The Original Why

The debate over the original why of President Nixon's move into Cambodia Some of us, influenced by reports of

the President's private conversations, and by the somewhat jingoistic language he used in his original announcement of the incursion into Cambodia, hold to the opinion that the President was striking for objectives he did not actually mention. Either he was motivated by the possibility that, if he gave our generals one last chance, they could produce a traditional type of military victory. Or he was making the strike into Cambodia in an emergency effort to prevent the new Cambodian government from being almost immediately overwhelmed by Communist-aided counter revolution.

If the President was trying to strike for total victory, he has been pulled back out of that aim by the unexpected strength of the protest against the Cambodian involvement here at home. But if his object was merely to prop up the weak new government in Cambodia, he may have achieved that by this temporary kind of invasion, which diverts and occupies the North Vietnamese forces and gives South Vietnamese and perhaps That troops time to move into the country to sustain the new government.

On the other hand, some of us buy the story of the Cambodian incursion as it was given to us by the President, and now begin to think that it has achieved set for it. If it was really originally intended just to spoil enemy reserves and stores inside Cambodia, and thus increase the security and even the speed with which we could proceed to withdraw our troops from South Vietnam, it may have achieved some of its original purpose, and be rated a success.

The trouble is, nobody really knows whether this was the President's original intent, or merely the story he used to cloak his real designs, and uses, now, to cover his retreat in response to domes-

What everyone expects, from the President's forthcoming interim report on the Cambodian operation, is the presentation of those suspiciously detailed statistics of numbers of bullets and weapons and supplies captured by the operation so far. But if, after presenting such statistics, the President goes on to promise even larger and quicker troop withdrawals than he talked about before Cambodia, what line will the scoffers take then?

No matter how much the situation is analyzed, it seems to come down to the slightly unprincipled, highly pragmatic test the President himself suggested after he had made his move. If it works some way, the debate over his motives

At one stroke President Nixon has reversed this process. The "limited campaign" in Cambodia has all the appearnces of yet another last heave which will be the precursor of many more, and

will make withdrawal difficult, if not impossible, for the foreseeable future. President Nixon may believe that this is a short sharp operation which will not have to be repeated. He is all too likely to be proved wrong. Even militarily, or as a game played with cardboard on a relief map, the American pursuit of the North Vietr mese behind the Cambodian frontier i hard to reconcile with a will to get out of South-east Asia. It could easily bring ino the battle lines territory far beyond cong. Politically it is an act of the most ssing folly. American society was

The international statute is the Geneva agreement of 1954, which the United states has now itself breached by the supply of arms to the new regime.
