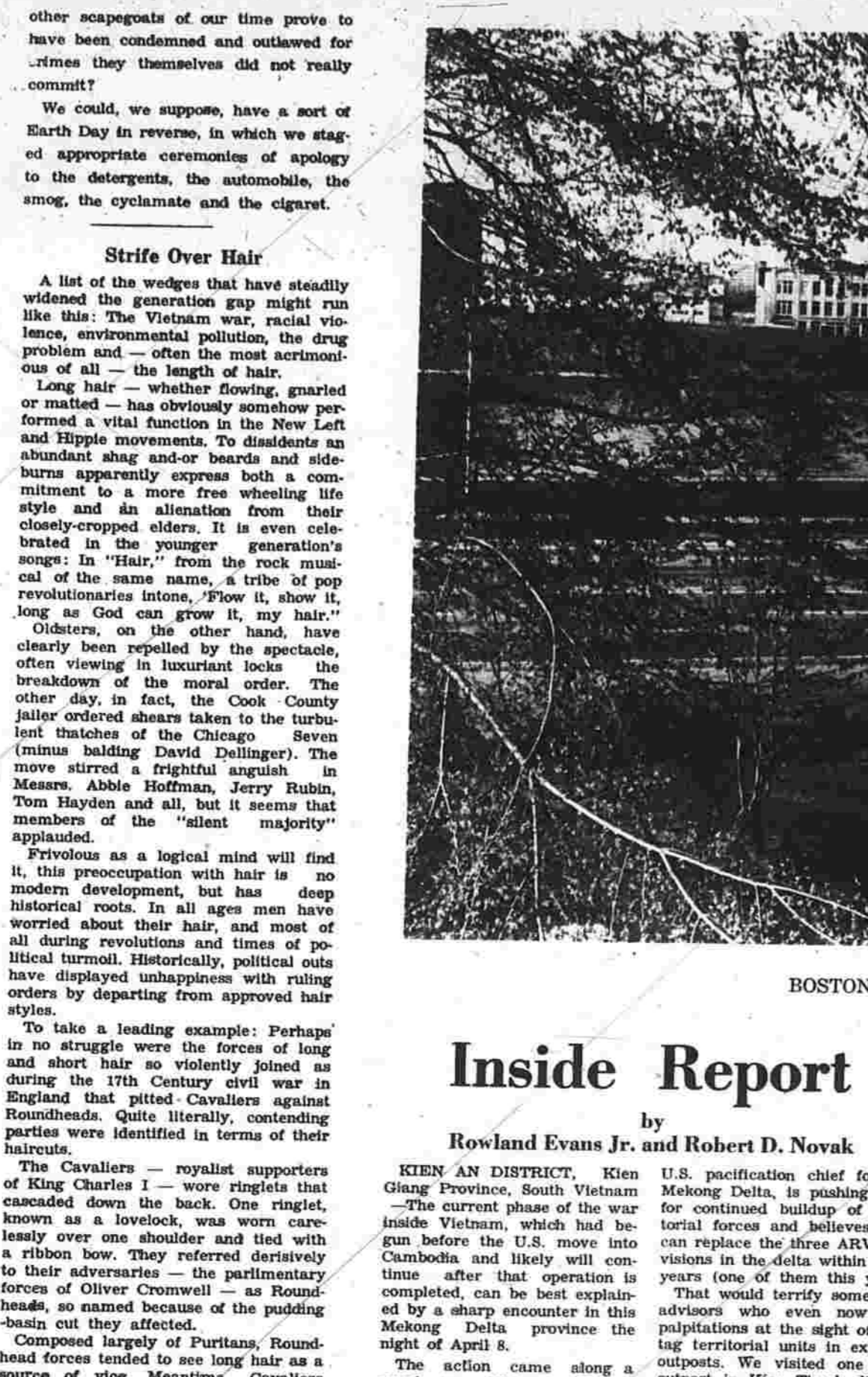

Textbooks Approved In English

The Board of Education this week adopted recommendations made by the Textbook Committee for the purchase of coordinated English textbooks for the middle school and the high school.

