





Again, The Civilian Hawk Every regime in Washington has to have its Mephistopheles-Machiavellithe cold, consummate villain on whom

all ills can be blamed. As if you didn't know already, the Nixon Administration's candidate is Attorney General John Mitchell. He bids fair to become the greatest all around villain in modern Washington his-

For, having begun merely as a specialist in villainy on the domestic side, he has now suddenly branched out into the evil presence inside our foreign policy. On the domestic side, Attorney General Mitchell is credited, by those who have such talent for bringing every issue down to some individual sooner or later, with being the author of the "Southern strategy" under which the Nixon Administration has supposedly slowed down the progress of integration has tendered the South certain political recognitions on the other.

In pursuit of this "Southern strategy" Mr. Mitchell became the villain who selected Judges Haynesworth and Carswell for nomination to the Supreme Court, and who then neglected the real duty of his office, which was to investigate them thoroughly.

Now, to the satisfaction of certain General Mitchell stands revealed as the really fierce hawk who swung President Nixon over to the advice of the military in regard to the invasion of Cambodia. The President's Secretary of State Rogers and Secretary of Defense Laird reportedly opposed the new policy, but were vanquished, in the behind the scenes struggle for power, by the New York lawyer.

The appealing thing about giving this super-hawk role to a civilian rather than to a military adviser is that it continues the consistent tradition of our involvement in Vietnam. Way back in 1954 it was a civilian Vice President, Richard Nixon, who wanted to rescue the French in Dienbienphu, a proposition which was vetoed by a general who was President. And in the Johnson administration it was, of course, civilians like McGeorge Bundy and Walt Rostow who prevailed upon their President to try to wage war on the mainland of Asia, something many generals, from MacArthur on, had

considered strategic folly. Nevertheless, although Attorney General Mitchell looks and plays the Machiavellian role to artistic perfection, we hesitate to join in the scuttlebutt which gives him so much credit for the Cambodian decision. We suspect that, by this time, there are generals who, having been put on the mainland of Asia, wanted to try to engage in some "Operation Total Victory" before they left. And we suspect that both in President Johnson and in President Nixon there has been some quality or disposition which hasn't made it too difficult for hawks in civilian dress to persuade them to order the generals forward.

Nor does a momentary mutual attack on America over Cambo dia signify any real change.

For example, the committee banned the sale of the so-called Internation Fighter aircraft to all nations except South Vietnam without specific Congressional approval. It limited to \$35 million a year the amount of excess military equipment that can go to foreign countries without express Congressional approval. It ordered a counterpart fund to be set up in foreign countries receiving excess U.S. military equipment, for the first time treating surplus arms sales in the same way that sur-

plus food sales have been hand-All these amendents were passed by the Foreign Relations Committee after the Cambodian intervention, and all passed without any opposition vote. While these Senate lines were tightening on the Nixon ad-ministration, Republican leaders in the Senate were def nitely grappling with the far graver political issue posed by he Cooper-Church amendment. As a legal restraint on President Nixon, this amendment is meaningless. It will never pass the more conservative and hawkish House. But as a political blow, passage by the Ser ate would be more damaging even than the President's rebuff by the Senate on two successive nominees to the Supreme Court.
