It's Awards Time

NEW YORK (AP) — This is the season for summing up, for patting on the back and for passing out awards.

In television, preparations are under way for presentation of Emmy Awards for programs, performers, writers and directors on June 7 during an ABC program.

This year, technical and craft awards of little interest to the general public will be presented a couple of weeks from now at an untelevised dinner of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences as a means of cutting down the clutter and length of the big show.

Close to 170 programs and individuals have been nominated for industry honors. Here follows the choices of this viewer—who would skip a ballot in a lot of the categories.

NBC's "My Sweet Charlie," a film feature with Patty Duke and Al Freeman Jr., certainly shaped up as the season's outstanding single dramatic program and the performances of the two leads were superb.

CBS's "Annie, the Women in the Life of a Man" starring Anne Bancroft was original, charming and funny. It towered over the other variety programs of the season.

"Sesame Street" of the educational network was without much doubt the season's outstanding new series and its impact was felt through all of television. Partly because of its acceptance, the networks have made an effort to upgrade their schedules of children's programs.

"My World and Welcome to It" on NBC was a valiant effort to get away from the tired formula situation comedy. ABC often succeeded in doing something bright and different with comedy in "Love, American Style" and has something warm and wise going in "Room 222."

David Frost with his series and Dick Cavett with his late night show on ABC have added some class and crackle to the talk shows. Both are nominees for Emmys in a classification that pits them, rather unfairly, against shows like "Laugh-In" and "The Carol Burnett Show."

Candidates for an Emmy in the "outstanding dramatic series" group include the new "Marcus Welby, M.D.," a workmanlike doctor series. Others—"Ironside," "Mod Squad" and "The Name of the Game" are simply good, slick action series. "The Forsythe Saga is a British series made several years ago. Probably the educational network's "NET Playhouse" which tried for diversity and was often stimulating, is most deserving of the statuette in this category.

Lucy Has the Last Laugh on 'Laugh-In'

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — For a couple of seasons now, the near-sighted German soldier on "Laugh-In" has been bidding a somewhat mocking goodnight to Lucy. Now it's Lucy's turn to laugh. The running gag, delivered by "Laugh-In's" Arte Johnson bore obvious meaning inside the television trade. The Rowan and Martin show had been the first to challenge successfully the longtime rating supremacy of Lucille Ball on Monday night.

But in its third season "Laugh-In" started to display signs of wear. In recent weeks "Here's Lucy" has been showing its oldtime strength, placing among the top 10 shows in the ratings. The slide of "Laugh-In" was only natural, observes Lucille Ball—"When you're the

No. 1 show, there's only one way you can go: Down." While she didn't wish the opposition any ill, she admitted she was not amused by Arte Johnson's sign-off messages. "As long as he just said goodnight to me, it was okay," she said. "When he started including Gary, I didn't think that was right. I didn't like having my husband brought into it."

Husband Gary Morton acts as executive producer of "Here's Lucy." Her sister, Cleo Smith, functions as producer of the series, which also stars Miss Ball's children, Lucie Arnaz and Desi Arnaz Jr. Cozy? Lucille admits it is.

"But my nepotism has paid off," she adds. "I'm proud of the jobs that Gary, Cleo and the kids have done. We've got a smooth-running organization, one that really gets the job done."

Lucille Ball Productions is indeed a model operation for a television series. Her competitors admire the professional gloss and ease of performance. The sparkplug, of course, is Lucille herself, who is ever alert for ways to maintain quality.

"I always spring for the thing that will keep me interested," she explained. "I keep telling my people, let's go some place or try something new; in other words, let's give me incentive to keep doing the show."

"Not that I feel the show has to change. I don't think it does. The trouble with most series is that they get tired of doing the same thing, and they try for something new that is unsuitable. I've never been dissatisfied with my show, never. But I realize it has to keep trying for new things within its own framework." Among the new things for the 1970-71 season will

be guest appearances by Richard Burton and Elizabeth Taylor. How Lucille landed the famed pair is worth a Lucy show in itself!

"I saw him at a crowded party and he pointed a finger at me and said, 'I am crazy about your show; you must have me on it.' I couldn't believe he was

serious. When we went to the Burton's hotel bungalow later, I told Gary he was absolutely not to mention it.

"The next day I told him under no circumstances was he to call Burton or his agent. But then his publicity man, John
