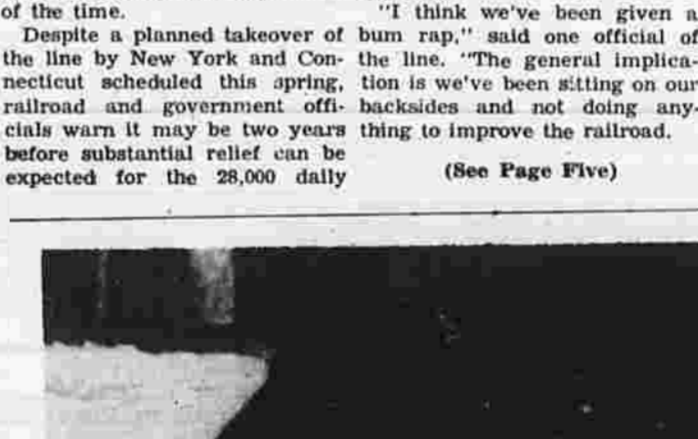

Vanessa Redgrave on TV

'Have I Been Irresponsible?'

NBC News' "First Tuesday" will explore the life style of actress Vanessa Redgrave in next Tuesday's edition (9-11 p.m.)

Sander Vanocur, the NBC News correspondent who is the program's anchorman, interviewed Miss Redgrave in her home in London. There she spoke forthrightly on a variety of subjects including her family, acting, morality, and her social and political views. Two of her young children, Carlo and Natasha, appear with her in the program.

Miss Redgrave was recently named leading actress of 1959 in the fourth annual poll of the National Society of Film Critics. This was for her characterization of Isadora Duncan in the biographical drama "The Loves of Isadora." Earlier, she won an Academy Award nomination for the performance.

Miss Redgrave's outspoken views on all kinds of subjects have, in the words of one writer, "threatened to outdazzle her career."

Here are some of the things she told Mr. Vanocur:

"I got a letter the other day from a woman in Canada and she said, 'Miss Redgrave, I and a whole lot of my friends used to support you and think you were so wonderful, there was a real chance that you might be one of the young people setting an example. Now, not only have you acted that depraved

so had a child out of wedlock. But worst of all, I remember your saying once that people shouldn't have more than two children, and here you are with three, and one from out of wedlock,' and she was very uptight because I wasn't what she'd hoped I could be.

"I very much wanted to have Franco's baby. That was very simple, really. I had some worries after, thinking, well, are people right. Have I been irresponsible? Or is it going to suffer but I'm all right — that kind of thing."

(Does she believe in marriage as an institution?)

"Well, I don't like talking about things like that. I mean, it's meaningless. That's not my bag... Society is very nasty about unmarried mothers. Indirectly. Oddly enough, it isn't through the people directly concerned. It isn't in the hospitals

and midwives. They were marvelous, you know. It's the people who give jobs and the people who have rooms and won't give them to unmarried mothers. It's people who won't say, 'Well I'll hold your baby for an hour while you go off and do it.' And that isn't my case, you know, because obviously I'm fine."

"The thing about the general public, if they're put off by the things I do, if they don't agree, they won't come and see me. I get a lot of letters saying, 'Your father should be really ashamed. I always admired your father, but you two sex maniacs, Lynn and Vanessa, I'll never see Sir Michael's films again.'"

"I think I am an extremely conservative sort of a person that suddenly saw that there

Merv Griffin Over the Crisis

WASHINGTON — The crisis for "The Merv Griffin Show" (CBS) has passed and the series will continue. The show has had a difficult first six months on the network and only recently has it picked up better ratings.

Part of the improvement stems from a CBS-TV decision to have Griffin spend more time on the West Coast where the show is more accessible to the biggest performers in motion pictures and television.

The second factor in better ratings is the low appeal of "The Dick Cavett Show" on ABC-TV. Cavett replaced Joey Bishop recently and instead of attracting more viewers has gotten fewer.

Johnny Carson's "Tonight" series is still well ahead of both his network competitors. The most recent report from the A. C. Nielsen Co. gives Carson a rating of 8.8. Griffin is in second place with 4.6 of all TV homes and Cavett is last with a 2.8.

To the television industry a more useful comparison is found in what are called "share of the audience" figures. Of the persons watching TV at a particular time (11:30 p.m. to 1 a.m. EST), what choices are being made? The answer here is 37 per cent; Griffin is getting 22 per cent, and Cavett 11 per cent. (The other 30 per cent are watching old movies or whatever non-network stations are offering.)

The first sign of trouble for

Merv Griffin came when managers of affiliated stations began asking if his programs could be shown the following afternoon. Griffin's success had been with a show that was sold to individual stations and scheduled most often during the afternoon. Griffin's contract requires that he approve the shift. He apparently agreed.

Meanwhile, as viewing resumed normal patterns following the holiday, Griffin's ratings began to improve. Also, during this period, Griffin's old employers at Group W (Westinghouse Broadcasting) began complaining about plans for stations to carry Griffin in the daytime.

Group W has replaced Griffin's old show with "The David Frost Show" and many stations across the nation schedule Frost in the afternoon.

Bob Hope Top Rated

NEW YORK (AP) — Bob Hope's Christmas show on NBC Jan. 15 was seen in almost 28-million homes which was, according to the network's audience research department, the largest audience in TV history for one program shown on a single network. Second on the list was the final episode of ABC's "The Fugitive" in the summer of 1967.

The 90-minute special of course topped the national Nielsen ratings list for the week ending Jan. 18. The "Dean Martin Show" was second and "Mayberry R.F.D." was third. NBC came out ahead in average audiences during the period with a rating of 23.4, followed by CBS with 21.5, and ABC, 15.5.
