#### The One-Way Understanding

The annual tide of Commencement oratory has, as has become fashionable in these times, featured a distinguished parade of members of the older generation who have specialized, in their speeches, in showing how understanding and tolerant they can be with regard to the dreams, protests and violences of

In many of the ceremonies, there has been a program opportunity for youth to reply to such understanding, which has frequently crossed over into very pleasant flattery. But none of the youthful figures at the ceremonial microphones has, that we have noticed. specialized in devoting even a very short hymn of understanding and praise to the

Writing as a member of the older generation, we say that is quite all right. this educational opportunity, we have done for our own satisfaction and out of receive the recognition and thanks of

as a general principle, expect much appreciation and thanks for what we have willing to concede that our conscience and our effort have been much too small. test, that the world we pass on is in any respect really very much better than it was when it was handed to us.

In fact, the one thing which is most consistent about us of the elder generation is that we never seem so sure o ourselves, or so proud of ourselves and our accomplishments, that we should be subject to the scorn of those who sit in judgment on us, from their vantage point of not having yet been through the mill of life.

It even seems, to us, that our worst sins and failures have been those of omission rather than those of commis-

But, as we were saying, not even our representatives, when they get to those commencement, microphones, undertake to defend us. They spend their energy and sentiment and ingenuity seeking out ways of understanding and praising our youthful critics. We are proud of the breadth of mind and the agility of logic. and the irrepressible love of all our own children which these commencement spokesmen for our own generation dis-

But we really don't know how we would feel if some youngster should suddenly reveal an effort to understand us, a charitable attempt to explain us, some gratitude we haven't been worse than we have been, and that somewhat impatient affection we suspect they do feel, now and then, toward all the poor old people who have messed things up.

#### Inflation: Theory And Act

The other day the New York Times, a newspaper which is consistently eloquent and realistic in its editorial discussion of the dangers of inflation, averted a strike against itself by signing an agreement by which its printers are to receive, over the next three years, something in excess of a 40 per cent increase in wages. The Times immediately anounced that it would be forced to meet this additional expense through an increase in circulation and advertising

paper going up from 10 to 15 cents a

This was what a great newspaper accustomed to preaching against the evil perils of inflation did when it faced the crunch in its own affairs.

An interesting question then arose Would the New York Times, afterward. blandly resume its own preaching to nanagement and labor and government as if its own difficulties had never occurred? Or, if it chose to admit its own surrender to inflationary forces, how would it explain itself?

The answers turned out to be rather creditable. The Times did not shrink from acknowledgment of its own action. offered explanation. It expounded, again, on the illusory nature of inflationary gains, including those it itself had just yielded to its printers.

paying an extra nickel for this newspaper. The price increase is an outgrowth of the expensive settlement ending the contract dispute that for neven weeks caused union printers at The Times to impose a steadily tightening squeeze on its productive processes. The cost of that squeeze was high in lost advertising and in wages paid for work unperformed. It was even higher in sacrifice of news completeness, but The Times believed that in this period of domestic and world turbulence it had an obligation to keep publishing so long as it could do so without abandoning

Times through this process of economic coercion is frankly inflationary. The wage increases it provides can be met only through higher circulation and advertising rates, thus feeding the inflationary spiral. Yet it became absolutely certain that the only alternative to such a pay agreement was a strike that would have blacked out The Times for many months with absolutely no realistic prospect that the end settlement would have been more moderate, either in terms of dollars or in working condi-

In other words, the Times found out, as every other individual segment in our economy is always finding out, that it could not make the stand against inflation alone and by itself.
