Pearson On The UN

When former Prime Minister Lester B. Pearson of Canada speaks on the subject of the United Nations, he deserves attention, for he is, of all our surviving public figures and statesman, the one who was most successful in seeing to it that the United Nations stopped a war which might otherwise have involved the whole world once more.

As Foreign Minister of Canada, it was Pearson who, in 1966, took the behind the scenes leadership at the United Nations to establish General Assembly restraint and control over the attack launched on Egypt by Britain, France and Israel. The successful culmination of his effort came when President Eisenhower declared that world law for peace must be for our friends as well as for our enemies, and allied this country with the United Nations move for a cease fire. The other day Pearson, now out of

power in Canada, was back at the United Nations, as the opening speaker at a conference on human survival sponsored by the Charles F. Kettering Foun-In this opening speech, Pearson quoted

Secretary General Thant's remark that 'The United Nations has 10 years to become effective or disappear," and warned, for himself, that the United Nations must make drastic reforms within itself. in more than one of its functionings, if it itself is to survive.

For one thing, Pearson thought, the richer bigger nations of the world have to begin to try to do more, through international agencies, for those less fortu-For another thing, he found the United

Nations making itself too wordy and unwieldy. The General Assembly, he said, has been "drowning in its own words and suffocating in its own documents." He noted that, last year, the United Nations held 6,400 meetings, as against 2,700 back in 1960, and suggested that the number of meetings might be a reverse, rather than a direct, index to the amount of accomplishment and influence achiev-

Finally, Pearson urged revival of the standing proposals for the creation of a United Nations military force which could stand ready to carry out world police functions for the Security Council. When he was in leadership in Canada, that nation put forward a standing offer to contribute a unit to such a world police force. Unfortunately, a number of bigger nations, including the United States and Russia, would rather do their world policing themselves.

Not even Pearson considered the present moment too propitious for the creation of such a United Nations police force, not with the full war in Southeast Asia and the half war in the Near East both involving commitments from ble powers which the big powers are in no way willing to surrender to the United
