Brown Needles Jews to Make Mideast Peace

LONDON (AP) — Plainspoken George Brown was back on Britain's front pages yesterday with the blunt observation that "every Englishman will fight to the last Fremlinian; every Jew will fight to the last Egyptian, and every western Jew will fight to the last Israeli."

"That's an insult!" shouted members of Brown's audience at a meeting Wednesday night at the Friends of Israel. "That's an insult!" roared back Britain's unapologetic former foreign secretary.

Brown added that he spoke the truth wherever he went and not anyone liked it. Brown was invited to speak because he made a survey tour of the Middle East last month, a tour during which he (1) had hot words with an Israeli leader and Britain's ambassador to Israel at a dinner party given by Foreign Minister Abba Eban; (2) greeted Israeli Premier Golda Meir, who is 16 years his senior, with the words, "Hello, sister;" and (3) upbraided an Israeli airport inspector he thought was a man.

Brown told the Friends of Israel that Mrs. Meir is a "tough politician—I love her very much indeed," and that he also is very fond of President Gamal Abdel Nasser of Egypt. "If you want peace," he said, "you have to like both of the peoples. The Jews are wrong to attack Nasser. I think he is an honest man."

"I think the Israelis know they need Nasser. And I think Nasser knows that he needs Hussein," referring to King Hussein of Jordan. "For heaven's sake," he told British Jews, "say to Israel, 'Try at this moment get a cease-fire and a basis for talks. But don't believe that just going on bombing is going to get you anywhere.'"

"I wouldn't know how many wars the Arabs can afford to lose... But I do know that Israel can only lose one. If the Arabs ever get clever enough to put their air force into the air first, how many Israeli cities will be destroyed?"

Munich Digs to Avert Drowning in Traffic

MUNICH, Germany (AP) — An important event in the 1972 Olympics will be an 11-minute run from downtown Munich to the Olympic site 4.2 miles away. It will be via a new subway which this century-old Bavarian city is building to keep from being slowly strangled by street traffic.

A test strip is already being used and hundreds of workers are toiling to complete the section leading to the Olympics. The series is sponsored jointly by George Sarkosky, a spokesman for the subway authority, says to open late next year, will run through the university district and to Kiefertgarten in the north.

Just past the university area, is building a 2 1/2-mile tunnel through the center of Munich to connect the main and east stations. The railway and the subway will cross and provide connections at Marienplatz under north Munich's 100-year-old City Hall and near such landmarks as the Munich Hofbräuhaus and the Marienplatz station, which will contain the electrical brains of the subway system, a 100-foot excavation.

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Episcopal Church Council Reports Need to Cut Budget

