Once Again, It Should Be Easy When Judge Clement Haynsworth was efeated, almost every comment in the country looked forward to an easy approval of President Nixon's next nomination to the Supreme Court bench. The assumption was that his next nominee would be so carefully screened that none of the conflict of interest issues which had been raised with regard to Judge Haynsworth would be brought into play.

When the President submitted the name of Judge G. Harrold Carswell, the . initial assumption was that confirmation should be and would be almost a routine matter. Indeed, it was found that Judge Carswell was quite safe from any charge of having made too much money in any kind of way, having apparently kept himself in the red by his generous style of living.

Then it developed that Attorney General Mitchell and FBI Director Hoover had not, after all, been 100 per cent thorough in their research. There was an embarrassing speech by the nominee as a young political candidate. There was involvement in a segregated country

tion of the nominee.

But they were enough to keep the issue pen and alive, when, without them, it would most certainly have been closed at an early day, in the nominee's favor. There then developed the crucial attack on Judge Carswell. This was an attack which alleged that he was a singularly undistingulahed judge, whose record on the bench deserved only a very low rating. This kind of attack involved judgment of one human being by another, which is something that could always be made debatable. In this instance, however, the supporters of Judge Carswell resorted to the kind of defense which admitted and validated the argument being pressed against him. They

argued that the Court needed some "mediocrity" such as his. This admission of "mediocrity" even on the part of those who were supporting him was the key to the final result. Now, as before, President Nixon should have an easy approval for any reasonable choice he presents. The Senate has more than exhausted its rejection energies. The country as a whole is anxious to see the Presidency functioning successfully within its own Constitutional duties and prerogatives. It would seem, as it seemed before, that he ought to be able to reach for a Southern conservative constructionist who will not prove an embarrasement to him. Perhaps he should, this time, make the
