





The Senate bill provides for a 9-member board of governors appointed by the President, sub-In addition, the Postmaster General and the assistant postmaster general would serve on

Although the Postmaster General no longer would be a member of the President's Cabinet, he would be paid the \$60,000 a year received by Cabinet members. Other board members, except for the assistant postmaster general, would be paid \$10,000 a year plus expenses. The board would be empow ered to negotiate wage rates withpostal unions and to advise the rate-making commission of the additional revenues needed. If the commission failed to act within 90 days, the Postmaster General could put interim rate ncreases into effect to cover the added costs.



Connecticut will vote this fall on a proposed constitutional amendment providing for annual sessions of the General Assembly. The expectation is that every present member of the House and Senate running for re-election will urge a vote of But if the voters' are going to approve

annual sessions, they had better take heed of a proposal made by the Connecticut Public Expenditures Council to reduce the number of permanent committees from 30 to 14 or less, thus promoting a more efficient method of doing business while the legislature is in session. Continuation of 30 committees, many of them with hardly any work to keep them busy, has led to the suspicion that many of the committees are merely to provide chairmanships, and thus a posion of importance for a favored few. Another important move, which the CPEC overlooks, is the need to reduce the number of districts in the state

With 177 districts, 10 each have been allocated to Hartford, New Haven and Bridgeport, giving these three communities a combined strength far outweigh ing their importance.

A reduction in the number of House districts, perhaps to 120 or less, would give more meaning to the idea of annual sessions. 

Antitrust Suit Filed to Stop Merge Plan

WASHINGTON (AP) - Jusdee Department officials said fuesday they intend to keep up their efforts to block the proposed merger of International Telephone & Telegraph Corp. and the Hartford Fire Insurance Co. through an antitrust suit. "We're just going to press ahead with our case," said an official in the department's antitrust division. His assertion came in the wake of approval of the merger by Connecticut insurance commissioner William R. Cotter last weekend.

The Justice Department offi-cial stressed that Cotter's decision has had no effect on the department's determination to take its case to trial. The department filed the suit last fall, contending merger of the two firms would discourage

competition in the insurance business and encourage other such mergers.

The department's request for an injunction barring the merg-

er was turned down by the U.S. District Court in New Haven last fall. ITT is the 11th largest U.S. corporation and Hartford is the nation's fourth largest property and liability insurer.
