"Protective Reaction"

For the first time since we halted combing over North Vietnam, back on Nov. 1, 1968, a United States jet fighter has engaged and shot down a North Vietnam jet fighter over North Vietnamese territory

What was our armed plane doing over North Vietnam? It was flying protection for one of the unarmed reconnaissance planes with which we keep watching North Vietnam for our own military inelligence purposes and, perhaps, as a warning to North Vietnam that we could fly there and drop bombs again any time we wanted, to.

While doing this, our jet fighter may have felt the North Vietnamese jet fighter was about to behave in an unfriendly or threatening manner, perhaps with a mind to defend North Vietnamese air against our Intrusion.

For such a situation, we have, during the Vietnamese war, evolved special legalistic language which makes it possible to explain how action inside or over the territory of another nation can be officially labeled a non-offensive action. It doesn't quite get to be called a de-

fensive action. The real term emerges in the following statement, which was the statement with which our briefing officer in Saigon announced this air action over North

"On Saturday, 28 March," said this briefing officer, "a United States F-Y aircraft protecting an unarmed reconnaissance aircraft engaged and shot down an attacking North Vietnamene MIG-21 near Thanhoa, North Vietnam. This protective reaction to an enemy

That is the same useful phrase we have previously called upon to explain our occasional forays into neutral Cambodia and our bombing in supposedly neutral Laos. Under its benign license you really entitle yourself to go as far as you please in any direction.