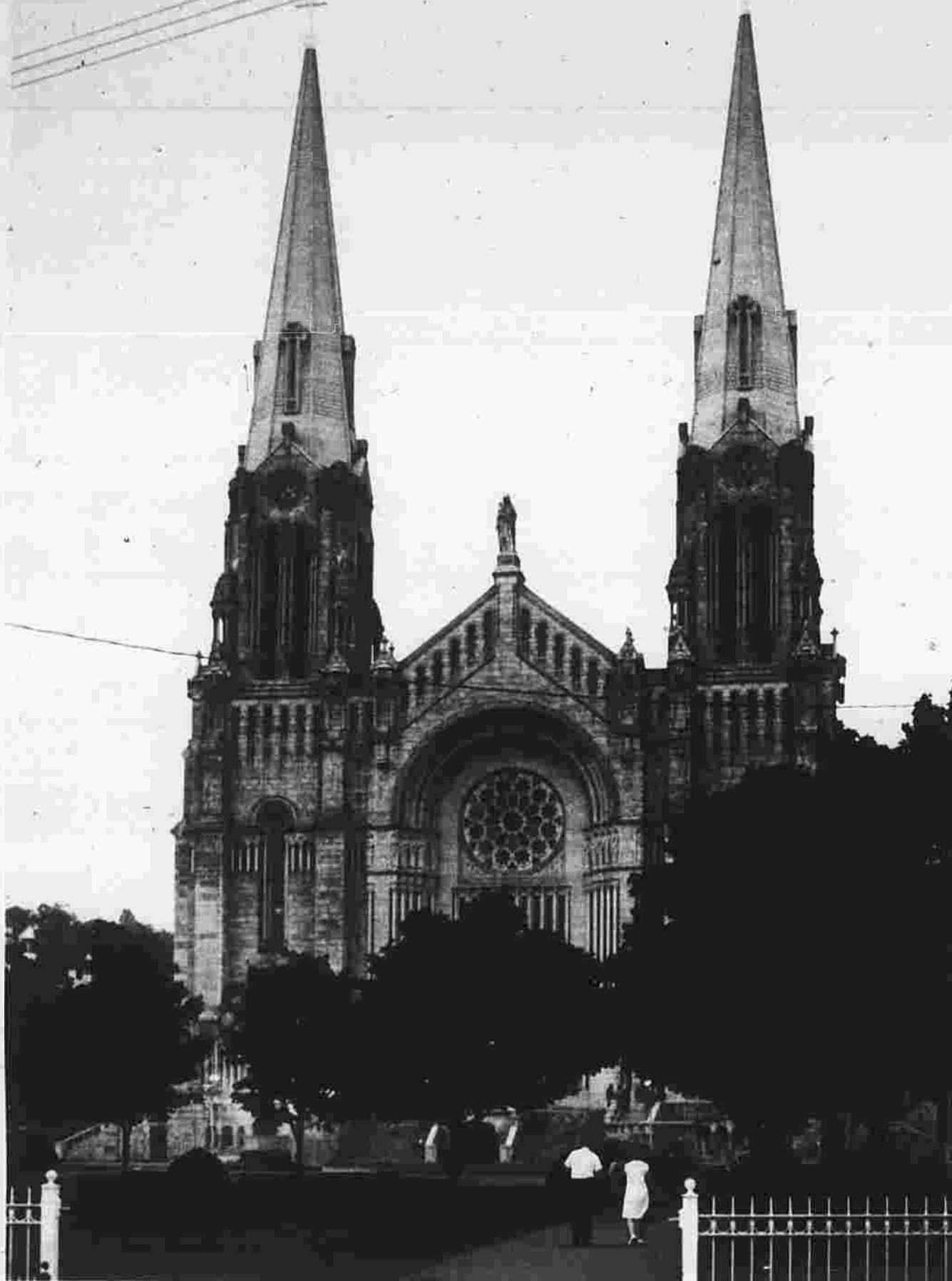

In 1658, a few shipwrecked Breton sailors landed at a spot on the left bank of the St. Lawrence River, 72 miles north-east of what is now Quebec City. According to tradition, they built a chapel as an act of thanksgiving.

That same year, Louis Guimont, a crippled farmer of Beaulieu (lovely meadow), during his devotions placed three small stones in the foundation of the sailors' chapel, and was suddenly cured.

The first supernatural interventions have been followed by countless favors and miracles in the more than 300 years since then, and have made the Shrine of St. Anne de Beaulieu the most renowned pilgrimage center on the continent.

In recent years, the pastoral setting and cures associated with it attract more than a million visitors annually. Among them are the lame, blind, deformed, and spiritually crippled. They come with canes, crutches, and in wheelchairs. Many of these aids are near the miraculous statue, left by those who arrived physically afflicted and went away healed.

Construction of the basilica began in 1923. It is 375 feet long, including the sacristy; 200 feet wide at the transept; and 90 feet high to the cross. Across the road is the cradle of the pilgrimage movement — the original shrine — built in 1662, rebuilt in 1676, and converted into a memorial chapel in 1878. Also on the grounds, nestled at the foot of the Laurentian hills, are a monastery, hospital, and the Scala Santa.

## New Rules in Store For Moving Industry

By WILLIAM BARTON Associated Press Writer WASHINGTON (AP) — The Interstate Commerce Commission plans to act next month to guarantee Americans on the move a fair shake from van line companies that transport their household goods. Claiming the experience of moving is "replete with frustration and disappointment," the ICC announced Thursday it will lay down tough new regulations the first week in March. It cited 1,500 consumer complaints during one six-month period alone and said investigations by the 82 ICC field offices showed the complaints to be justified. The commission said it was announcing its intentions in advance so both carriers and persons planning to move could be prepared for changes. The ICC noted the peak moving season begins May 1 and continues throughout the summer and arrangements normally must be made far in advance. Although the commission did not spell out the new rules, it said they will involve procedures to: —Eliminate or change the system whereby carriers estimate weights and probable charges. —Control overbooking of shipments by requiring contracts to specify expected times of pickup and delivery.

Democrats, Donahue Says, Must Be 'Party of Hope'

The Democratic party must become a "party of hope" to meet the challenges of the "era of new politics," according to U.S. senatorial hopeful Alphonse J. Donahue of Stamford.

"We can no longer win on the basis of slogans," he added. "Our candidate must be persuasive, sincere and convincing."

"We must present a strong philosophical base and demonstrate the ability to act, not merely decree conditions."

He talked for about an hour before the group, receiving a lengthy round of applause following his comments.

Donahue wears his wealth and background well. He presents a distinguished appearance and like his opponent incumbent Senator Dodd has silver-white hair.

He admitted a lack of leadership exists in the national level of the Democratic party and described 1970 as a "crucial election year for the Democrats."

