The isolation controversy has been fueled by public evidence that Secretary of Defense Melvin R. Laird had little advance knowledge of Nixon's plan to withdraw 150,000 U.S. troops from South Vietnam during the coming year.

Also, Secretary of Bists William P. Rogers, appearing before a House committee, voiced strenuous arguments against involvement of American troops in Cambodia just a week before Nixon ordered combat forces into that country.

A close Nixon associate, who did not want to be quoted by name, cited the senior law partner analogy in an effort to explain why some Cabinet members apparently feel cut off from their chief.

**Housing and Schools** Town Planner J. Eric Potter has spoken realistically about low-cost housin in Manchester and the inevitable

problems that come with it, The thoughts expressed in his letter to the Capitol Region Planning Agency (excerpts from which appeared in Tuesday's Herald) could be addressed equally well to any governmental or private agency which seeks to encourage municipalities to accept the social burden of providing moderate cost housing.

The first obstacle, admittedly is the psychological one of accepting as a suburban social responsibility a share in the task of giving a decent place to live to people who cannot afford to buy it on the open market.

What that means, simply stated, is admitting that a more nearly heterogeneous community, economically and otherwise, is a desirable end.

There are many who cannot get past

But even for those who do, there is the dilemma that Potter explains: The housing can be built much faster than the town can plan and build schools for the children who live there, even if the town has the money to afford the schools,

The need for decent housing is a hutown cannot set out deliberately to encourage acceleration of the housing and simply hope the schools will come along in due course.

As Mr. Potter says, the housing goals of the CRPA and other groups with similar laudable aims will not be achieved until funds are granted to match those goals. It is doubtful that those funds can be found within the town, certainly not on short notice.

#### Convicted Prematurely?

What was it first turned our ecological scientists toward the conclusion that it was a certain kind of detergent which was doing terrible damage to our natural waters?

It was the knowledge that the detergents contained phosphates, plus the knowledge that phosphates, like nitrates, are an essential part of any fertilizer

When, therefore, it began to be obbeing so overgrown with algae that other forms of life were being smothered out, it was a natural conclusion that the phosphates in detergents had fertilized the algae into abnormal growth.

On this basis there began a campaign against the phosphate detergents, with the result that, just the other day, one committee in Congress recommended that the detergent industry be required to remove all phosphates from its products by 1972.

Although this has just been recom mended, as a regulation, there will apparently be some delay before it is en-

This will be a delay to make possible evaluation of some new scientific findings which have just appeared on the scene, and which open the possibility that it may be carbons, for which the detergent industry is not responsible, instead of phosphate or nitrogen which are causing the unusual growth of the algae which exhausts the resources of the water and ages it fast-in the proc-

ess called eutrophication. So what if, at the end of really scientific determination, the detergents are not the villain?

What if, for that matter, some of the

other scapegoats of our time prove to have been condemned and outlawed for rimes they themselves did not really commit?

We could, we suppose, have a sort of Earth Day in reverse, in which we staged appropriate ceremonies of apology to the detergents, the automobile, the smog, the cyclamate and the cigaret.

#### Strife Over Hair

It is even celebrated in the younger generation's songs: In "Hair," from the rock musical of the same name, a tribe of pop revolutionaries intone, Flow it, show it, long as God can grow it, my hair." Oldsters, on the other hand, have clearly been repelled by the spectacle, often viewing in luxuriant locks the breakdown of the moral order. The other day, in fact, the Cook County jailer ordered shears taken to the turbuient thatches of the Chicago Seven (minus balding David Dellinger). The move stirred a frightful anguish in Messrs, Abble Hoffman, Jerry Rubin Tom Hayden and all, but it seems that members of the "silent majority"

it, this preoccupation with hair is no modern development, but has deep historical roots. In all ages men have worried about their hair, and most of all during revolutions and times of political turmoil. Historically, political outs save displayed unhappiness with ruling orders by departing from approved hair

To take a leading example: Perhaps in no struggle were the forces of long and short hair so violently joined as during the 17th Century civil war in England that pitted Cavaliers against Roundheads, Quite literally, contending parties were identified in terms of the

 royalist supporters of King Charles I - wore ringlets that cascaded down the back. One ringlet, known as a lovelock, was worn carelessly over one shoulder and tied with a ribbon bow. They referred derisively to their adversaries - the parlimentary forces of Oliver Cromwell - as Roun heads, so named because of the pudding basin cut they affected.

Composed largely of Puritans, Roundhead forces tended to see long hair as a source of vice, Meantime, Cavaliers wit as they were of hair. "A man's locks were the symbol of his creed, both in politics and religion," wrote Charles MacKay in his 1841 book, "Extraordinary Popular Delusions and the Madness of Crowds." He observed, "The more bundant the hair, the more scant the faith; and the balder the head, the more incere the piety.'

Another example comes from even earlier in English history. The 11th Century Norman conquerors of England encouraged the growth of long hair so that they might resemble as little as possible their cropped masters. Sometimes revolutionaries seem moti vated in hair design less by idealism

than by a desire to win the adulation of faddish crowds. A case in point would seem to be provided by Jean-Paul Marat, the French revolutionist who edited the rambunctious newspaper, "The People's Friend." Once a respectable gentleman, Marat


early in the revolution gave up his luxurious tastes to become an early-day variant of the Hippie. He dressed in beggar's rags and shunned soap. From then on, wherever he went he brought with him a shaggy thatch, a week's growth of beard and the smell of sweat. Suddenly he found himself a kind of culture hero. In his biography of Danton, Robert Christophe writes: "Marat became all the rage, a nine days' wonder, so that when the storm broke he found himself a leader of the new revolutionary

On occasion this foppery yielded practical benefits. Once Marat escaped a police cordon set up outside his apartment building by shaving, washing and outfitting himself in a clean frock coat and hat. Thus disguised, he was able to pass unnoticed through the barricade. Jean-Paul Marat and Abbie Hoffman to the contrary, long hair has not always hair was the symbol of sovereignty in ancient Rome and medieval Europe. Caesars took their name from their long hair (Caesaries). And French kings

from the Sixth to Ninth Centuries wore their hair long and curled. So the sign of protest - long hair or short - has been the opposite of whichever was prevailing fashion of the time. Marat's unkempt bush contrasted with both the Bourbons' well trained tresses and the bourgoisie's prim style. But during the Cromwell-led insurgency in England, and with Savonarola's reform

movement in Renaissance Florence, rebels clipped their hair short. It does seem to be true, though, that bushy heads have mostly been favored by voluptuaries or forces considered worldly-minded, while cropped hair has been fancled by groups tending to be puritanical or morally censorious, Priests have regularly declaimed against the evils of long hair; toward the end of the 11th Century, the Pope decreed that persons wearing long hair should be excommunicated, and not

extremely high. The famous St. Wulstan, the Bishop of Worcester, was particularly incensed whenever he saw a man in long hair. In fact, he often carried in his pocket small knife that he used on long-haired persons kneeling before him to receive he blessing. The good Bishop would whip the knife out slyly, cut off a hand ful of hair and then bid the startled fellow to finish the job or go to hell. - ELLIOT CARLSON IN THE WALL home districts).
