It has not only tumbled the stock market. It has reduced industrial investment and industrial production and it has begun to produce un-

Now the problem is to persuade the stock market that it isn't really dying, but merely passing through the crisis after which it will begin a slow, long,

jobless that this is not a depression, but merely a temporary recession.

that the patient doesn't himself carelessly and impulsively veto his own proper recovery, is obviously what the President has in mind as he plans an address to the nation on the economic situation. It does seem that he ought to be able

to make a plausible case, along the lines that we have had the courage to take the bitter medicine, that it has now begun to work, and that we must not allow ourselves to frighten ourselves out of the cure the medicine has already begun to Only yesterday, there were still peo-

ple who were saying we had not done enough to counter the forces of inflation. Today some people are bemoaning the fact that we have done too much.

But if we are lucky, and if what seems to be the most intelligent effort at management of the economy ever put forward by any administration in Washington works out as it deserves to, we will soon begin to stabilize ourselves and then begin, by slow degrees, an upward progress more sensible than the openthrottled rocket flight the economy was in a year ago at this time.

This, then, is a time for all of us to remember that almost all of us were agreed that something had to be done about inflation, to remember next that we always know that if the anti-inflationary medicine did begin to work, it would have a bitter taste and seem temporarily worse than the disease, and to realize that this is that particular mo-

The chances all are that even the stock market will live, if, to risk the use of the wrong word, it just doesn't panic.
