Dobkin Re-Elected By GOP Committee

The Manchester Republican Town Committee, to one's surprise last night re-elected all of its officers. There were no opposition candidates, and the votes were unanimous.

Re-elected, to serve 1970-72 terms, were: M. Adler Dobkin, chairman; Mrs. Sandra Taylor, vice chairman; Mrs. Michael Schaller, secretary; and Charles McKensie, treasurer.

Dobkin has been chairman since May 1968, when he succeeded Francis DeLafra; and McKensie has been treasurer also since May 1968, when he succeeded Herman Heck.

Mrs. Taylor and Mrs. Schaller have held their posts since May 1964.

Dobkin, after his re-election, commented on the recent GOP primary, when all 85 party-endorsed town committee candidates successfully beat off a challenge by 27 opposition candidates.

"I thank you all for your work and I'm grateful for the many expressions of support and confidence I have received," he told the 60 committee members present last night.

"We have just finished a primary and, although we won, I don't think it's a win to gloat about," he said. "I consider it a vote of confidence in those endorsed by the town committee."

Dobkin called off the names of those 10 of the committee's 14 new members who were present last night. Each was given a round of applause when introduced.

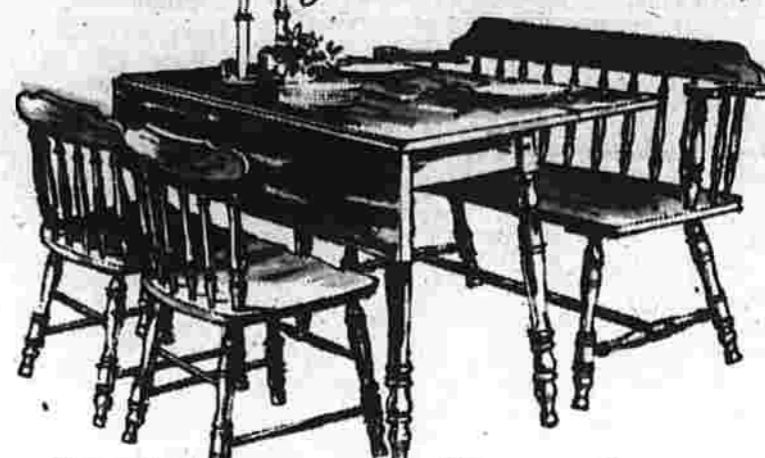
