The buildup is heaviest in South Vietnam's 3rd Corps Tactical Zone, an area of 10,000 square miles sharing 231 miles of border with Cambodia. The border area runs in an arc from 35 miles west of Saigon to 100 miles northeast of the capital.

The sources estimate 40,000 to 50,000 North Vietnamese and Vet Cong troops are in eastern Cambodia. One source said Cambodian troops had withdrawn from all their outposts

lege system began to appear the moment political parties began to operate on the national scene. The Electoral College system can result in an injustice to a candidate, producing the election as President of a candidate who is a loser in the popular vote. It can defeat the voter himself in two ways, first because there is no guaranteed legal way to make the elector vote the man his constituents voted for, and second because a deadlock in the Electoral College can throw the Presidency to an election in the House, with the voting

The simplest cure for such possible dangers is to make the election of the President a direct, popular vote election. Yet there are many students of the American political scene who fear the door to new dangers worse than any of those the nation has encountered and survived in its use of the Electoral Col-

To such observers a direct popular vote system for electing a President would, in any close national result, lead to a veritable paraysis of the vote recording process, with temptations to and challenges to possible corruption spreading into thousands of precincts. Any reform which does not try to guard against such possibilities has to be labeled "hasty action" even if reform itself is terribly late.

The best compromise solution would appear to be a system which would retain the form of the Electoral College, but make each state's representation in the Electoral College depend on what percentage of the state's popular vote went for the various Presidential candidates. At present, of course, the popular vote winner in each state takes all that state's electoral votes. The compromise proposal would move toward true democracy, but not toward that possible

It would not only be hasty action, but essentially thoughtless action, too, if the nation-wide recognition of a need for reform, and for better protection of the interest of candidates and voters alike, should lead to success for the Bayh Amendment in its present form. No matter how ancient the problem is, better to do nothing than to do something regrettably wrong.

At least 700 companies are now in the business, The American Bottle Water Association estable.

An economic spring is coming to the Canadian Arctic. The "ice" of lack of knowledge and dark Polar mystery is rapidly being broken up, and the idea of useless, frozen wastes is plain out-of-date.

In fact, the vast, unknown Arctic is now just a romantic myth. During the last 25 years the northern regions of Canada have been methodically investigated and explored to such an extent that they are better known at present than parts of provinces further south.

Arctic Canada has, first of all, been systématically mapped, with the help of aerial photography of the whole land area. Hydrographers have charted the coasts and coastal waters, and geologists on land have probed rock and soil. Glaciers and icefields have been studied by one band of specialized scientists, the flora and fauna by another.

Perhaps the most intensive and sophisticated re-search program is the many-sided Polar Continental Shelf Project. It began in 1959 and is still active across the great, frozen flank of Canada's north western ex-tremities, in 50-below-zero temperatures. Among masses of scientific data has emerged the fact that very

Research and studies have involved hundreds of millions of dollars, and many thousands of Canadians— most employed by the federal government, but many of them private air survey teams, crews of chartered commercial ships, and, recently, private oil seekers and mining prospectors. A lot of cold fingers and noses perhaps—but it seems to have broken the ice once and for always.




