





Does Shooting Work?

The creation of a special City Council committee to investigate the recent series of shootings by Hartford policemen was the very least kind of response the city of Hartford could make to the situation in which it finds itself today.

be some independent review of the obtainable fact in each shooting, a review in which both the city's uniformed officers and its civilian population could expect to find sympathetic awareness of their respective points of view. In such an investigation of the four

particular shooting incidents, it would not be unlikely for the probers to come up with different findings in each of the incidents, just as the normal procedure of the Police Department itself has already found a difference between the conduct of one patrolman and that of

And any such investigation will inevitably have to broaden its own recollection, so that when it judges recent incidents, it keeps in mind that there have been, in the past, similar resorts to violence, in some of which the fatality victims have been policemen.

All this is minimal. It should result in a dispassionate report. In any case, the policemen themselves should be willing to take their chance on the result, and not fight it or refuse their own cooperation with it.

At the same time, there are questions raised by the situation in Hartford which seem larger than the capacity of any single committee.

One of these larger questions is this: Has there come to exist, in Hartford, a special sense of challenge between the police and one segment of the population which has now begun to generate an atmosphere of special fear in the decisions of individuals on both sides? Does the Hartford policeman now function in continual expectation of berserk resistance to his authority? Does the member of Hartford's black community now live in continual expectation that any police officer he encounters may be trigger happy? Has the relationship between the two, in the streets of Hartford, degenerated into a thing in which mutual suspicions and apprehensions make the slightest confrontation a dangerous, explosive thing? How else does it happen that an incident involving a minor traffic infraction has to end up with the driver in question carrying police bullets?

The second major question suggested by the situation in Hartford is a question which heads into the realm of law and order theory and philosophy but then ends up asking something very

The debate in the realm of theory and philosophy goes between those who believe in unrestricted power for the police, which means that the police will sometimes serve as judge and jury and executioner in the streets, and those who want to limit police use of firearms to certain specific circumstances, or even climinate it altogether.

The pragmatic question suggests itself when, in the course of this debate, representatives of the police side argue that the police must be given a free hand if they are to control crime and make the

The question is whether their shooting works. Has their shooting made the streets of Hartford more orderly? Is there now more respect for the law? Will

they, in the future, encounter fewer and fewer situations in which they are called upon to draw their guns? Are they pacifying Hartford? Does purse-snatching decrease? Have dark-skinned people now learned how to act in the presence of the law?

There is obviously no instant answer to such questions. But if, in the months to come, there should seem to be favorable answers, then there could be some practical judgment that police toughness, having worked, had demonstrated its title to be labeled something more than a pathological irresponsibility.

If some other diplomat is kidnaped tomorrow, Guatemala is not going to be able to experiment again. It is going to have

But the real question it raises is whether any diplomatic representation at all is going to be considered worth enough to justify the open risk of human life it will have to involve.


