Peace Signals Being Ignored? In his article in the Sunday Courant. Roger Hilsman, former Assistant Secretary of State for the Far East under President Eisenhower, contended that President Nixon has been ignoring peace feelers from Hanoi, in favor of a policy of continuing the war indefinitely under cover of the new label of "Vietnamiza-

In the course of his discussion, Professor Hilsman stated that one reason statistical prospects for "Vietnamization" seem favorable is "because the North Vietnamese forces have pulled back for the political purpose of signalling a willingness to negotiate and in response to Mr. Nixon's reduction of American troops."

That interpretation by Professor Hilsman of the motivation behind North Vietnamese troop maneuvers contrasts sharply with what seems to be the current official interpretation at Washing-

We read, in a discussion of the news that the Nixon Administration now has statistics showing that North Vietnamese infiltration into South Vietnam is still decreasing, that the Administration's bat pollution. Or, to put it another way, we'read that Washington's experts now believe that Hanoi is "emphasizing quality rather than quantity." Where President Eisenhower's expert

on Vietnam sees the decrease in North Vietnamese deployment of troops as a possible signal of willingness to negotiate and a response to Mr. Nixon's own reductions of American forces, the Nixon Administration takes the hard-nosed attitude that any changes in North Vietnam's troop strategies are purely military in nature and have no diplomatic significance.

Yet, it has to be noted. President Nixon has repeatedly asked North Vietnam to accept his own reduction of troops as a diplomatic signal. More than that, he has even asked for an answering signal to be given by some North Vietnamese reduction of military effort.

But when this North Vietnamese reduction of military effort is observed and reported to Washington, its potential importance as an answering signal is ignored, and it is merely classified as part of Hanoi's strategy to fight a longer and more efficient war against us.

It is one thing if this is merely Washington's guarded surface response, used to protect its public position while it increases its behind-the-scenes zeal to accept and respond to any possible signals from Hanoi.