The Textbook Committee, headed by Albert Smith, worked with assistant superintendent, Dr. Robert Lunnon, and department chairman in selecting the books.

The teachers recommended the adoption of the Ginn Secondary English Language and Composition Series to begin at Grade 7 the coming school year and to continue through Grade 10.

The committee pointed out that the Ginn series had been selected from a myriad of choices and cited several reasons why.

One of the points cited was that the series involves all of the strands of the English curriculum, reading, writing, listening, speaking, imagination and analytical thinking.

The committee also said the series will be easily integrated with the existing literature program and that the lessons in grammar are cumulative in nature and essentially less repetitive than most grammar books.

The initial purchase for the adoption for 1970-71 school year grade 7, will be 800 copies at \$1.12 per copy, a total of \$2,240 plus \$1.20 for teachers' guides.

The board also adopted a recommendation for the purchase of dictionaries for Grade 1 through 8. The Dictionary Committee established criteria for selection and narrowed the selection down to two choices.

The first choice, the one recommended, was the Scott, Foresman and Co. series. The committee said the series is up to date and also correlates well with other present reading programs.

The other choice, Holt, Rinehart and Winston series, the committee said, had some drawbacks.

For all of the schools involved, 2,672 books will be ordered at a total cost of \$4,000, depending on the grades the cost of the books ranges from \$1.50 to \$4.00.

The All-American Rose Winner of 1970

This is "First Prize," the 1970 All-American Rose Selections award winner. It is a two-toned, pink and white combination hybrid tea with blooms 5-6 inches in diameter. The buds, which are of the classic urn shape, are 2 1/2 inches long and open into a double of a rich pink blend. The inside of the petals is usually lighter, lending a two-tone, blend effect to the flower. This is the first time since 1956 that only one rose has been chosen to be the award

winner. Roses come in four varieties—hybrid teas, floribundas, grandifloras, and climbers. "First Prize" is the creation of the late Eugene S. Boerner, dean of American rose breeders, from a cross in 1960 of Keweenaw, rose red hybrid tea, and an unnamed red floribunda which attracted the attention of hybridizers because of its vigorous growth, resistance to mildew, and profuse blooming habit. The plants will grow 2 1/2 to 5 feet high.

Students Taking War Protests From Streets to Senate Halls

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States Senate has had more than a year of national controversy over much of its existence, has played the role to the hilt in the opening months of the Vietnam administration.

Bitter fights over the Nixon war, appointments to the Supreme Court, national tax policy and civil rights have consumed swirring climaxes on the Senate floor or in its committee rooms.

The fact that the Senate is the primary pit for debate on public issues—a fact lost on few, if any, presidents of the United States—has made the Senate the focus of the youth of America intent upon questioning the judgment of their elders.

When the Vietnam Moratorium Committee concluded that street demonstrations no longer were an effective tactic for protesting the war, and its leaders went their separate ways, one of them signed on with the National Student Action to organize students for political action, specifically to work in this summer's campaigns for the Senate.

To David Hawk it was a simple choice. "The Senate," he said, "is where the action is."

As if heeding his advice, this day finds hundreds of college-age youngsters crusting the corridors of the Capitol, practically stumbling over themselves as they buttonhole congressmen and senators, urging a vote against President Nixon's policies in Southeast Asia.

While members of the House are getting their share of advice, the young people are concentrating on the Senate, urged on by such senators as Democratic Harold Hughes of Iowa, who has instructed some of them in the techniques of lobbying, and Democratic George McGovern of South Dakota, who made it plain why the Senate should be their No. 1 target.

"This is where we have a chance to stop the war," McGovern told them.

Whether the Senate has a chance or not it is likely to spend the next several weeks trying as it takes up a series of proposals—to cut off funds for the war in Cambodia, to repeal the Tonkin Gulf resolution, to set limits on the amount of "excess" military equipment the Pentagon can hand over to friendly nations—in a head-to-head fight with the Nixon administration.

It will not be the first confrontation between the two, nor is it likely to be the last.

While few presidents have had reason to view the Senate as anything more than a cross they had to bear, none has had more fight over the nominee's ethics.

