





The Ultimate In Deficits The state of Connecticut got a bargain the other day.

But it was a bargain in a bad thing. Because it happened to be selling \$75 million in state bonds at a moment when the bond market was favorable, the state of Connecticut will be paying years, for the use of that \$75 million. If the bond market hadn't happened terest charge might have amounted to 75 per cent of the original cost of the state expenditures involved.

As it is, the state is scheduled to spend \$46.70 to hire every \$75 it borrows. This may, comparatively speaking, be rated a bargain.

From any sound fiscal point of view, it can only be labeled a disaster.

The more the state does this, the nore the state digs itself deeper into the financial hole from which it will never be able to pay cash for any of its capital expenditures. The more the state borrows, the more it has to borrow. Eventually, the only way the state knows how to function is to pay at least one and one half times for everything it

This keeps increasing the burden on the state's taxpayers while, at the same ime, it keeps building recurrent state

Eventually the state gets so deeply into such a deficit system that it is much too late to do anything about it.

But one can still figure out what the difference might have been, could the state ever have made some sincere efort to pay more and bond less as it

What the state pays out in interest alone in any modern biennium would have constituted, all by itself, a most generous state budget in other years. If the state were free to spend, now, on its capital improvements, the amount of cash it now has to spend for interest on capital improvements borrowed for, it could move swiftly to meet its needs and also be free of any new mounting

The only good solution to the governmental debt problem is, of course, never to begin the borrowing in the first place. Eventually, governments find themselves constrained to try to begin an attack on the problem through a program of gradual reduction of their bonded indebtedness. This is usually defeated through the pressure of departments, politicians, and people who want services and facilities now, not tomorrow, and through credit, if it takes credit to get them now, rather than by cash, which might never be at hand.

After the financial position in which the state found itself during the last session of the General Assembly, there was supposed to be some effort to restrain the use of new bond issues.

Yet the state has already issued so many bonds in this new fiscal period as to find itself running a deficit in its appropriation for interest on bond is-

That is about as unsound as any government can get, to be running a defielt in its fund for financing its deficits.

Disunited Students Of The World At the beginning of the second term

of the academic year the universities and the colleges look remarkably quiet, judged by the standards of the past couple of years. This is true, too, of the United States, where the dynamics of student protest were first developed and later 'Who Killed the Student Revolution?" It is written from Berkeley as if the death of the student revolution can be taken as an established fact. On the cover of 'Encounter" the question is put in a different form: "Who killed the student movement?" Now that is not the same question by any means. Probably the student revolution in its extreme American campus manifestations is dead. The attempt to turn the university into launching pad for a revolution directed against society itself has fizzled out. It was an indulgence in romantic fantasy that was never able to put down any real roots, and now that President Nixon has made peace in Vietnam respectable

he has disarmed the student Left of its most potent campaigning weapon. The student revolution in Britain made even less solid headway, and though the London School of Economics was taken over for a while as a testing ground for the tactics of confrontation, with some imitators elsewhere, the echoes of these heroics are now fading into history. But who would dare to say that the student movement is dead? The re volution, such as it was, drew on an unepresentative minority for its leadership (as revolutions do), but it played a part in a shakeup of academic life which was more solidly based in the student move-

ment and was addressed to true student interests rather than to extraneous ideo-Whether or not it deserves to be called a revolution, university life has been transformed in the past few years by a notable change in attitudes. We have seen the death of paternalism. Student pressure for a greater say in the way their coilege life is run has been largely met. Participation may have lost some of its fashionable appeal, but in the universities it has been almost everywhere conceded. That is the English way to avoid a revolution - by reform. In any event, the paternalist traditions could hardly survive the changing of the age

of majority to 18. It is a hard world for revolutionaries when (give or take a point or two) we are all adult and equal. One reason for the failure of the American student revolution was its divorce from real student interests. Another was its resort to violence, often in extreme forms, which in the end almost wholly alienated the academic staff as well as public opinion at large. In Britain there has been less seen of violence for its own sake, and a greater concern for the practical issues of student life. Hence the academic staff remain on the whole sympathetic to quite radical student claims, and the student organisations, notably the NUS, have ended to concentrate on securing reforms of practical value. This is not to onciled to mere materialistic pragmaism. The idealism remains. And the student movement, in the broadest sense, will be both the barometer and the catalysts of the social attitudes of the years







Bankers Knowingly Helped Swindle U.S. Government

eral authorities have evidence that two Swiss bankers-fully aware that they were accomplices in a fraud-supplied hundreds of false documents from a string of shadow companies which became the backbone of a multimillion-dollar swindle of the U.S. government. With the aid of the bankers the evidence shows, a group of Americans was able to channel more than \$4 million into secret Swiss bank accounts before the fraud was exposed and stopped. The Americans, who pleaded guilty of their parts in the fraud today in U.S. District Court

They are Francis N. Rosenbaum, a prominent Washington attorney; Andrew L. Stone, a wealthy St. Louis businessman Evelyn Price of St. Louis, Stone's executive secretary Robert B. Bregman, president of Bregman Electronics, Inc., of New York; the Chromcraft Corp., of St. Louis and Alsco Inc., of Akron, Ohio. The two Swiss bankers were named as co-conspirators but not defendants in the case. The fraud has received much publicity but the evidence de-

The case, officials said, is just one example of the hundreds of frauds and tax evasions believed carried out each year with the knowledge and aid of discreet foreign bankers. Simplified, the case worked this way: Stone and Rosenbaum were officers of a company which was the prime contractor on millions of dollars in Navy defense business.

They set up two dummy com panies in the United States and fraudulently represented them as subcontractors on the Navy work. The Swiss bankers supplied those subcontractors with raudulent bills from other dum my European firms for materials which were never ordered or shipped. The dummy subconractors then "sold" the non-existent material to the prime contractor who charged the Navy

In paying off the phoney Swiss bills. Stone and Rosenbaum

Each count carried a maximum penalty of five years in prison and \$10,960 in fines.
