

Tuesday, March 10 Another Potential Nixon Milestone

Many billions of dollars too late, and still probably more millions or billions away from adoption, we at last have a straightforward prestigious recommendation about what to do with our foreign economic aid policy.

The recommendation comes from the special Presidential task force headed by Rudolph Peterson, retired president of the Bank of America. The task force included both practical financial and business figures like Peterson himself, and figures from the academic world, like Professor Samuel P. Huntington of

First, the task force, in its letter to President Nixon, defines what we ought to be looking for from our foreign aid programs. We quote:

"This country should not look for gratiude or votes, or any specific shortterm foreign policy gains from our participation in international development. Nor should it expect to influence others to adopt U.S. cultural values or institutions. Neither can it assume that development will necessarily bring political stability. Development implies change-political and social, as well as economic-and such change, for a time, may be disruptive.

"What the United States should expect from participation in international development is steady progress toward its long-term goals: The building of selfreliant and healthy societies in developing countries, and expanding world from which all will benefit

aims should be; the task force tries to go into the how.

"U.S. international development programs," it wrote the President, "should be independent of U.S. military and eco nomic programs that provide assistance for security purposes. Both types of programs are essential, but each serves a different purpose. Confusing them in concept and connecting them in administration detract from the effectiveness of both."

The United States, the task force recommended, should redesign its international development aid policies so

"The developing countries stand at the center of the international development effort, establishing their own priorities and receiving assistance in relation to the efforts they are making on their own

"The international lending institutions become the major channel for development assistance.

"U.S. bilateral assistance is provided largely within a framework set by the international organizations."

After making such recommendation for the how of our foreign aid, the task force said this:

"The downward trend in United States development assistance appropriations should be reversed. Additional resources, primarily in support of international lending institutions, are needed now for a new approach to international development."

This, as far as it goes, which is, so far, of course, merely to the attention of the President, his Cabinet, and Congress, is the strongest, clearest, highest-sourced recommendation for real inelligence in our foreign aid this country has yet had. Like the first real advocacy of reform in our welfare system, it comes as something of a surprise in the midst of the Nixon administration— a surprise particularly to hose who were sure a Nixon adminstration would be blindly reactionary. the best forward thinking and ommendation this nation has had in 25 years of welfarism and 24 years of

#### Family Assistance Plan

The family assistance plan, which has now been approved for action by the House Ways and Means Committee, is far and away the most creative and important domestic reform proposed by President Nixon.

For sometime it was thought that the program had little chance of clearing r chamber of Congress this session; now it is seriously being considered by leaders of both parties and is hence given new life.

As proposed by the President, the plan would cost up to \$5 billion more than the \$4 billion currently being spent by the federal government on welfare and as many as 12 million persons could be addcosts represent federal expenditure. Only eight states, all in the South, currently pay less than the proposed \$1600 to persons with no income. Payments in other states would not be allowed to fall below their present levels, but all states would get at least 10 per cent savings on their welfare budgets, and the House Ways and Means Committee has voted to increase that amount. The poorer states would have to reimburse the Federal Government at least 50 per cent of what they had been spending on welfare. The great argument for the Family Assistance plan is that it encourages people to work because they can keep a good deal of the money they make.