The same toll yielded for Judge J. Earl Casper, a Thalesanese, Fla., federal judge, who was defeated by a Senate doubt of the quality of his judicial record and the probity of his judicial views.

Nixon dropped another declaration to the Senate with his successful attempt to make the 1968 Voting Rights Act extension reauthorized rather than just to the original seven Southern states.

Extra Income for Citizens May Start More Inflation

NEW YORK (AP) — So pervasive is the present state of the nation's financial balance that some of the rare good news for ordinary Americans in recent weeks could mean more trouble for the economy.

Summed up, a lot of Americans are receiving more spending money than at the beginning of the year. This could lead to more demand, and increase in prices, but also to higher inflation.

The question is: Will consumers bank it or spend it? That is, will they add to inflationary demand by buying cars and furniture and appliances? Or will they mark time until prices increase begin to slow?

Millions of Americans recently have received money back. Some from Social Security recipients and government employees. On the other hand, the motivation to save certainly isn't intimidated by the rates of interest available on consumers' savings bonds and banks give rates that at best merely keep pace with the rate of inflation.

Whether the consumer spends this additional money is a toss-up. If it is spent, it could mean more inflation problems.

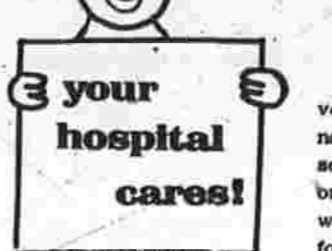
In addition, millions of Americans are already finding their paychecks because they have completed their annual contributions to Social Security.

Deductions are made on the basis of a per cent of the total. The increase in a figure that is now approaching \$1 million a year for many monthly take-home pay for many working Americans.

Now here's the problem: These increases in disposable personal income could be turned into tremendous sales pressure. Consumers could spend this money then, yet prices will continue to rise.

This is what is termed demand-pull inflation, to differentiate it from cost-push inflation. In the present unstable economic situation it doesn't take much of an addition of money to make the pot bubble. Despite a year-long effort to bring stability, consumer prices are now rising at a 4 per cent annual rate.

Based on the so-called confidence of consumers, as reflected by the inclination to buy a new car, it is not hard to see. Many people are fearful of getting themselves into financial difficulties, and are reluctant to get into debt. This is a sign of inflation that consumers might be reacting to inflation in a manner much different from what was planned.



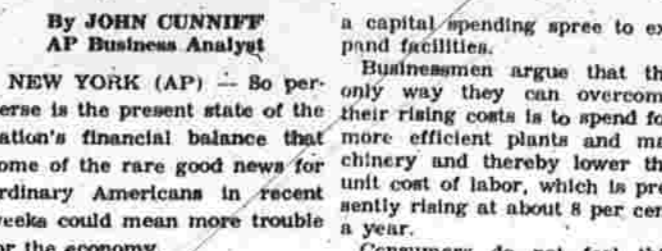

Passenger Rail Lines 'Need Massive' Help

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Penn Central stockholders were told Tuesday that America's passenger service "has reached the crisis point" and that only massive government financial help and eventual public takeover will get it back on track.

Stuart T. Saunders said at the annual meeting of the world's largest privately owned transportation company that passenger trains have operated at a deficit exceeding \$100 million each year since the 1968 merger of the Pennsylvania and New York Central Railroads.

"It has been a dominant factor in keeping our railroad in the red," he said.

He said only the Penn Central's diversified properties—real estate, pipe lines, hotels, resorts, oil refining and fuel distribution—has kept it from bankruptcy.

He plans to expand its investments and acquisitions.

"Without them Penn Central would be in a far worse situation than we are today," Saunders said.

Penn Central reported a 1969 profit of \$4.4 million, including a \$6.5 million loss in passenger and freight business. The profits were down sharply from 1968 when the net income was \$7.5 million, with a \$6.1 million railroad deficit.

Last year's figures reflected in part the cost of acquiring the debt-ridden New Haven Railroad.

Also affecting earnings, Saunders said, was inflation, high interest and tight money, soaring labor and material costs and low freight rates.

