It is to be noted, for the record, that President Nixon had no difficulty finding a gentleman who had both these qualifications, and an I.Q. of nothing less than 135 to boot, when it came to a nominee for Vice President. Whatever the critics may say about Mr. Agnew, the administration never has to defend his low intellectuality or praise his mediocrity. Seriously, although we uphold the right

of the President to nominate whom he pleases, we cannot, any more than those members of the Senate who are trying to give him his judge, enthuse about the two choices he has now made for this one spot. He has put himself and his administration in a spot where they lose even if they win.

It is true enough that there are virtues more valuable to a nation than briliance, and qualifications more important than anything that can be put on a report card. But we hesitate to recommend that mediocrity be enshrined as a positive virtue

The best argument for the speedy corifirmation of Judge Carswell is, unfortunately, a fear of what kind of nominee the President's Supreme Court task force might come up with next.

If mediocrity is not necessary, neither is it necessary or desirable, to give Senator Hruska his point, to have a Supreme Court which would be all "Branses, Frankfurters and Cardosos." But the Court should have one of these ome characters most of the time, and it seems to us that it has now without one for quite a span of years and decisions, and that President Nixon might have seen it as his opportunity not to appoint mediocrity, but to fill the intellectual vacancy.







In 1953 he became interio minister, the man responsible for security, and was busily engaged in turning a people's po-lice force into a secret army. With the emergence of the People's Army in 1966, Stoph became first a colonel general and then general of the army as defense minister until 1980.

Stoph was charged with re-establishing security after the abortive workers' uprising in 1953 and this earned him the nickname, "der Scharfmacher, or especially tough, among those who were there.

The South Windsor Education association and the South Windsor Federation of Teachers has formally stated their support of the revised school budget sub-Council by Superintendent of mitted recently to the Town Schools Charles Warner, According to their written endorsement of the budget,

Warner's plan reflects "the needs of the school program for the coming year." The association and federation characterized Warner's budget as a plan showing "original thinking" instituting "many of the latest and most modern methods in education."

The statement was highly critical of tax reduction for the sak of immediate monetary gains on the part of taxpayers. According to the report, "Town governments have a greater respon sibility to this country's futur than to merely sit back and dicker over budgets and act as champions of the property own-

Generally speaking, the law considers the keeping of a vicious dog similar to the keeping of a dangerous weapon. The dog, like the weapon, must be handled with extreme care. Against a trespasser who is innocent, embodying no personal menace to anyone, the property owner has no more right to use a vicious dog than to use

ability on the owner even if he tried his best to prevent bites. One home owner kept his vicious dog locked in an enclosure beneath the front steps. A visiting neighbor was climbing the steps one day when his foot slipped through a loose board. The dog, seeing the foot come into range, lost no time in

taking a bite. Here, the court held the owner liable even though he had tried to avoid accidents. The court said this was the penalty for keeping such a dog on the premises in the first