Donahue urged delegates to the convention to vote for candidates who can win. "I feel I can win. I care about winning," he said.

He will primary if he receives 20 per cent of the convention's votes, as will Dodd, Duffey and Senate Majority Leader Edward Marcus.

Donahue sees himself as able to attract the votes of the independent and Republican voters as well as Democrats, particularly in predominantly Republican Fairfield County.

He feels this is necessary to win election.

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WASHINGTON (AP) — A nationwide rail shutdown this weekend because a distinct possibility following a breakdown in negotiations between the nation's railroads and four shopcraft unions.

Usery declined to say whether the White House would seek special legislation to halt a nationwide shutdown.

The unions—representing machinists, electricians, boilermakers and sheet metal workers—rejected in December a contract that included a two-year, 68-cent wage increase.

Three of the unions voted approval, but sheet metal workers rejected it because of a provision allowing members of all four unions to cross each other's job jurisdiction lines to do a limited amount of work.

President Nixon has already exhausted all provisions under the Railway Labor Act for postponing a strike or lockout.

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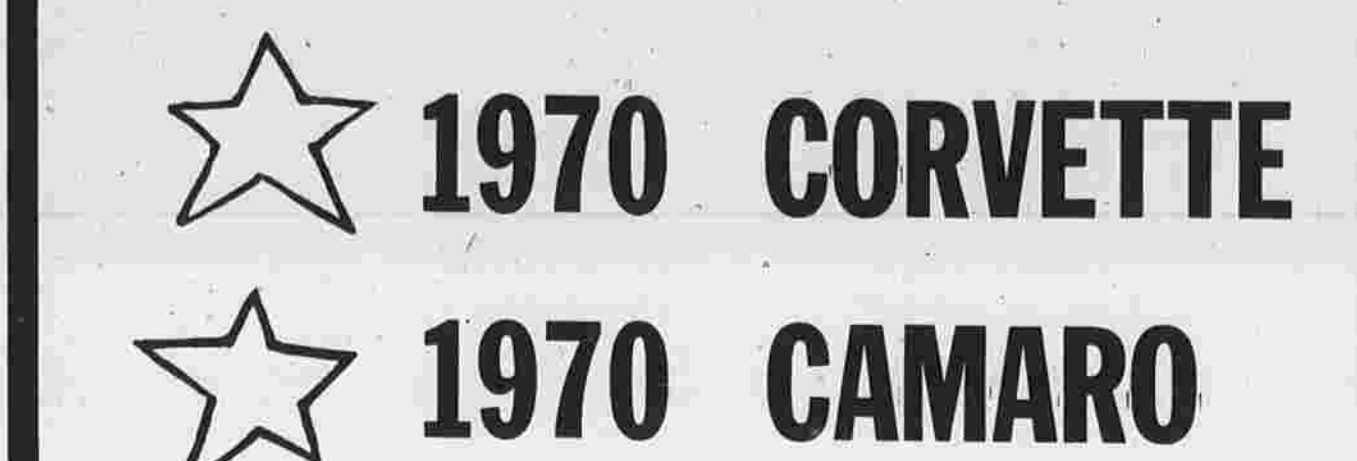
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Young Boatman Course Slated

### Panel to Nixon: U.S. Can End Draft in 1971

WASHINGTON (AP)—A special commission told President Nixon today the draft can be eliminated next year and the armed forces switched gradually to an all-volunteer basis with higher pay and other reforms.

The 15-member group, set up last March, recommended that the Nixon administration ask congress for prompt enactment of pay increases, particularly for young first enlistment servicemen and lieutenants, and other improvements. It proposed that the draft law be June 30, 1971.

The commission said an all-volunteer force would carry out a major campaign pledge by Nixon. The group took no stand on how big an all-volunteer force would be, but estimated it would cost \$1.2 billion for a three million-man force on a continuing basis.

CHICAGO (AP)—The five men convicted in the riot trial on the defendants and their attorneys were given nearly two hours to speak in the courtroom before Judge Julius J. Hoffman sentenced each to five years in prison and a fine of \$5,000.

The 74-year-old judge passed sentence Friday in U.S. District Court on the five men convicted of crossing state lines with the intent of inciting rioting during the week of the 1968 Democratic National Convention.

### 500 Laotian Troops Killed Defending the Plain of Jars

VIENTIANE, Laos (AP)—North Vietnamese forces swept across the Plain of Jars today, driving U.S.-supported government troops back in a bloody withdrawal. More than 500 Laotian soldiers were reported killed or missing.

Supporting tanks, the North Vietnamese attacked the Xieng Khouang airfield at 1 a.m., and by midday controlled virtually all of the plain.
