#### Impeaching Justice Douglas

Gerald R. Ford, the House Republican of Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas. Ford says Douglas "is unfit and should be removed" from the bench. Douglas, 71 years old, was appointed the high court by President Franklin D. Roosevelt.