"There is no doubt that the economy has experienced a real slowdown," Saunders said. "Money is extremely tight and interest rates are at unprecedented high levels. The railroad, as most lines have gone, is in a very difficult position."

Washington Whirl: Ex-Panther at White House Detained by Secret Service

WASHINGTON — A Columbia Broadcasting System (CBS) television student was detained by the Secret Service for 45 minutes recently when a clear-cut check at the White House disclosed that he was chairman of the Black Panthers in New York City in 1965.

Lloyd Weaver, 30, of the Kent State University graduate and a great-grandson of the distinguished New York Negro leader Frederick Douglass, is employed as an associate producer at WGBH-TV in Manhattan.

He was on leave in a CBS fellowship at Columbia University when he was detained at the White House. He said he had no connection with the Black Panther party.

Weaver and a group of 10 or so CBS fellows accompanied the professor, Henry Gratz, to Washington to attend one of the morning briefings by presidential press secretary Ron Ziegler.

The visit is routine, scheduled every year for each new batch of fellowship students. White House guards began checking identification against a list of names that had been submitted in advance.

When they got to Weaver, he was asked to step aside. An officer checked the birthdate on his driver's license and asked his middle name.

Everyone else was cleared to enter but Weaver.

He told the Washington Post that he was "trapped" since they were checking me against some Black Panther list.

"No one mentioned the Black Panthers or told me why I was being detained," he said in a telephone interview. "But just five minutes before the briefing was over, a man who was obviously a Secret Service agent appeared."

"I was told then that I could proceed. The agent started me on the walkway, staying just a few feet ahead of me. He went into the briefing and stayed there. Then he escorted me back outside as I left. I got the message, but I was not sure what they were working in there."

Weaver said he has never tried to hide the fact that he was a Black Panther leader in his early days.

"CBS knows it," he added. "I put it into my application. But we were a different organization and a lot of less radical. The Black Panther party that came into existence later that year was more militant. It was self-called 'a less radical' than five years ago."

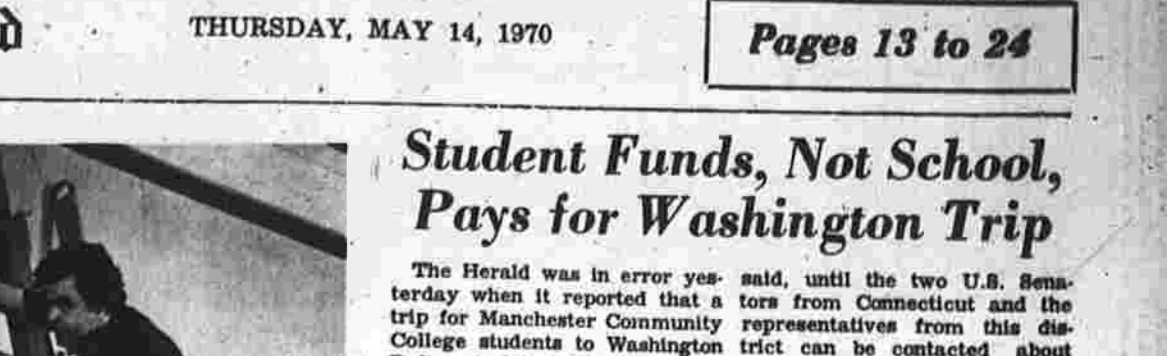

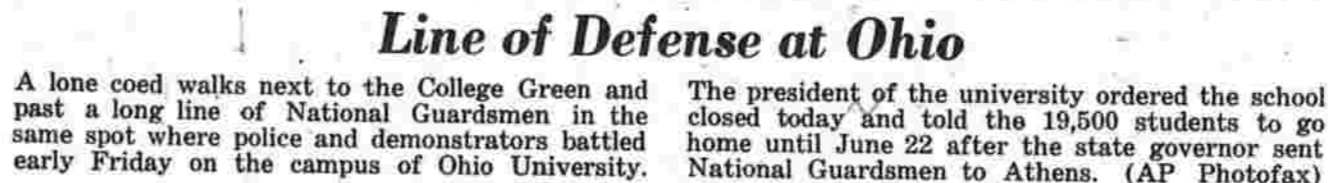
